

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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF BAY HIGH BASEBALL, INC., a not for profit corporation

The undersigned, acting as incorporator of a Corporation, adopts the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation:

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this corporation is BAY HIGH BASEBALL, INC.

ARTICLE II-PRINCIPAL OFFICE

ARTICLE III - PURPOSE

The corporation is a not for profit corporation organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, as may be amended.

ARTICLE IV - MANNER OF ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

The method of election of directors shall be at the Annual Meeting of the Corporation, or as may be provided in any bylaws subsequently adopted by the Corporation.

ARTICLE VI - REGISTERED AGENT

ARTICLE VII - INCORPORATOR

The name of the person signing these Articles is Mary G. Kiehn, 2829 Longleaf Road, Panama City, FL 32405.

ARTICLE VIII - DISSOLUTION OF CORPORATION

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction in the county in which the principal office of the organization is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

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The organization to receive the assets of the corporation hereunder shall be selection in the discretion of a majority of the managing body of the corporation, and if its members cannot so agree, then the recipient organization shall be selected pursuant to a verified petition in equity filed in a court of proper jurisdiction against the corporation by one or more of its managing body which verified petition shall contain such statements as reasonably or indicate the applicability of this section. The court upon a finding that this section is applicable shall select the qualifying organization or organizations to receive the assets to be distributed, giving preference if practicable to organizations located within the State of Florida. In the event that the court shall find that this section is applicable but that there is no qualifying organization to it which has a charitable purpose, which, at lease generally, includes a purpose similar to the corporation, then the court shall direct the distribution of its assets lawfully available for distribution to the Treasurer of the State of Florida to be added to the general fund.

Having been named as registered agent to accept service of process for the above stated corporation at the place designated in this certificate. I am familiar with and accept the appointment as registered agent and agree to act in this capacity.
