ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

Wogga Educational Foundation, Inc.

THE UNDERSIGNED, as incorporator and on behalf of a not-for-profit, non-stock corporation under the laws of the State of Florida, hereby adopts the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I NAME

<u>Section 1.1.</u> The name of the Corporation shall be Wogga Educational Foundation, Inc., (the "Corporation").

ARTICLE II ADDRESS

Section 2.1. The Street Address of the principal office of this corporation in the State of Florida shall be:
4165 NW 34 Way
Lauderdale Lakes, Florida 33309

The Board may, from time to time, move its principal office in The State of Florida to another place in this State.

ARTICLE III NON-STOCK CORPORATION

<u>Section 3.1.</u> The Corporation shall be organized on a non-stock basis under the Florida Not for Profit Corporation Act and may issue certificates of Membership.

ARTICLE IV <u>PURPOSE</u>

Section 4.1. The purpose for which the Corporation is organized is for transacting any and all lawful business for which corporations may be incorporated under the Florida Not for Profit Corporation Act. The corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, literary or scientific purposes, including, to distribute the whole or any part of the income therefrom and the principal thereof exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, literary or scientific purposes, either directly or by contributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and Regulations issued pursuant thereto, as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.

- Section 4.2. Wogga Educational Foundation, Inc. is organized for the purpose of providing an educational development center for people of all ages, to hold nursing classes for adults, offer job placement assistance, conduct workshops for primary caregivers, conduct health fairs and health and wellness workshops, to offer mentoring services to youths, to offer tutoring classes for the youths, to provide youth empowerment, to provide resources for people in need, to offer prayer and spiritual education, to offer encouragement and support to individuals in need, to aide in the enhancement of individual's spiritual growth and development, to provide immigration assistance, community development, and to lessen the burden of government.
- Section 4.3. The Corporation shall have the power, either directly or indirectly, wither alone on in conjunction or cooperation with others, to do any and all lawful acts and things and to engage in any and all lawful activities which may be necessary, useful, suitable, desirable or proper for the furtherance, accomplishment, fostering or attainment of any or all of the purposes for which a Corporation is organized, and to aid or assist other organizations whose activities are such as to further accomplish, foster or attain any such purposes. Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, the Corporation shall exercise only such powers as are in furtherance of the exempt purposes of organizations set forth in Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 and the regulations thereunder as the same now exist or as they may be hereinafter from time to time.

ARTICLE V LIMITATIONS

- Section 5.1. No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to, any Director or Officer of the Corporation or any other private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the Corporation affecting one or more of its purposes); and no Director or Officer of the Corporation or any other private individual, shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets on dissolution of the Corporation.
- <u>Section 5.2.</u> No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.
- <u>Section 5.3.</u> The Corporation shall distribute its income for each taxable year at such time and in such manners not to become subject to tax undistributed income imposed by Section 4942 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.
- <u>Section 5.4.</u> The Corporation shall not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in Section 4941(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.
- <u>Section 5.5.</u> The Corporation shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in Section 4943© of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.
- Section 5.6. The Corporation shall not make any investments in such manner as to subject it to tax under Section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.
- Section 5.7. The Corporation shall not make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945(d) of

the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

Section 5.8. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles of Incorporation, the Corporation shall not conduct or carry on any activities not permitted to be conducted or carried on by an organization exempt from taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and Regulations issued pursuant thereto as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended, or by an organization contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) Internal Revenue Code and said Regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.

ARTICLE VI DURATION

Section 6.1. The Corporation shall have perpetual existence unless dissolved pursuant to law.

ARTICLE VII MEMBERS

<u>Section 7.1.</u> This Corporation shall have a membership consisting of the Board of Directors of the Corporation serving from time to time.

ARTICLE VIII DIRECTORS

- Section 8.1. The affairs of the Corporation shall be governed by a Board of Directors (hereinafter referred to as the "Board"), subject to the restriction that, except as specifically set forth to the contrary in the Bylaws, the exercise of any powers or actions of the Board shall require the approval thereof by a majority vote of the Board present at a meeting at which a quorum of no less than three (3) Directors are present. The affirmative vote of at least two (2) Directors shall be necessary for all corporate action requiring a vote of the Board, including, but not limited to the following:
- 8.1.1. Approval of charitable gifts, transfers, distributions and grants by the Corporation to other entities.
 - 8.1.2. Adoption of an amendment to the Articles of Incorporation or the Bylaws.
 - 8.1.3. Organization of a subsidiary or affiliate by the Corporation.
- 8.1.4. Approval of any merger, consolidation or sale or other transfer of all or a substantial part of the assets of the Corporation.

<u>Section 8.2.</u> The initial Board of Directors shall consist of the following members elected in accordance with this Section 8.2 and the Bylaws:

Section 8.3. The term of office of an elected Director shall be one (1) year and shall expire, regardless of whether or not a successor shall have been duly elected and qualified. However, the term of the President/CEO is 20 years. The terms of elected Directors shall be staggered so that no elected Director's term expires less than one (1) month before the expiration of the next elected Director.

ARTICLE IX DISSOLUTION

Section 9.1. Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, The Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the Corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the Corporation, exclusively for the purposes of the Corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, literary or scientific purposes, as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any of such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the court having proper jurisdiction in the country where the principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE X REGISTERED AGENT AND REGISTERED OFFICE

Section 10.1. The Registered agent and registered office of the Corporation shall be:

ARTICLE XI AMENDMENT

<u>Section 11.1.</u> These <u>Articles</u> of Incorporation may be amended in the manner and with the vote provided by law.

ARTICLE XII BYLAWS

Section 12.1. The Board of Directors of this Corporation shall adopt Bylaws for the government of the Corporation which shall be subordinate only to the Articles of Incorporation and the laws of the United States and the State of Florida. The Bylaws may be amended from time to time by the Board of Directors.
