



Section I. The Mission, Vision, Purposes and Objectives of the Church.

The Historical Preamble

The African Methodist Episcopal Church, whose founders affirmed their humanity in the face of slavery and racism stands in defense of disadvantaged and oppressed peoples in the 21st century. For the origins in the Free African Society through the involvement of the AME Clergy and lay in the Civil War of the 1860's and the Civil rights Movement in the 1960's, the AMEC has preached salvation from sin and deliverance from bondage. The mission expanded to others within the African Diasporas in the Americas, Africa, Caribbean, and Europe. Whether in schools, seminaries, hospitals or social service centers, the AME Church has lived the gospel outside its sanctuaries.

The Mission

The Mission of the AME Church is to minister to the social, spiritual, and physical development of all people.

The Vision

At every level of the Connection and in every local church, the AME Church shall engage in carrying out the spirit of the original Free African Society, out of which the AME Church evolved: that is, to seek out and save the lost, and to serve the needy. It is also the duty of the Church to continue to encourage all members to become involved in all aspects of church training.

The Purposes

There is but one living and true God, ~~everlasting~~, without body or parts, of infinite power, wisdom, and goodness; the ~~Maker and Preserver of all thing~~, both visible and invisible. And in unity of this God-head, there are three person, of one substance, power, and eternity—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost.
