to the ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

of

John H. and Christopher J. Pera Charitable Endowment, Inc.

Article IX. No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make further payments and distributions in the furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article II hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (A) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501 (C) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, of the corresponding section of any future tax code, or (B) by a Corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 1701 (C) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Article X. Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, the assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501 (C) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction of the County in which the principle office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

Article XI. To the full extent permitted by law, no volunteer director or volunteer officer of the Corporation will be personally liable to the Corporation or its members for damages for breach of the director's or officer's fiduciary duty. To the full extent permitted by law the Corporation assumes all liability to any persons other than the Corporation or its members for all acts or omissions of the volunteer director or volunteer officer.
