

#### ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

In compliance with Chapter 617, F.S., (Not for Profit)

# ARTICLE I. NAME

The name of the corporation shall be: GO FOSTER!, INC.



# ARTICLE II. PRINCIPAL OFFICE

#### Section 1. Principal Office

The principal office of the corporation is located in Leon County, State of Florida at 113 S. Monroe St, Tallahassee, FL 32301

#### Section 2. Change of Address

The designation of the street, city, county or state of the corporation's principal office may be changed by amendment of these Bylaws. The Executive Board of Directors may change the principal office from one location to another within the named city and county and such changes of address shall not be deemed, nor require, an amendment of these Bylaws.

#### **Section 3. Other Offices**

The corporation may also have offices at such other places, within or without it's states of incorporation, where it is qualified to do business and activities may require, and as the Executive Board of Directors may, from time to time, designate.

# ARTICLE III. PURPOSE

#### Section 1. IRC Section 501(c)(3) Purposes

This corporation is organized exclusively for one or more of the purposes as specified din Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

This corporation is a recruiting, research, training and support services nonprofit organization organized and operated exclusively for educational, charitable, scientific, and/or religious

purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or to any corresponding provision of any future federal tax law, as follows:

This organization is created to conduct research; to engage, recruit and provide educational services to potential foster and adoptive parents; to support foster and adoptive parents through mentoring, training, and all charitable and educational activities related to such.

#### Section 2. Specific Purpose

Go Foster!, Inc. is to be a charitable, educational and scientific research organization to operate in all counties of the State of Florida and other states found as far north as North Carolina and as far west as Texas, where legal and practical, and is specifically designed to:

- a. combat community deterioration and restore communities
- b. protect children from abuse and neglect
- lessen the burdens on government

#### **Section 3. Specific Activities**

Go Foster!, Inc. will engage in the following specific activities to achieve the purpose(s) in Section 2 of this Article:

- a. Recruit, inform, educate, and train new foster and adoptive parents.
- b. Organize community foster groups specifically to provide mentorship and local support for foster and adoptive parents.
- c. Provide administrative and operational support services to groups and individuals identified and organized through activity identified in Section 3(b) of this Article.
- d. Provide continuing educational services to groups and individuals identified and organized through activities identified in Sections 3(a) and 3(b) of this Article.
- e. Engage in scientific research related to the communities, groups, and individuals identified and organized through activities identified in Sections 3(a) and 3(b) of this Article.
- f. Engage in the promotion of scientific research noted in activity identified in Section 3(e) of this Article through professional, scientific, and public forums.
- g. Lessen the burdens on government through recruitment and reduction of administrative and support demands placed on government.

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No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of any trustee, director, or officer of the Corporation, or any private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the Corporation), and no trustee, director or officer shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets upon dissolution of the Corporation. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting, to influence legislation (except as otherwise provided by Section 501(h) of the Code), or participating in, or intervening in (including the publication or distribution of statements), any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

Notwithstanding any other provision hereof, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (i) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code (or the corresponding provision of any future federal tax code), or (ii) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Code (or the corresponding provision of any future federal tax code).

Upon the termination, dissolution or final liquidation of the Corporation in any manner and for any reason, the Board of Directors shall first pay or provide for the payment of all liabilities of the Corporation; all remaining assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Code (or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code), or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to state or local government, for a public purpose.

# ARTICLE IV. MANNER OF ELECTION


