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ARTICLES OF AMENDMENT TO ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF RACHAL'S RECOVERY RELIEF, INC.

DOCUMENT NO. N18000012104

Pursuant to the provisions of section 617.1006, Florida Statutes, this Florida Not For Profit Corporation adopts the following amendments to its Articles of Incorporation:

- 1. The name of the Corporation is RACHAL'S RECOVERY RELIEF, INC.
- 2. Article III of the Articles of Incorporation is amended by deleting said Article in its entirety and substituting therefor the following as new Article III:

"Article III

- (A) The corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, literary, educational, and scientific purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), and, in particular, to raise funds for disaster relief and distribute those funds to individuals, governmental organizations and other charities in Bay County, Florida, and the surrounding areas in order to help those affected by hurricanes and other natural disasters meet their basic needs.
- (B) The corporation shall be empowered to do and perform such acts as may be necessary or appropriate in carrying out the foregoing purposes of the corporation and in connection therewith to exercise any of the powers granted to not for profit corporations by the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act consistent with the corporation's status as an organization (i) exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(a) and (c)(3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and (ii) to which contributions are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.
- (C) No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, directors, officers, or other private

persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in these articles. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax, under section 501(c)(3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

- (D) This corporation is intended to be an organization which is described in Section 501(c)(3) of the said Internal Revenue Code and which is exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(a) of the said Internal Revenue Code and which is not a "private foundation" within the meaning of Section 509(a). All terms and provisions of this Certificate and all operations of the corporation shall be construed, applied and carried out in accordance with such intent. For purposes of these Articles:
- (1) "qualified organization" means an organization which is organized for charitable, religious, literary, educational, or scientific purposes and qualified as exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(a) and (c)(3) of the said Internal Revenue Code; and
- (2) "qualified purposes" means those purposes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, which are permitted of the corporation as a qualified organization which is not a private foundation under the said Internal Revenue Code;
- (3) reference to any section of the United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, includes the corresponding provision or provisions then in effect of any subsequent Federal tax laws."
- 3. The following new Article VIII is hereby added to the Articles of Incorporation:

"Article VIII

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes

or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

4. There are no members of the Corporation, and the date of the adoption of the above amendments by the Board of Directors of the Corporation was November 24, 2018.
