LIFE OF CHRIST CHURCH

ARTICLE I -- NAME

The name of this assembly shall be: Life of Christ Church, Inc.

ARTICLE II -- PURPOSE - CREED

Purpose: This organization is organized exclusively for charitabe, religious, educational, and scientific purpose, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations described under Secion 501©*(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Creed: This Assembly is to meet and worship on a regular basis. It is also to meet for special services for fellowship, revival, discipleship, teaching and preparation for sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We believe that the only way to be given eternal life is through the redemptive blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. He is not a way to get to heaven, but the **only** way. In order to gain access to the kingdom you must first believe and have faith that Jesus died for your sins and will forgive you of them. Nevertheless, faith alone is dead. We also believe that works or action is crucial for salvation. First, we believe you must repent and die out to your sins and accept Christ as your Savior. Second, you must be buried through water baptism with Him, which signifies an outward expression of an inward change and further signifies the washing away of our sins. Finally, when our sins have been washed away and our temple has been purged, we are ready to receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is a seal or covering that aids us with our daily struggles in life.

ARTICLE III -- ORDER OF BUSINESS

The regular order of business for any Business Meeting of the Board shall be as follows:

- 1. Devotional.
- 2. Reading of previous minutes by Board Secretary.
- 3. Report of Secretary and/or Treasurer.
- 4. Report of committees.
- 5. Unfinished business.
- 6. Election of officers, if necessary
- 7. New business.
- 8. Adjournment.

ARTICLE IV -- ORDINANCES

The ordinance of baptism by immersion in water (Acts 2:38) shall be administered to all those who have repented of their sins and who have believed on the Lord Jesus Christ to the saving of their souls, and who give clear evidence of their salvation (Romans 6:3-14, Romans 10:9, I Timothy 3:16).

ARTICLE V -- MEMBERSHIP

Qualifications:

Active voting membership in this assembly shall be open to all those who possess the following qualifications:

- 1. A testimony to an experience of the "new birth" in Jesus Christ.
- 2. Having been baptized in water by immersion.
- 3. Evidence of a consistent Christian life (Romans 13:13, 14;
- 4. Faithful to church, pays tithe faithfully, agrees to submit to Articles of Faith, and attends church services regularly.
- 5. Having reached at least 18 years of age.
- 6. Having regularly attended services of, and supported this assembly for a period of a least <u>three</u> consecutive months prior to the date of application for membership.

Procedure for Membership Recognition:

Those individuals eligible for membership who shall desire to become members of this church shall make written request to the pastor or church board. The church board shall have the right and authority to determine the eligibility and acceptability of all applicants for membership by majority vote. Those approved for membership by the church board shall be received into the church publicly at any of its regular services, and their names thereupon added to the church membership roll. No applicant for membership shall be accepted as a member within 30 days before an annual business meeting or within 10 days before a special business meeting.

Honorary Members:

The church board, at any regular or special meeting, may approve honorary members by a unanimous vote of the members present. Honorary membership is available to any member who has left or is leaving the church indefinitely for ministry purposes. Honorary membership recognition shall continue as long as the member maintains a consistent Christian life, remains sound in doctrine, and maintains a cooperative attitude toward this home assembly.

Inactive Members:

Active voting members who shall, without good cause, absent themselves from the services of the assembly for a period of three consecutive months, may be declared inactive members by a majority vote of the church board, and thereupon shall lose their voting privileges until they are restored to the fellowship, their standing to be settled by action of the assembly through its church board.

Membership Roll:

The church board shall review the list of active voting members at least annually, at the regularly scheduled meeting of the board immediately preceding the annual business meeting, and compile a current list of active voting members.

ARTICLE VI -- MEETINGS

Worship:

Meetings for public worship shall be held on each Sunday and during the week as provided under the direction of the Pastor and the church board.

Sunday School:

Sunday School may be held for classes weekly, immediately before Sunday morning worship.

Youth:

Youth meetings may be held as directed by the Pastor and Youth Leader.

Monthly Board Meeting:

The church board shall meet monthly or at the call of the Pastor for the transaction of business for this assembly; time and meeting location shall be announced by the Pastor. A majority of the board members shall constitute a quorum. Anything that affects the whole body of the church needs to be brought before tithe-bearing voting members to inform them of actions needed or taken

Annual Business Meeting:

There shall be an annual business meeting of the assembly, at which time the election/confirmation of officers shall take place and the report of all officers shall be presented. This meeting shall be held during the month of February of each year. The time and place shall be announced by the Pastor. Notice of the date, time and place of each annual meeting shall be announced from the pulpit during morning worship services on each of the two Sundays immediately preceding the date of the meeting.

Special Business Meeting:

Special business meeting of the assembly may be called by the Pastor, or by a majority of the church board of this assembly. Only those active voting members who have regularly attended services of, and supported, this assembly for a period of a least three consecutive months prior to the meeting shall be counted.

Petitions pertaining to the business affairs of the church shall be submitted to the Pastor or the Secretary of the board at least two weeks prior to the meeting.

A petition pertaining to the status of the Pastor shall be directed to the board, who shall arrange for a special business meeting of the assembly.

No more than one petition on a given subject shall be recognized in any twelve month period.

Notice of the date, time, place and purpose of each special business meeting shall be announced from the pulpit during morning worship services on each of the two Sundays immediately preceding the date of the meeting.

No business other than that specified in the notice of meeting shall be transacted at any special meeting of the assembly.

ARTICLE VII -- FINANCES

In General:

All funds for the maintenance of the assembly shall be provided by the voluntary contributions, tithes and offerings of the members and friends of the assembly. Offerings shall be accepted by the assembly at such times and in such ways as agreed upon by the Pastor and the board and shall be administered by the Treasurer under their direction (Malachi 3:10; Luke 6:38; I Corinthians 16:1,2; I Corinthians 9:6-8).

Handling of Offerings:

All offerings shall be counted by at least two authorized persons before the funds are removed from the church building. A record shall be kept of all receipt and disbursements of the local assembly and of all individual giving.

Salary:

The Pastor may/shall receive a salary agreed upon by the church board itself. The church board shall review the Pastor's salary at least annually.

Spending:

Pastor spending limit is \$300.00 per month without the approval of board.

The secretary/treasurer spending limit is \$100.00 per month without the approval of board.

Expenses:

A record of expenses shall be kept by the secretary/treasurer and report to the Pastor and board at each monthly meeting.

ARTICLE VIII -- PROPERTY

Purchase and Sales of Property:

All purchases of furnishings, equipment or other items of tangible personal property exceeding \$10,000 in cost, and all purchases and sales of real property shall be authorized by a vote of at least two-thirds of the voting membership who are in attendance at a regular or special meeting of the assembly.

ARTICLE IX -- DISSOLUTION

Upon dissolution of the organization, assets shall be distributed fo rone or more exemnpt purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction in the county in which the principal office of the organization is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE X -- GOVERNMENT BOARD MEMBERS AND OFFICERS

A. In General:

We agree by scripture that a Pastor is sent by God to lead until such a time God sees to remove him, or the active board must by necessity vote to remove him. Eph. 4:11-13

The government of this assembly shall be vested in the church board, which shall consist of the Pastor and at least Two (2) Board members (deacons).

Board members shall be chosen in accordance with Acts 6.

Officers shall consist of Teachers, Lay Ministers, Youth Leaders and others that the Pastor or board may put in positions of ministry.

Board members, officers or any other person in a position of authority over this assembly agrees to abide by the Articles of Faith of this assembly.

Any member breaking any of the Articles of Faith shall be subject to removal by majority vote of the board.

Members desiring a leadership position of this assembly shall conduct themselves morally and biblically according to Romans 1.

B. Duties:

Pastor:

The Pastor shall be considered the spiritual overseer of the church and shall oversee all of the activities. He shall be the chief executive officer of the church and act as the chairman of all the business meetings of the church and of the Official Board. He shall provide for all the services of the church and arrange for all special meetings, conventions or revival campaigns. No person shall be invited to speak or preach in the meetings of the church without his approval. Pastor shall be ex officio member of all committees.

Board:

The Board is chosen to serve the Church and therefore shall act in an advisory capacity with the Pastor in all matters pertaining to the church in its spiritual life and in the administering of its ordinances. The board shall act in the examination of applications for membership and the administration of discipline. The board shall have the authority, with 100% Board approval, to remove any person, including Pastor, if the need should arise. A majority present at any meeting of the Board shall constitute a quorum, provided all the Board members have been notified of

said meeting. In the event the church is temporarily without a Pastor, or the Pastor is unable to be present, after being notified of said meeting and approving of the meeting, the Board shall be empowered to provide its own chairman from its membership in order to transact business for the church.

Secretary:

The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Board and of the annual and special business meetings of the church. He/She shall perform any other clerical work necessary to the proper discharge of his/her duties. He/She shall be custodian of all legal documents. Secretary shall have easy access to current Church financial information. This information shall be available to the Board at regular meetings. When necessary the Secretary may also be the Treasurer.

Treasurer:

The Treasurer shall be entrusted with all finances of the church, which may be committed to him/her. He/She shall deposit all funds in a responsible bank in the name of the church and shall disburse the same by check, debit or credit card as authorized by the Pastor and Official Board. The Treasurer shall keep an itemized account of the receipts and disbursements. He/She shall make an itemized report at the regular meetings of the Official Board and a summarized report to the church at its regular business meetings. His/Her accounts shall be audited under the direction of the Pastor and Official Board. When necessary the Treasurer may also be the Secretary.

Sunday School Superintendent:

The Sunday School Superintendent shall oversee all Sunday School classes and activities. He/She shall make sure all appropriate biblical literature is provided for each class.

Teachers:

Those representing the Church shall abide by a modest dress code. They shall teach biblical truths in accordance with the King James Version of the Holy Bible.

C. Qualifications of the Board Members and Officers:

- 1. Board members and Officers shall serve under the Pastor to carry out the duties of church as directed by the Pastor and according to Scripture.
- 2. Board members and Officers shall be active voting members of this assembly for a least one year immediately preceding election or appointment to office.
- 3. All Officers agree to abide by the Articles of Faith of the church. Any Officer breaking any of the Articles of Faith shall be subject to removal by majority vote of the Board.

D. Conflict of Interest Policy:

No Board member or Officer shall vote on any item or petition that promotes his/her own personal gain or interest or the personal gain or interest of immediate relatives.

ARTICLE XI -- ELECTIONS AND VACANCIES

Vacancies:

1. Pastor:

Anytime a Pastor fails to function in a manner according to Scripture, a vote of confidence shall be called. A majority vote of active Board Members shall determine whether the Pastor stays or is dismissed. A prospective Pastor shall be nominated by the church board. Recommendations may be made to the church board by any active voting member of the assembly.

When a new Pastor comes into the church he shall be allowed by a unanimous vote of the Board. All offices other than the Pastor and original existing board members shall be appointed by the Pastor with approval of the Board as needed within the body to perform relative duties.

2. Other Officers:

Any office may be declared vacant by an act of a majority of the membership of the Board at any regular or special business meeting. Grounds for such action shall be as follows:

- a. Resignation of board member or officer.
- b. Unscriptural conduct.
- c. Doctrinal departure from the articles of faith.
- d. Incompetence in office.

ARTICLE XII - ORDAINING OF MINISTERS

Process:

Any person desiring to be ordained to minister in this assembly must complete Ministry Ordination Course. Pastor reserves the right to refuse any person requesting to minister, at his discretion.

ARTICLE XIII - DISCIPLINE

Grounds:

Unscriptural conduct or doctrinal departure from the Articles of Faith held by this assembly shall be considered sufficient grounds upon which any person may be disqualified as a member. Matthew 18:15-18; Romans 16:17-18; I Corinthians 5:11; Galatians 1:8-9; Titus 3:1-15; Romans 1:20-32

Purpose:

The purpose of discipline is to promote repentance and restoration through exposing sinful behavior. It is to be redemptive in nature as well as corrective. Discipline is an exercise of scriptural authority for which the church is responsible (Matthew 16:19; 18:15-20; John 20:23; Ephesians 5:11; I Timothy 5:20; Luke 17:3; 2 Timothy 4:2; Hebrews 13:17; Acts 16:4;).

Procedures:

Any member of the assembly is subject to discipline on the basis of unscriptural conduct or doctrinal departure from the Articles of Faith of this assembly, as determined in the sole discretion of the church board. The discipline of ministers who hold credentials with is assembly is administered by the Board of this assembly. The assembly will follow the disciplinary procedure set forth in Matthew 18:15-20. This procedure consists generally of the following steps:

- 1. The Pastor or a designated member of the church board discusses the charges with the member in an effort to resolve the matter privately;
- 2. If the first step does not resolve the matter, then the member shall meet with the Pastor and church board or with a designated committee of the church board in an effort to resolve the matter privately;

If the first or second steps do not resolve the matter, then the member or the church board may submit the matter to the membership of the assembly in a special business meeting called for that purpose. Only active voting members of the church shall be permitted to attend such a special business meeting. The decision of a majority of the voting members present at such a meeting shall be final. A member found guilty may be dismissed from membership in the church (Matthew 18:17). However, lesser disciplinary sanctions may be imposed as appropriate, depending on the circumstances of each case.

ARTICLE XIV - EMPLOYMENT

Purpose:

The Purpose of this Policy is to notify all Employees, potential Employees and Volunteers of our Employment/Volunteer Process. For the purpose of this Policy, all Employees and Volunteers representing Life of Christ Church, Inc., will hereafter be referred to as Employees.

Any person employeed or desiring to be employeed by Life of Christ shall submit to and get a background check and fingerprints, to be kept on file at the Church, in the Pastor's office in a locked file cabinet. The only people with access to this information will be the Pastor, Secretary or any other person specifically designated by the Pastor.

Background checks and fingerprinting will be initiated and performed per our Child Protection Guidelines, Page 11.

These Background checks are two-fold. Our Insurance carrier strongly recommends them and we want to protect our staff and friends from inappropriate behavior and unwarranted lawsuits

"It is the intention of this agency to prevent engaging the services of individuals who have a history of sexual abuse and molestation/misconduct, and to this effect, all efforts will be made to discover such histories. Signed completion of this application gives this agency permission to conduct such background checks, and the applicant is hereby notified such background checks will be made vigorously."

SCRIPTURE SUPPORT FOR BY-LAWS

ARTICLE IV - ORDINANCES

Baptism

Acts 2:38 - Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost.

Salvation

Romans 6:3-14 – Know ye not, that so many of us as were baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his death?

⁴ Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life.

⁵ For if we have been planted together in the likeness of his death, we shall be also *in the likeness* of *his* resurrection:
