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FLORIDA PROFIT/NON PROFIT CORPORATION HUNT COMMERCIAL PARK PROPERTY OWNER'S ASSOCIATION,

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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF HUNT COMMERCIAL PARK PROPERTY OWNER'S ASSOCIATION, INC.

The undersigned, acting as the Incorporator of this corporation pursuant to Chapter 617, Florida Statutes, hereby forms a corporation not for profit under the laws of the State of Florida and adopts the following Articles of Incorporation (the "Articles") for such corporation:

ARTICLE I - NAME

Section 1.1. The name of the corporation shall be HUNT COMMERCIAL PARK PROPERTY OWNER'S ASSOCIATION, INC. For convenience, the corporation shall be referred to in this instrument as the "Association."

ARTICLE II - DURATION

Section 2.1. The Association shall exist perpetually unless and until dissolved according to law. Corporate existence of the Association shall commence upon the filing of these Articles with the Florida Department of State.

ARTICLE III - DEFINITIONS

Section 3.1. Unless the context otherwise requires, all capitalized terms herein shall have the same meaning as set forth in the Declaration Hunt Commercial Park recorded or to be recorded in the Public Records of St. Lucie County, Florida, as it may be amended or supplemented from time to time the (the "Declaration"), which pertains to the Property, as defined in the Declaration.

ARTICLE IV – ADDRESS OF PRINCIPAL OFFICE AND MAILING ADDRESS OF ASSOCIATION

Section 4.1. The principal office address and the mailing address of the Association 3611 be 9890 Kingsley Avenue, Suite 102, Orange Park, Florida 32073.

ARTICLE V - REGISTERED OFFICE AND REGISTERED AGENT

Section 5.1. The initial street address of the registered office of this Corporation in the State of Florida shall be 1890 Kingsley Avenue, Suite 102, Orange Park, Florida 32073. The Board of Directors may from time to time move the registered office to any other address in Florida. The name of the initial registered agent of this Corporation at that address is L. Ward Huntley. The Board of Directors may from time to time designate a new registered agent.

ARTICLE VI - PURPOSE AND POWERS OF THE ASSOCIATION

Section 6.1. The Association is organized to provide for the acquisition, construction, management, maintenance, and care of, including the preservation and architectural control of, the Property, and to promote the health, safety and general welfare of the members of the association. The Association shall have all the powers of a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws of the State of Florida, subject only to such limitations upon the exercise of such powers as are expressly set forth in these Articles of Incorporation, the Bylaws, or the Declaration; provided, however, that the Association is specifically prohibited from engaging in any political activity or any other activity whereby its status as a

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not-for-profit corporation or its exemption from federal or state income taxation, if any, would be forfeited or jeopardized. The Association shall have the power and duty to do any and all lawful things which may be authorized, assigned, required or permitted to be done by the Declaration, these Articles of Incorporation and the Bylaws, and to do and perform any and all acts which may be necessary or proper for, or incidental to, the exercise of any of the duties or powers of the Association for the benefit of the members and for the maintenance, administration and improvement of the Property. The duties and powers of the Association shall be exercised by the Board of Directors unless provided otherwise in the Declaration, these Articles of Incorporation or the Bylaws. The Association shall not pay dividends and no part of any income or net earnings of the Association shall be distributed to its members, directors, officers or other private individual.

ARTICLE VII - MEMBERSHIP

Section 7.1. Membership. Each Owner, including the Declarant, shall be a member of the Association. No Owner, whether one (1) or more Persons, shall have more than one (1) membership per Unit owned. Any person or entity who holds any interest merely as a security for the performance of any obligation shall not be a member of the Association. The Association membership of each Owner shall be appurtenant to the Unit giving rise to such membership, and shall not be transferred except upon the transfer of title to said Unit and then only to the transferee of title thereto. Any prohibited separate transfer of a membership in the Association shall be void. Any transfer of title shall operate automatically to transfer the membership in the Association appurtenant thereto to the new Owner thereof. The membership of an Owner in the Association shall not be refused, waived or surrendered, but voting rights and rights of use and enjoyment of the Common Area may be regulated or suspended as provided in these Articles of Incorporation, the Declaration, and/or the Bylaws.

Section 7.2. Voting Rights. The voting rights of members in the Association shall be as set forth in the Declaration and the Bylaws, as the same may be amended from time to time.

ARTICLE VIII - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 8.1. The business and affairs of the Association shall be managed by a Board of Directors as provided in the Declaration and Bylaws. The names and addresses of persons who are to act in the capacity of director until appointment or election of their successors pursuant to these Articles of Incorporation and the Bylaws are:

The method of election and term of office, removal and filling of vacancies of the Board of Directors shall be as set forth in the Bylaws.

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ARTICLE IX - OFFICERS

Section 9.1. The affairs of the Association shall be administered by the officers designated in the Bylaws. The officers shall be elected by the Board of Directors at the first meeting, and they shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Directors. The names and addresses of the officers who shall serve until their successors are designated by the Board of Directors are as follows:

ARTICLE X - INDEMNIFICATION

Section 10.1. The Association shall indemnify every officer, director, committee member ant employce of the Association against any and all costs and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' and paralegals' fees, reasonably incurred by or imposed upon such officer, director, committee manuber of employee in connection with any action, suit, or other proceeding (including settlement of any suit or proceeding, if approved by the then Board of Directors) to which he may be a party by reason of being or directors, committee members and employees shall not be liable for any mistake of judgment? negligent or otherwise, except for their own individual willful misfeasance, malfeasance, misconduct, or bad faith. The officers and directors of the Association shall have no personal liability with respect to any contract or other commitment made by them, in good faith, on behalf of the Association (except to the extent they may also be members of the Association), and the Association shall indemnify and forever hold each such officer and director free and harmless against any and all liability to others on account of any such contract or commitment. Any right to indemnification provided for herein shall not be exclusive of any other rights to which any officer, director, committee member, or employee, or former officer, director, committee member or employee may be entitled. The Association shall, as a Common Expense, maintain adequate general liability and officers' and directors' liability insurance to fund this obligation, if such insurance is reasonably available.

ARTICLE XI - BYLAWS

Section 11.1. The Bylaws of the Association shall be adopted by the Board of Directors and may be altered, amended or rescinded in the manner provided by the Bylaws.

ARTICLE XII - AMENDMENTS

Section 12.1. <u>Notice</u>. Amendments to these Articles shall be proposed and approved by a simple majority of the Board of Directors unless the approval of the membership of the Association is required under the Declaration, in which case the members must approve said amendment. No amendment shall be effective until filed with the office of the Secretary of State of the State of Florida. A certified copy of each amendment shall be recorded in the Public Records of St. Lucie County, Florida.

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Section 12.2. <u>Proviso</u>. No amendment to these Articles may be adopted which would eliminate, modify, prejudice, abridge, or otherwise adversely affect any rights, benefits, privileges, or priorities granted or reserved to the Declarant or mortgagees of Units without the consent of said Declarant or mortgagees in each instance. No amendment shall be made that is in conflict with the Act or the Declaration.

Section 12.3. <u>Declarant Amendments</u>. Notwithstanding anything herein contained to the contrary, to the extent lawful, the Declarant may amend these Articles consistent with the provisions of the Declaration allowing certain amendments to be effected by the Declarant alone.

ARTICLE XIII - INCORPORATOR

ARTICLE XIV - NONSTOCK CORPORATION

Section 14.1. The Association is organized on a nonstock basis and shall not issue shares of stock evidencing membership in the Association; provided, however, that membership in the Association may be evidenced by a certificate of membership which shall contain a statement that the Association is a corporation not for profit.

ARTICLE XV - DISSOLUTION

Section 15.1. In the event the Association is intentionally dissolved for the purpose of winding, up its affairs, then after the claims of creditors of the Association have been satisfied from the assets of the Association or otherwise, the remaining assets of the Association shall be dedicated to a public body or conveyed to a not-for-profit corporation, as defined in Chapter 617, Florida Statutes, as amended, with similar purposes, as the Board of Directors of the Association shall determine in their sole discretion.
