ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

In compliance with Chapter 617, F.S., (Not for Profit)

The undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the United States, desiring to form a Non-Profit Corporation under the Non-Profit Corporation Laws of FLORIDA, do hereby certify:

ARTICLE I NAME

The name of the Corporation shall be: Institute for Aging and Technology, Inc.

ARTICLE II PRINCIPAL OFFICE

ARTICLE III PURPOSE

Said corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code. The specific purposes for which this corporation is organized are to:

Evaluate and promote the effective use of homecare technologies within community-based care models for the elderly and disabled.

Provide a forum for the exchange of ideas among interested caregivers, practitioners, researchers, product developers, and users of home care technology to facilitate the sharing of techniques, standards, and experiences between them.

Conduct workshops and meetings with community leaders to advance their understanding of the various technologies that can help reduce costs and improve the community's ability to care for its aging or disabled populations.

Provide training for eldercare professionals, volunteers, end-users, the elderly, and their families to help them learn effective homecare technology strategies, financial literacy and other eldercare and life skills.

Provide funding, resources and other forms of support to organizations that are helping to advance the use of homecare technologies or are developing and testing new technologies with the potential to greatly improve the wellbeing of homebound seniors. Eligible organizations can be either for-profit or not-for-profit.

ARTICLE VI PRIVATE INUREMENT

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article Third hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or indistribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, this corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the purposes of this corporation.

ARTICLE VII DISTRIBUTION OF ASSETS

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempting purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
