ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF SERVE IT FORWARD TLH FOUNDATION, INCIAL AHABBEE STATE

The undersigned, desiring to form a not-for-profit corporation pursuant to Chapter 617, Florida Statutes, hereby adopts the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I - NAME:

The name of this corporation shall be Serve it Forward TLH Foundation, Inc. (the "Corporation"). The Corporation may operate under such name, or similar names (including "Serve it Forward TLH" and/or "Serve it Forward TLH Foundation") as is legally permissible and deemed appropriate and/or desirable by the Corporation.

ARTICLE II - PURPOSES:

The general nature of the objectives and purposes of this Corporation are to be organized and operated exclusively as a not-for-profit corporation and for purposes aligned with Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the Treasury Regulations issued thereunder, or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law (the "Code"), and it may undertake any activity(ies) permitted thereunder. In addition to the foregoing, this Corporation is organized for charitable purposes to provide resources and support to individuals impacted by natural disasters and other occurrences (such as the COVID-19 pandemic), including, but not limited to, first responders, healthcare professionals/volunteers, and essential support providers (public and private), through collaboration and engagement with and between the hospitality/food and beverage industries. Informational outreach and educational activities are also contemplated by the Corporation. To maximize the Corporation's efforts, the Corporation may seek to partner with other not-for-profit organizations which fall under Section 501(c)(3) and/or other 501(c) subsections of the Code.

ARTICLE III - POWERS:

The Corporation shall have the general power to do all lawful acts, as conferred upon corporations not-for-profit by Section 617.0302. Florida Statutes, including all those things necessary or expedient in the prosecution of the Corporation's purposes, which are necessary and desirable to carry out the purposes and responsibilities of the Corporation.

Notwithstanding the generality of the foregoing, the powers of the Corporation shall be subject to the following limitations and restrictions:

- A) The Corporation shall have no power to do any act inconsistent with the provisions of Section 501(c)(3) and/or Section 170(c) of the Code; and
- B) No part of the income, profit or assets of the Corporation shall inure to the primary benefit of, or be distributed directly or indirectly to, its members, directors, officers, or other private persons; provided however, that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to purchase goods and services, as well as pay reasonable compensation for goods and services, rendered in accordance with and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article II of these Articles of Incorporation.
- C) No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be in the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene it (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

<u>ARTICLE IV</u> - BOARD OF DIRECTORS:

A) All corporate powers shall be exercised under the authority of, and the affairs of this Corporation shall be managed under the direction of, a board of directors that shall be referred to as the "Board of Directors," except as otherwise provided by

law, in these Articles of Incorporation, or the Bylaws of the Corporation. The directors shall be referred to as "Directors."

B) The Corporation shall have at least three (3) Directors. The number of Directors may be increased or decreased from time to time according to the Bylaws of the Corporation, but shall never be less than three (3), in accordance with Section 617.0803, Florida Statutes.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS:

The Corporation shall initially have three (3) officers, which shall include a President, Treasurer and Secretary, pursuant to Chapter 617, Florida Statutes. The Corporation reserves the right to increase the number of officers from time to time, but at no time will there be less than three (3) officers. The officers shall be elected by a majority vote of the Board of Directors at its first organizational meeting and thereafter at its annual meeting.

ARTICLE VI - INITIAL REGISTERED OFFICE AND AGENT:

The street address of the initial registered office of this Corporation is 2010 Delta Boulevard. Tallahassee, Florida 32303, and the name of the initial registered agent of this Corporation at that address is Jack E. Kiker, III, Esq.

ARTICLE VII - PRINCIPAL OFFICE:

The initial principal place of business of this Corporation shall be 914 Railroad Avenue. Tallahassee, Florida 32310.

ARTICLE VIII – INCORPORATOR:

ARTICLE IX - TERM OF EXISTENCE:

This Corporation shall exist perpetually.

ARTICLE X - BYLAWS:

- A) The Board of Directors, by a majority vote, may provide such Bylaws for the conduct of the business of the Corporation and the carrying out of its purposes as it may deem necessary from time to time, including, but not limited to, provisions for the quorum and voting requirements of meetings and activities of the Board of Directors; provided, however, that such Bylaws shall not conflict with these Articles of Incorporation.
- B) Upon proper notice, the Bylaws may be amended, altered or rescinded by a majority vote of the members of the Board of Directors who are present at any regular or special meeting for such purpose.

ARTICLE XI - AMENDMENTS:

These Articles of Incorporation may be amended, altered, changed or repealed solely by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XII - CORPORATE LIQUIDATION AND DISSOLUTION:

Upon dissolution of this Corporation, all of its assets remaining after payment of all costs and expenses of such dissolution shall be distributed:

A) To one or more organizations which have qualified for exemption under Section 501(c)(2)-(10) of the Code where the purposes are similar to the purposes of the organization;

B) To a federal government or a state or local government, for public purposes similar to the purposes of the supported organization consistent with Section 501(c)(2)-(10) of the Code and in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida; or

C) Upon order of a court of competent jurisdiction, to another organization to be used in such manner as in the judgment of the court will best accomplish the purposes of the supported organization.

ARTICLE XIII – INDEMNIFICATION:

The Corporation shall indemnify the incorporator, board members, officers, directors, trustees, employees, attorneys and agents to the full extent permitted by Chapter 617, Florida Statutes, entitled the "Florida Not-for-Profit Corporation Act," provided, however, that no such indemnification shall be permitted if such indemnification would violate the purposes of the Corporation as specified in Article II herein or would be inconsistent with the provisions of Section 501(c) and Section 170(c) of the Code.
