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# ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF

### SEAGRASS RESTORATION INSTITUTE, INC., a Florida not for profit corporation

The undersigned hereby presents these Articles of Incorporation for the formation of a Florida not for profit corporation pursuant to the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act, as provided in Chapter 617 of the Florida Statutes.

## ARTICLE I. NAME

The complete legal name of this Corporation shall be SEAGRASS RESTORATION INSTITUTE, INC.

### ARTICLE II. PRINCIPAL OFFICE AND/OR MAILING ADDRESS

The address of the principal office of the Corporation is 6611 Hayter Drive, Lakeland, Florida 33813-3578 and mailing address of the Corporation is Post Office Box 7034, Lakeland Florida 33807-7034.

# ARTICLE III. DURATION

The term of existence of the Corporation is perpetual unless it shall be dissolved pursuant to the laws of the State of Florida. The corporate existence shall commence with the filing of these Articles of Incorporation.

## ARTICLE IV. PURPOSE

The purposes for which the Corporation was formed are:

- (a) The Corporation is organized exclusively for any and all charitables religious, educational, scientific and literary, including for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law). To the extent consistent with the preceding sentence and permissible under Florida law, the purpose of this Corporation shall include, but shall not be limited to, the study, provision, growth, propagation, expansion and safeguarding of seagrass and its ecosystems, habitats and environment.
- (b) The Corporation may receive and administer funds for such charitable purposes, all for the public by bequest, devise, gift, purchase, or lease, either absolutely or in trust for such objects and purposes or any of them, any property, real, personal or mixed, without limitation as

to amount of value, except such limitations, if any, as may be imposed by law; to sell, lease, convey, and dispose of any such property and to invest and reinvest the principal thereof, and to deal with and expend the income therefrom for any of the before-mentioned purposes, without limitation, except such limitations, if any, as may be contained in the instrument under which such property is received; to receive any property, real, personal mixed, in trust, under the terms of any will, deed of trust, or other trust instrument for the foregoing purposes or any of them, and in administering the same to carry out the directions, and exercise the powers contained in the trust instrument under which the property is received including the expenditure of the principal as well as the income, for one or more of such purposes, if authorized or directed in the trust instrument under which it is received, but no gift, bequest or devise of any such property shall be received and accepted if it be conditioned or limited in such manner as shall require the disposition of the income or its principal to any person or organization other than an "exempt organization" or for other than "exempt purposes" within the meaning of §501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as now in force or afterward amended, or as shall in the opinion of the Board of Directors, jeopardize the federal income tax exemption of the Corporation pursuant to \$501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as now in force or later amended; to receive, take title to, hold, and use the proceeds and income of stocks, bonds, obligations, or other securities of any corporation or corporations, domestic or foreign, but only for the foregoing purposes, or some of them, and, in general, to exercise any, all and every power for which a non-profit corporation organized under the applicable provisions of the Florida Statutes for charitable purposes, all for the public welfare, can be authorized to exercise, but only to the extent the exercise of such powers are in furtherance of exempt purposes.

- distributable to, its directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in these Articles. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation (except that, if the Corporation so elects, it may make such expenditures in conformity with § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code) and the Corporation shall not participate in or intervene in (including publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of, or in opposition to, any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on: (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal Income Tax under § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).
- (d) To do all and everything necessary, suitable and proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes or the attainment of any of the objects or the furtherance of any of the powers earlier set forth, either alone or in association with other corporations, firms, or individuals and to do every other act or acts, thing or things, incidental or appurtenant to or growing out of or connected with the aforesaid objects or purposes of any part of parts thereof, provided the same are not inconsistent with the laws under which this Corporation is organized.

### ARTICLE V. BYLAWS

Except as otherwise provided therein, the Bylaws of this Corporation shall be made, altered and rescinded by a majority vote of the Board of Directors voting at any regular Board of Directors meeting or at a special meeting called for that purpose.

### ARTICLE VI. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The affairs of this Corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors and by such other officers of the Corporation as the Corporation may hereafter see fit to name and designate as provided in the Bylaws. The number of Directors may be increased or decreased from time to time as provided in the Bylaws of the Corporation, but shall never be less than three (3) voting members. The initial Board of Directors shall consist of three (3) Directors hereinafter named:

## ARTICLE VII. INITIAL REGISTERED OFFICE AND AGENT

### ARTICLE VIII. AMENDMENTS

Any amendments to these Articles of Incorporation shall be adopted in the manner set forth in the Bylaws.

### ARTICLE IX. DISSOLUTION

In the event of the dissolution of this Corporation, any assets of said Corporation then remaining shall be distributed to such organizations as shall qualify under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

### ARTICLE X. CHARITABLE PURPOSE

This organization is organized exclusively for charitable purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as hereafter amended.
