PURPOSE

3.01 Purpose

The Women of Transparency, Inc. is a non-profit corporation and shall operate as an outreach and evangelistic ministry whose primary purpose is to educate and enhance spiritual and emotional growth among women, to promote family stability and relationships, to promote community service among women and to provide instruction, public worship, and educational and charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future Federal tax code.

ARTICLE IV

MANNER OF ELECTION

4.01 Election and Appointment of Directors

The manner in which the directors are elected and appointed is by election and appointment at annual meeting.

ARTICLE V

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

5.01 Governance

The Women of Transparency, Inc. shall be managed by its board of directors which shall act as the governing authority by providing guidance, setting its major policies, and exercising responsibility for its business and activities.

ARTICLE VIII

NON-PROFIT NATURE

8.01 Non-profit Nature

The Women of Transparency, Inc. is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code. No part of the net earnings of The Women of Transparency, Inc. shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in the purpose clause hereof.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this document, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by any organization exempt from federal income tax under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under section 170 (c) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

The Women of Transparency, Inc is not organized and shall not be operated for the private gain of any person. The property of the corporation is irrevocably dedicated to its educational and charitable purposes. No part of the assets, receipts, or net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to any individual. The corporation may, however, pay reasonable compensation for services rendered, and make other payments and distributions consistent with these Articles.

8.02 Personal Liability

No officer or director of this corporation shall be personally liable for the debts or obligations of The Women of Transparency, Inc of any nature whatsoever, nor shall any of the property or assets of the officers or directors be subject to the payment of the debts or obligations of this corporation.

8.03 Dissolution

Upon termination or dissolution of the The Women of Transparency, Inc, any assets lawfully available for distribution shall be distributed to one (1) or more qualifying organizations

described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or described in any corresponding provision of any successor statute) which organization or organizations have a charitable purpose which, at least generally, includes a purpose similar to the terminating or dissolving corporation.

The organization to receive the assets of **The Women of Transparency**, **Inc** hereunder shall be selected by the discretion of a majority of the managing body of the **The Women of Transparency**, **Inc** and if its members cannot so agree, then the recipient organization shall be selected pursuant to a verified petition in equity filed in a court of proper jurisdiction against the **The Women of Transparency**, **Inc** by one (1) or more of its managing body which verified petition shall contain such statements as reasonably indicate the applicability of this section. The court upon a finding that this section is applicable shall select the qualifying organization or organizations to receive the assets to be distributed, giving preference if practicable to organizations located within the State of Florida.

In the event that the court shall find that this section is applicable but that there is no qualifying organization known to it which has a charitable purpose, which, at least generally, includes a purpose similar to this corporation, then the court shall direct the distribution of its assets lawfully available for distribution to the Treasurer of the State of Florida to be added to the general fund.

8.04 Prohibited Distributions

No part of the net earnings, or properties of this corporation, on dissolution or otherwise, shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, directors, officers or other private person or individual, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article III, Section 3.01.

8.05 Restricted Activities

No substantial part of the corporation's activities shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene (including the publishing or distribution of statements) in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

8.06 Prohibited Activities

Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the corporation shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on (I) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax as an organization described by Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (II) by a corporation, contributions to

which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

ARTICLE IX

MEMBERSHIP

9.01 Membership

Anyone who is committed to and agrees with the mission and objectives of The Women of Transparency, Inc. and adheres to its established bylaws, shall be eligible for membership in this organization.

ARTICLE X

AMENDMENTS

10.01 Amendments

Any amendment to the Articles of Incorporation may be adopted by approval of two-thirds (2/3) of the board of directors.

ARTICLE XI

DURATION

11.01 Duration

The period of duration of the corporation is perpetual.
