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ARTICLE III PURPOSE

The purpose for which the CORPORATION is organized is:

To advance mathematical and scientific knowledge in K-12 students and teachers by promoting educational events—math circles and festivals—that are meaningful and enjoyable for participants. These events will help students develop positive experiences with mathematics and stimulate early vocations for science.

We also aim at making these services accessible to the underserved and marginalized, such as girls as well as students from impoverished and immigrant communities.

Our mission is to organize, promote, disseminate, and develop math circles and festivals both in the United States of America and around the world. We plan to accomplish this by:

- 1. Creating and maintaining a network of math circles with branches in different U.S. cities and in other countries.
- 2. Training those interested in organizing math circles and festivals.
- 3. Collaborating with institutional representatives to sponsor and host math circles and festivals.
- Cooperating with regional conference coordinators to organize math festivals as part of their events.
- 5. Producing teaching resources and strategies that can be used in math circles and festivals with people of different ages.

ARTICLE IV MANNER OF ELECTION

The manner in which the directors are elected and appointed:

The election and appointment of directors and officers of the Corporation will be done according to the guidelines set forth in the By-laws of CYFEMAT, the CORPORATION.

ARTICLE V MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Any action which would otherwise, under law or the provisions of the Articles of the Incorporation or Bylaws of the CORPORATION, require approval by members of any number or proportion, shall be satisfied by the approval of a corresponding number or proportion of the Board of Directors. Furthermore, all rights, which would otherwise vest in the members under law, the Articles of Incorporation or the Bylaws of the Corporation, shall vest in the Board of Directors of the CYFEMAT.

ARTICLE VI LIMITATIONS OF CORPORATE POWERS

- (a) No part of the net earnings of the CORPORATION shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to its board members, trustees, officers, or any other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in this Articles of Incorporation.

 (b) No part of the activities of the CORPORATION shall be the carrying of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.
- (c) This corporation is organized and operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 50I(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
- (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (1) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (2) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170 (c) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

ARTICLE VII DISSOLUTION OF THE CORPORATION

(a) Restatement of Purpose. This corporation has the educational purpose of benefitting children up to and including high school. As such the corporation will not charge fees to students benefitting from its services (Math Circles and Festivals). CYFEMAT is then a corporation organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes, including for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

(b) Dissolution of the Corporation. Upon dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the Federal government, or to a State or local government, for charitable purposes.
