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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

TAMPA BAY YOUTH AND HIGH SCHOOL SPORTS, INC.

(A Corporation Not-For-Profit)

The undersigned incorporator, for the purpose of forming a corporation not-for-profit (the "Corporation") under the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act (Florida Statutes Chapter 617) (the "Act") and other applicable laws of the State of Florida, hereby executes and adopts the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I Name and Address

The name of the Corporation is TAMPA BAY YOUTH AND HIGH SCHOOL SPORTS, INC. The principal office (and mailing address) is located at 1211 N. Westshore Boulevard, Suite 305, Tampa, Florida 33607. The Board of Directors may from time to time move the principal office of the Corporation to any other address in the State of Florida.

ARTICLE II Purpose of Corporation

The Corporation is organized exclusively for one or more of the purposes as specification Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Internal Revenue Code"), and the Treasury Regulations issued thereunder as the same now exist or as the same have exist or as the same now exist or as the same have be hereafter amended from time to time (collectively, the "Revenue Laws"). The specific surposes of the Corporation are educational and charitable, aimed at promoting youth sports education, sportsmanship and teamwork through activities for players, coaches, and parents schildren participating in youth and high school sports programs throughout Tampa Bay, Florida.

All references to sections of the Internal Revenue Code contained herein shall include such sections as of the date hereof and the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

ARTICLE III Powers

The Corporation shall have the power, either directly or indirectly, either alone or in conjunction or in cooperation with others, to do any and all lawful acts and things and to engage in any and all lawful activities which may be necessary, useful, desirable, suitable or proper for the furtherance, accomplishment, fostering or attainment of any or all of the purposes for which the Corporation is organized, and to aid or assist other organizations whose activities are such as to further accomplish, foster or attain any of such purposes. Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, the Corporation (a) shall exercise only such powers as are set forth in furtherance of the exempt purposes of organizations set forth in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and its regulations as the same now exist or as they may be hereafter amended from time to time, and (b) shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt

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from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. No part of the net earnings of the Corporation, on dissolution or otherwise, shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in these Articles of Incorporation. No substantial part of the activities of this Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation; and this Corporation shall not participate or intervene, by publication or distribution of statements or otherwise, in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

ARTICLE IV Term of Existence

The corporate existence of the Corporation shall commence effective on the date of the filing of these Articles of Incorporation, and the Corporation shall have perpetual existence thereafter.
