Attachment to Articles of Incorporation Of Depend On A Friend, Inc.

ARTICLE III – PURPOSE

The purposes for which the corporation is organized are as follows:

- To receive and to administer funds and to operate exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, literary or educational purposes, within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or comparable provisions of subsequent legislation and to give funds and property from time to time to other organizations to be used or held for use directly in carrying out one or more such purposes.
- 2. To acquire, own, purchase, lease, dispose of and deal with real and personal property and interests, either absolutely or in trust therein and to apply gifts, grants, bequests, and devices and the proceeds thereof in the furtherance of the purposes of the corporation.
- 3. To do such things and to perform such acts to accomplish its purposes as the Board of Trustees may determine to be appropriate and as are not forbidden by Section 501(c)(3) of the code, with all powers conferred on non-profit corporations under the laws of the state of Florida.
- 4. To enrich the lives of children and young adults living with life threatening diseases or conditions, and support their families.

ARTICLE IV - MANNER OF ELECTION

The manner in which the directors are elected and appointed is as provided for in the bylaws.

ARTICLE IX -- POWERS

 The corporation shall posses an exercise all the powers and privileges granted by Chapter 607 and 617 of the Florida Statutes as they now exist or as they may be hereafter amended, or by any other law of Florida applicable in any manner to not for profit corporations limited only by the restrictions set forth in the Articles of Incorporation and in said Chapter 607 and 617 of the Florida Statutes.

- 2. The corporation is organized not-for-profit and no part of the income of the said corporation shall ever be distributed to or enure to the benefit of any member, trustee or officer; provided, however, that compensation in reasonable amounts may be paid for services rendered that benefits may be conferred and that distributions may be made in accordance with Section 617.11(1).
- 3. Notwithstanding any other provisions of these Articles of Incorporation, the corporation shall not conduct or carry on activities not permitted to be conducted or carried on (i) by an organization exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code and the Treasury Regulations promulgated thereunder as they now exist or they may be hereafter amended, (ii) by an organization contributions to which are deductible under Section 170 of the Code and the Treasury Regulations promulgated thereunder as they now exist or as they may be hereafter amended, or (iii) by a not for profit corporation organized under the laws of Florida as they now exist or as they may be hereafter amended.

ARTICLE X – NONSTOCK MEMBERSHIP CORPORATION

The corporation shall be organized as a nonstick membership corporation. Qualifications for members and the manner to their admission to membership in the corporation shall be as regulated by the Bylaws of the corporation.

ARTICLE XI – BOARD OF TRUSTEES

All corporate powers shall be exercised by or under the authority of, and the affairs of the corporation shall be managed under the direction of, a Board of Trustees, except as may be otherwise provided in the Articles of Incorporation or in the Bylaws of the corporation, or as may be otherwise required by any of the provisions of Chapters 607 or 617 of the Florida Statues as they now exist or as they may be hereafter amended.

ARTICLE XII – BYLAWS

The power to adopt, change, amend and repeal the bylaws of the corporation shall be vested solely in the Board of Trustees of the corporation.

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ARTICLE XIII - TERM OF EXISTENCE

This corporation is to exist perpetually.

ARTICLE XIV – DISSOLUTION

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, and subject to the provisions of Section 617.05 of the Florida Statutes as it now exists or as it may be hereafter amended, the Board of Trustees shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all liabilities of the corporation, distribute all assets of the corporation, if any, to such organization or organizations existing and operating exclusively for charitable, scientific, literary or educational purposes and at that time qualified as an exempt organization or organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Code. Any assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction in the county of which the principal office of the corporation is located, exclusively for such purposes or such organization or organizations as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purpose.

ARTICLE XV – LIMITATIONS

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in the Articles hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for any public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future Federal tax code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.
