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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

DREAM DEFENDERS EDUCATION FUND, INC.

The undersigned, acting as the incorporator of this Corporation not for profit pursuant to

Chapter 617, Florida Statutes, adopts the following articles of incorporation and states as follows:

ARTICLE I: NAME

The name of the corporation is "Dream Defenders Education Fund, Inc."

ARTICLE II: PRINCIPAL OFFICE AND MAILING ADDRESS

The initial principal place of business and mailing address is: 800 NW 54th St Miami, FL 33127.

ARTICLE III: DURATION

The period of the duration of this corporation shall be perpetual unless dissolved in accordance with Florida Jaw. Corporate existence shall commence upon filing with the Secretary of State.

ARTICLE IV: PURPOSES

The corporation is an alliance of diverse youth, young adults, and students fighting for a better future. It is organized for such educational and charitable purposes as shall qualify it for

exemption from federal taxation under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, including, but not limited to, conducting public education on social and economic issues, promoting nonpartisan civic engagement, coordinating policy campaigns, and creating issue content.

ARTICLE V: POWERS

The corporation may exercise all power or authority granted to it under the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act or otherwise, including, but not limited to, the power to accept donations of money, property, or any interest therein, or any other thing of value, and to dwn or lease property, whether real or personal.

ARTICLE VI: RESTRICTIONS

In carrying out its purposes, the corporation shall not have or exercise any power or authority granted to it under the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act, nor engage directly or indirectly in any activity, that would prevent it from qualifying as a corporation described in section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. No part of the assets or earnings, current or accumulated, of the corporation shall at any time inure to the benefit of any private individual, within the meaning of the prohibition contained in section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to make payments as reasonable compensation for services rendered and/or as a reasonable allowance for authorized expenditures incurred on behalf of the corporation and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article IV.

The corporation shall not carry on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence

legislation to an extent that would disqualify it from tax exemption under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code by reason of attempting to influence legislation. The corporation shall not participate or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

The corporation shall not be operated for the primary purpose of carrying on a trade or business for profit.

The corporation shall not issue any capital stock and shall not have members.

ARTICLE VII; DIRECTORS

The affairs of the corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors. Qualifications are properly as a specified in the Bylaws. 
