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**ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
STUDER COMMUNITY INSTITUTE, INC.**

The undersigned incorporator, Randy Hammer, a natural person competent to contract, hereby presents these Articles of Incorporation as the Articles of Incorporation of Studer Community Institute, Inc. (the "Articles") for formation of a corporation not for profit under the provisions of Chapter 617, *Florida Statutes*.

ARTICLE I – NAME AND PRINCIPAL OFFICE

The name of the corporation is Studer Community Institute, Inc. (the "Corporation"), and the initial principal office and mailing address of the Corporation is 121 South Palafox Place, Suite B, Pensacola, FL 32502.

ARTICLE II – PURPOSE

The general purposes for which the Corporation is organized shall be as follows:

(a) To receive and maintain a fund or funds of real or personal property, or both, and, subject to the restrictions and limitations hereinafter set forth, to use and apply the whole or any part of the income therefrom and the principal thereof exclusively for charitable, religious, scientific, literary, or educational purposes, either directly or by contributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 and the applicable Treasury Regulations as they now exist or may hereafter be amended.

(b) No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of any director or officer of the Corporation, or any private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the Corporation in effecting one or more of its purposes), and no director or officer of the Corporation, or any private individual, shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets on dissolution of the Corporation. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

(c) Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the Corporation shall not conduct or carry on any activities not permitted to be conducted or carried on by an organization exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 and its regulations as they now exist or may hereafter be amended, or by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code and its regulations as they now exist or may hereafter be amended.

The primary purposes of the Corporation, consistent with the foregoing paragraphs, shall be to sponsor research and education into the development of strategies to help cities evaluate and address the health of their economy, government and quality of life; to provide news sharing through a news website and weekday news and talk show; to support the University of West Florida's Center for Entrepreneurship; generally, to take any action which will promote any and all of the foregoing purposes, and such other objects and purposes as may be authorized by and consistent with the provisions of Chapter 617, *Florida Statutes*, as amended from time to time.



ARTICLE III – PRIVATE FOUNDATION CLASSIFICATION

In the event that the Corporation is classified as a private foundation as described in Section 509 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, then the following paragraphs shall apply:

(a) The Corporation shall distribute or apply its income for each taxable year at such time and in such manner as not to become subject to the tax on undistributed income imposed by Section 4942 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

(b) The Corporation shall not engage in any act of self-dealing, as defined in Section 4941(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

(c) The Corporation shall not retain any excess business holdings, as defined in Section 4943(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

(d) The Corporation shall not make any investments in such manner as to subject it to tax under Section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

(e) The Corporation shall not make any taxable expenditures, as defined in Section 4945(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

ARTICLE IV – MEMBERSHIP

The membership of the Corporation shall consist of the individuals who are directors of the Corporation as provided for herein and their successors. Additional classes of membership may be created upon approval of a majority vote of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE V – TERM OF EXISTENCE

The term of existence of the Corporation shall be perpetual until terminated pursuant to these Articles, the bylaws of the Corporation, and applicable law.

ARTICLE VI – INCORPORATOR

The name of the incorporator is Randy Hammer, whose address is 121 South Palafox Place, Suite B, Pensacola, FL 32502.

ARTICLE VII – OFFICERS

The Corporation shall have such officers consisting of a President, Vice President (optional), Secretary, Treasurer, and such other officers as the Board of Directors of the Corporation shall in its discretion determine necessary or appropriate for accomplishing the objectives of the Corporation. The officers shall be elected by the Board of Directors at the annual meeting of the Board of Directors or as otherwise provided in the Corporation's bylaws.

ARTICLE VIII – BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The affairs of the Corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors. The directors shall be elected, removed and/or re-elected as provided in the bylaws of the Corporation. The Corporation shall have fifteen (15) initial directors. The number of directors may be either increased or diminished from time to time as provided in the bylaws of the Corporation, but there shall never be less than five (5) directors. ARTICLE X – BYLAWS

Unless otherwise provided in the bylaws of the Corporation, the bylaws of the Corporation are to be made, altered, amended, or repealed by a majority vote of the directors then in office at a regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors called for that purpose.

ARTICLE XI – DISTRIBUTION ON DISSOLUTION

Upon dissolution of the Corporation, or the winding up of its affairs, the assets of the Corporation shall be distributed, in the manner determined by the Board of Directors of the Corporation, solely to charitable, religious, scientific, literary, or educational organizations which would then qualify under the provisions of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and its regulations as they now exist or may hereinafter be amended.

No director or officer of the Corporation, nor any private individual, shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets on dissolution of the Corporation.


ARTICLE XII – REGISTERED OFFICE AND AGENT
