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

Articles of Incorporation

Article I. Name

North Florida Prescribed Burn Association, Inc.

Article II. Principal Place of Business and Mailing Address

7204 SE County Road 234, Gainesville FL, 32641. c/o Alachua Conservation Trust.

Article III. Purpose

The purpose of the North Florida Prescribed Burn Association (NFPBA) is to facilitate the safe and effective use of prescribed fire by promoting landowner cooperation and providing the resources, education, and training necessary to return fire to its place as a tool for ecosystem maintenance.

This corporation is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes under section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Article IV. Amendments

Any amendments of these Articles may be adopted by approval of a majority of the board of directors.

Article V. Bylaws and Manner of Election

The Directors shall adopt bylaws providing for the regulation and management of the affairs of the corporation, including provisions for the election of directors and officers.

Article VI. Disposition of Assets

Upon dissolution of the Corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose.

Article VII. Additional Provisions

The NFPBA is not organized and shall not be operated for the private gain of any person. No part of the assets, receipts, or net earnings of the NFPBA shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to its members, directors or officers or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes described in section 501 (c) (3).
