ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

In compliance with Chapter 617, F.S., (Not for Profit)

ARTICLE I

NAME

The name of the corporation shall be: **HARVEST ARMY SUNSHINE CHURCH, INC.**

ARTICLE II

ARTICLE III

PURPOSE

The purposes for which the corporation is organized are as follows:

- A. To establish and maintain one or more places of worship for members of the church and anyone wishing to fellowship with the Church, to promote continue and encourage the assembly of people, on a regular basis, for the purpose of Divine Worship, Discipleship, Spiritual Fellowship and Religious Observances according to the Christian Faith.
- B. To institute, participate in and/or support, all worthy activities and projects Divinely inspired and assigned.
- C. To create a fellowship of believers and disciples according to the tenets of the Christian Faith.
- D. To meet regularly with the Christian community locally, nationally and worldwide for the purpose of, prayer, worship, teaching, preaching and fellowship.
- E. To provide spiritual outreach, through the preaching and teaching of the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ.
- F. To evangelize throughout the United States and the world sharing the Love of God and Gospel of Jesus Christ.
- G. To train, ordain and license qualified candidates for the work of the ministry of the Gospel.

- H. To develop multi-service programs in the church and the local community to assist in the social, economic, and spiritual maintenance and successful rehabilitation of the family and community based on Christian principals.
- I. To develop a Fellowship of Churches that will assembly together for edification, revival and renewal.
- J. To serve the community as a foundation church, perfecting, equipping, educating, empowering, men and women to evangelize the Gospel of Jesus Christ to all Nations.
- K. To share and display the Gospel and the Word of God through books, literature, audio, video, recordings, television, radio, internet and all sources of media.
- L. To procure, by all lawful means and support of the same; to buy vacant land, building, alter, develop, build or repair same for the use of the church and dispose of the same when no longer needed; To hold and operate such property which shall come into procession of the church, all being done under the Religious Corporation Laws of the State of Florida.
- M. To solicit fund and support from the general public.
- N. To enter into, make perform and carry out contracts with any person, firm, corporation, private, public, municipal or political body, under the Government of the United States of America, and foreign countries, so far and to the extent that the same may be done and performed under the provisions of the Religious Corporation Laws of the State of Florida.
- O. To do anything and everything that is proper to the aforesaid purposes and which may properly be done by a Religious Corporation organized under and subject to the laws of the State of Florida: to possess all rights and privileges, and exercise all powers, permitted to such a corporation, including, without limitation, the power to solicit monies and contributions from the general public.

The Corporation may seek tax exempt status as required by the Internal Revenue Service and shall adhere to the following:

Said corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth herein.

No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Upon dissolution of this corporation assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, i.e. charitable, educational, religious or scientific, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code. However, if the named recipient is not then in existence or no longer a qualified distributee, or unwilling or unable to accept the distribution, then the assets of this corporation shall be distributed to a fund, foundation or corporation organized and operated exclusively for the purposes specified in section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or corresponding section of any future Federal tax code.)

ARTICLE IV
