ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
JAPANESE ASSOCIATION OF JACKSONVILLE FLORIDA, INC.
A Florida "Not for Profit" Corporation

In compliance with the laws of the state of Florida, the undersigned do hereby voluntarily associate for the purpose of forming a corporation not for profit for the purposes and with powers set forth herein.

ARTICLE I.
CORPORATE NAME AND PRINCIPAL OFFICE

The name of the Corporation Not for Profit shall be JAPANESE ASSOCIATION OF JACKSONVILLE FLORIDA, INC., a Nonprofit Florida Corporation and the principal office and mailing address of the Corporation shall be located at 129 Amherst Place Ponte Vedra, FL 32081

ARTICLE II.
TERM OF EXISTENCE

The period of duration is perpetual. The corporation is organized pursuant to the Not for Profit Corporation laws of the State of Florida.

ARTICLE III.
CORPORATE PURPOSES

This corporation is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

The purpose of the corporation shall be to develop interactions and friendship of its members. The corporation advocates programs and activities designed to promote cultural immersion within the greater Jacksonville communities.

ARTICLE IV.
EXEMPTION REQUIREMENTS

At all times shall the following operate as conditions restricting the operations and activities of the corporation:

1. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in the purpose clause hereof.
2. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.
3. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this document, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170 (c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

ARTICLE V.
DISSOLUTION

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, the assets of the corporation remaining after payment of all debts and liabilities shall be distributed to an organization recognized as exempt under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code to be used exclusively for charitable and educational purposes. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE VI.
ELECTION OF CORPORATION DIRECTORS

The directors of the Corporation shall be elected in accordance with methods and qualifications specified in the bylaws of the Corporation. In no event, shall the number of directors be fewer than three.

ARTICLE VII.
AMENDMENTS

1. These Articles of Incorporation may be amended at a special meeting of the membership called for that purpose, by a two-thirds vote of those present.
2. Amendments may also be made at a regular meeting of the membership upon notice given, as provided by the By-Laws, of intention to submit such amendments.

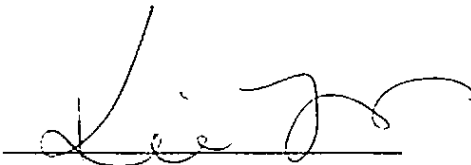
