ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

1711 ENSENADA UNO CONDOMINIUM OWNERS' ASSOCIATION, INC. (A Florida Corporation Not-For-Profit)

In order to form a corporation not-for-profit under and in accordance with Chapter 617 of the Florida Statutes, the undersigned, hereby certifies and sets forth the following:

ARTICLE I NAME AND PRINCIPAL PLACE OF BUSINESS

The name of the corporation, herein called the "Association," is 1711 Ensenada Uno Condominium Owners' Association, Inc., and its principal place of business is 913 East Gonzalez Street, Pensacola, Florida, 32503.

ARTICLE II DEFINITIONS

The definitions set forth in the Declaration of Condominium of 1711 Ensenada Uno Condominium shall apply to the terms used in these Articles.

ARTICLE III PURPOSES AND POWERS

The purpose for which the Association is organized is to provide an entity pursuant to the Florida Condominium Act for the operation of 1711 Ensenada Uno Condominium, located in Escambia County, Florida. The Association is organized and shall exist upon a non-stock basis as a corporation not for profit under the laws of the State of Florida, and no portion of any earnings of the Association shall be distributed or inure to the private benefit of any member, director or officer of the Association. For the accomplishment of its purposes, the Association shall have all of the common law and statutory powers and duties of a corporation not for profit except as limited or modified by these Articles, the Declaration of Condominium or Chapter 718 Florida Statutes, as it may hereafter be amended, including but not limited to the following:

- (A) To make and collect assessments against members of the Association to defray the costs, expenses and losses of the Condominium, and to use the proceeds of assessments in the exercise of its powers and duties.
- (B) To protect, maintain, repair, replace and operate the condominium property.
- (C) To purchase insurance upon the condominium property and Association property for the protection of the Association and its members.
- (D) To reconstruct improvements after casualty and to make further improvements of the property.

- (E) To make, amend and enforce reasonable rules and regulations governing the use of the common elements and the operation of the Association.
- (F) To enforce the provisions of the Condominium Act, the Declaration of Condominium, these Articles, the Bylaws and any Rules and Regulations of the Association.
- (G) To contract for the management and maintenance of the Condominium and the Condominium Property and to delegate any powers and duties of the Association in connection therewith except such as are specifically required by the Declaration of Condominium to be exercised by the Board of Directors or the membership of the Association.
- (H) To employ accountants, attorneys, architects, and other professional personnel to perform the services required for proper operation of the Condominium.
- (1) To enter into agreements, or acquire leaseholds, memberships, and other possessory or use interests in lands or facilities regardless of whether the lands or facilities are contiguous to the lands of the Condominium, if they are intended to provide enjoyment, recreation, or other use or benefit to the Unit owners.
- (J) To borrow money without limit as to amount if necessary to perform its other functions hereunder.
- (K) To access each Unit during reasonable hours, when necessary for the maintenance, repair or replacement of any Common Elements or any portion of a Unit to be maintained by the Association pursuant to the Declaration or as necessary to prevent damage to the Common Elements or to a Unit or Units.
- (L) To grant, modify, or move any easement if the easement constitutes part of or crosses the Common Elements or the Association property.

ARTICLE IV MEMBERSHIP

- (A) The members of the Association shall consist of all record owners of a Unit in the Condominium.
- (B) The share of a member in the funds and assets of the Association cannot be assigned or transferred in any manner except as an appurtenance to the member's unit.

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- (C) The owners of each Unit, collectively, shall be entitled to the number of votes in Association matters as set forth in the Declaration of Condominium and the Bylaws. The manner of exercising voting rights shall be as set forth in the Bylaws.
- (D) Change in membership shall be accomplished by recording in the public records of Escambia County, Florida, an Assignment of Lease transferring leasehold title to a Unit or other instrument establishing record leasehold title to a Unit in the Condominium and providing notice thereof to the Association as required by the Bylaws.

ARTICLE V TERM

The term of the Association shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE VI BYLAWS

The Bylaws of the Association may be altered, amended, or rescinded in the manner provided therein.

ARTICLE VII DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS

- (A) The affairs of the Association will be administered by a Board of Directors consisting of four (4) Directors.
- (B) Directors of the Association shall be appointed in the manner determined by the Bylaws. Directors may be removed and vacancies on the Board of Directors shall be filled in the manner provided by the Bylaws.
- (C) The business of the Association shall be conducted by the officers designated in the Bylaws. The officers shall be elected each year by the Board of Directors at its first meeting after the annual meeting of the members of the Association, and they shall serve at the pleasure of the Board.

ARTICLE VIII AMENDMENTS

Amendments to these Articles shall be proposed and adopted in the following manner:

ARTICLES

- (A) <u>Proposal</u>. Amendments to these Articles may be proposed by a majority of the Board or by petition of the owners of one-half (½) of the Units by instrument, in writing, signed by them.
- (B) Procedure. Upon any amendment or amendments to these Articles being proposed by said Board or Unit owners, such proposed amendment or amendments shall be submitted to a vote of the members not later than the next annual meeting for which proper notice can be given.
- (C) <u>Vote Required</u>. Except as otherwise required for by Florida law, these Articles of Incorporation may be amended by vote of a majority of the voting interests at any annual or special meeting, or by approval in writing of a majority of the voting interest without a meeting, provided that notice of any proposed amendment has been given to the members of the Association, and that the notice contains the text of the proposed amendment.
- (D) <u>Effective Date</u>. An amendment shall become effective upon filing with the Secretary of State and recording a certified copy in the Public Records of Escambia County, Florida.
