ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

Of

We, the undersigned subscribers to these Articles of Incorporation, each a natural person, competent to contract, hereby make, subscribe, acknowledge and file these Articles for the purpose of becoming a Corporation not for profit pursuant to Chapter 617.0202, Florida Statues.

ARTICLE I: NAME

The name of the corporation shall be Desert of Florida Charitable Foundation, Inc.

ARTICLE II: PLACE OF BUSINESS

The principal place of business shall be in the County of Volusia, State of Florida, located at 116 San Mardeen Court, Daytona Beach, Florida 32117.

ARTICLE III: PURPOSE

The organization is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and/or scientific purposes under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The charitable purposes for which this corporation not for profit is organized are as follows:

No substantial part of the activities of the organization shall be carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the organization shall not participate in, or intervene in including the publishing or distribution of statements any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office, the organization shall not carry on any other activities

not permitted to be carried on (a) by an organization exempt from federal income tax under section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under section 170 (c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

ARTICLE VIII: DISSOLUTION

Upon the dissolution of the organization, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501 (c)(3) of the internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose.

The By-Laws of this corporation shall be made by the Board of Directors and may be amended or rescinded as provided therein.
