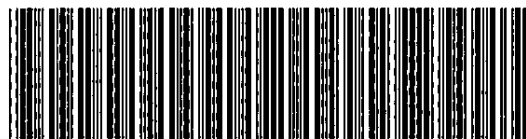

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

In compliance with Chapter 617, F.S., (Not for Profit)

ARTICLE I

Name

The name of the Corporation shall be **Wind with Wings, Inc.** (hereinafter referred to as the "Corporation"), a Florida non-stock corporation.

ARTICLE III

Purpose

The Corporation is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as now enacted or hereafter amended, including, without limitation, the purposes of providing education and vocational training to youths and young adults, specifically in the field of automotive mechanics. Teaching work skills and ethics along with building confidence. Equipping participants with tools to successfully operate businesses. The corporations will provide assistance to underprivileged, low income, mistreated, offending, and maladjusted youths and young adults by offering mentoring and encouragement, through providing auto mechanic training, apprenticeships, sponsoring other educational programs, professional training, advocacy, and supportive services that help uplift the entire community. The corporation will provide guidance, education and training for disadvantaged, low income, neglected, delinquent, and maladjusted individuals by offering mentoring programs, education programs, and training to give individuals the right tools to enter the work force and help them transition into adulthood as a productive citizen in society. The corporation is a community-based alternative education program for individuals who are high school dropouts, adjudicated youth, youth aging out of foster care, youths and young adults with disabilities, and other at-risk individuals. The said corporation will teach life enrichment skills along with vocational skills that will enhance and direct their personal life styles, social awareness and career goals to engage society and marketplace values. Our objective is to balance in-school learning and occupational skills training that prepare individuals that are underserved, handicapped, underprivileged, disenfranchised and disadvantaged for career placement. The Corporation will offer services that empower each individual with knowledge and resources to achieve greater self-identity, academic excellence, community involvement and balanced living. The in-school component is an alternative education program that assists individuals who are often significantly behind in basic skills to obtain the goal of a high school diploma or GED credential. The occupational skills training component prepares these individuals to achieve the goal of career placement. Our program will offer tech shop training

and other vocational training options. Vocational training is central to the overall philosophy of our corporation and we will provide a visible transformational experience for people who have rarely had opportunities to see tangible and positive results of their efforts. It is our goal to help persons in our community by implementing job training, resume writing, job hunting and job placement assistance. Our program will recruit and train early education for the underprivileged individuals who have been excluded from the traditional pathways to career formation and advancement by protracted poverty. Our program will work with life management, social skills, and literacy for low-income, young individuals that are underserved, handicapped, under privileged, disenfranchised and disadvantaged. The objective of the program is to improve self-sufficiency measures of good citizenship, personal accountability, and serve as a vessel for individuals to utilize and develop skills that will help them grow into dynamic and successful members of society. Our program provides positive structures for participants, and are designed to have performance indicators and measurable outcomes; with leadership development services in all categories. The Corporation shall not be operated for the primary purpose of carrying on a trade or business for profit.

ARTICLE IV Manner of Election

Members will elect the board of directors as stated in the bylaws. Individuals holding these positions shall be elected in by the members. The number of directors shall be not less than three (3) and not more than six (12). The directors shall be the President, Chief Financial Officer, Secretary, Developmental Officer and the Directors.

ARTICLES VIII
Limitations

At all times the following shall operate as conditions restricting the operations and activities of the Corporation:

1) No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit or be distributable to its incorporator, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article II hereof.

2) No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate nor intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

3) Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the Corporation shall neither have nor exercise any power, nor shall it directly or indirectly engage in any activity that would (1) prevent it from obtaining exemption from federal income taxation as a corporation described in §501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as now enacted or hereafter amended, or (2) cause it to lose such exempt status.

The Corporation shall have one or more classes of members with such designations, qualifications and rights as set forth in the bylaws.

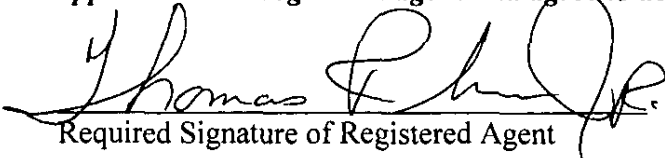
ARTICLE X Indemnification

ARTICLE XI Dissolution

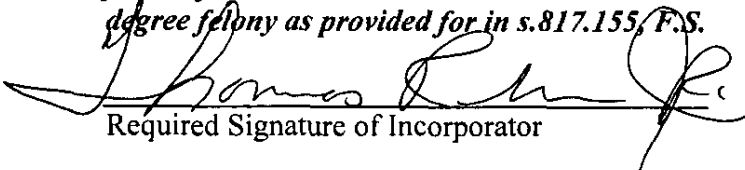
