Article III 6. To now read: To provide Christian counseling to inmates, ex-offenders substance-abusers, as well as their families.

Article III 7. To provide jail and prison chaplains with Christian printed materials, such as tracts, books Freedom's Voice Newsletter and brochures.

Article III 8. To work with other state and local agencies such as the Florida Parole Commission; the Florida Department of Corrections; the Office of the Governor; One-Stop Career Centers; United Way; Inter-Faith; Non-Secure Drug Programs, Inc. Marion County Jail; City Council; etc. We work with these agencies in order to better support our state and our community with our substance-abuse services.
