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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

BOCA RATON INNOVATION CAMPUS PROPERTY OWNERS' ASSOCIATION, INC.

The undersigned incorporator, for the purpose of forming a not for profit corporation pursuant to the laws of the State of Florida, hereby adopts the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE 1 NAME

The name of the corporation is BOCA RATON INNOVATION CAMPUS PROPERTY OWNERS' ASSOCIATION, INC. (the "Association").

ARTICLE 2 PRINCIPAL OFFICE

The principal office and mailing address of the Association shall be 4920 Conference Way North, Suite 100, Boca Raton, Florida 33431, or such other place as may be subsequently designated by the Board of Directors. All books and records of the Association shall be kept at its principal office or at such other place as may be designated by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE 3 DEFINITIONS

Unless otherwise provided herein to the contrary, all terms and words utilized herein shall be as defined in that certain Amended and Restated Declaration of Covenants, Restrictions and Easements for Boca Raton Innovation Campus (said declaration as make amended from time to time is hereinafter referred to as the "Declaration"), recorded or to be recorded in the Public Records of Palm Beach County, Florida.

ARTICLE 4 PURPOSE AND POWERS OF THE ASSOCIATION

This Association does not contemplate pecuniary gain or profit to the Members thereof, and the specific purposes for which it is formed are to provide for maintenance, preservation and architectural control of the Parcels, Sub-Parcels and Common Areas as more particularly described in the Declaration and to promote the health safety and welfare of the Owners and Permitted Users within the Property and any additions thereto as may hereafter be brought within the jurisdiction of this Association.

The powers of the Association shall be subject to and shall be exercised in accordance with the provisions of the Governing Documents. The Association shall have all of the powers and duties permitted by law, except as expressly prohibited, restricted or limited by the Governing Documents, and all of the powers and duties reasonably necessary to operate the Association.

4.2 All funds and the title to all properties acquired by the Association and their proceeds shall be held for the benefit and use of the Members in accordance with the provisions of the Governing Documents.

ARTICLE 5 MEMBERSHIP

All Qualifying Owners of record shall be Members of the Association. The foregoing is not intended to include (a) any Owner of a Unit within a Sub-Parcel, or (b) persons or entities who hold an interest merely as security for the performance of an obligation. Membership shall be appurtenant to and may not be separated from ownership of any Parcel or Sub-Parcel which is subject to assessment by the Association.

ARTICLE 6 VOTING RIGHTS

The voting rights of each Qualifying Owner are set forth in the Declaration. All votes shall be exercised or cast in the manner provided by the Bylaws.

ARTICLE 7 BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- 7.1 Number, Term and Qualification. The property, business and affairs of the Association shall be managed by a Board of Directors. The number, term and qualifications of each director shall be in accordance with the Bylaws.
- 7.2 <u>Duties and Powers</u>. All of the duties and powers of the Association existing under the Governing Documents shall be exercised exclusively by the Board of Directors, its agents, contractors or employees, subject only to approval by the Members when such approval is specifically required.
- 7.3 <u>Election: Removal.</u> Directors of the Association shall be elected or appointed for the term and subject to the qualifications set forth in the Bylaws. Vacancies on the Board of Directors shall be filled in the manner provided by the Bylaws.
- 7.4 <u>First Directors</u>. The names and addresses of the members of the first Board of Directors who shall hold office until their successors are elected and have taken office, as provided in the By-Laws, are as follows:

7.5 Standards. A director shall discharge his duties as a director, including any duties as a member of a Committee: in good faith; with the care an ordinary prudent person in a like position would exercise under similar circumstances; and in a manner reasonably believed to be in the best interests of the Association. Unless a director has knowledge concerning a matter in question that makes reliance unwarranted, a director, in

discharging his duties, may rely on information, opinions, reports or statements, including financial statements and other data, if prepared or presented by: one or more officers or employees of the Association whom the director reasonably believes to be reasonable and competent in the manners presented, legal counsel, public accountants or other persons as to matters the director reasonably believes are within the persons' professional or expert competence, or a Committee if the director reasonably believes the Committee merits confidence. A director is not liable for any action taken as a director, or any failure to take action, if the director performed the duties of the office in compliance with the foregoing standards.

ARTICLE 8 OFFICERS

The affairs of the Association shall be administered by the officers holding the offices designated in the Bylaws. The officers shall be elected by the Board of Directors of the Association at its first meeting following the annual meeting of the Members of the Association and shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Directors. The Bylaws may provide for the removal from office of officers, for filling vacancies and for the duties and qualifications of the officers.

ARTICLE 9 DISSOLUTION

The Association may be dissolved with the approval of 75% of the votes held by the Voting Members represented at a meeting of the members in person or by proxy at which a quorum has been attained. Upon dissolution of the Association, other than incident to a merger or consolidation of the Association or termination of the common interest ownership of the Common Areas, the assets of the Association shall be dedicated to an appropriate public agency to be used for purposes similar to those for which this Association was created. In the event that such dedication is refused acceptance, such assets shall be granted, conveyed and assigned to any not for profit corporation, association, trust or other organization devoted to such similar purposes.

ARTICLE 10 DURATION

The Association shall exist perpetually.

ARTICLE 11 INCORPORATOR

The incorporator is G&I X BRIC Fee Owner, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company.

ARTICLE 12 AMENDMENTS

Amendments to these Articles shall be proposed and adopted in the manner set forth in the Declaration. A copy of each amendment shall be filed with the Secretary of State pursuant to the provisions of applicable Florida law, and a copy certified by the Secretary of State shall be recorded in the public records of Palm Beach County, Florida with a reference to the book and page of the Public Records where the Declaration was recorded which contained, as an exhibit, the initial recording of these Articles

ARTICLE 13 BYLAWS

The first Bylaws of the Association shall be adopted by the Board of Directors and may be altered, amended or rescinded in the manner provided in the Bylaws and the Declaration.

ARTICLE 14 INDEMNIFICATION

- Indemnitees. The Association shall indemnify any person who was or is a party to any proceeding (other than an action by the Association) by reason of the fact that the person is or was a director, officer, committee member, employer or agent (each, an "Indemnitee") of the Association against liability incurred in connection with such proceeding, including any appeal thereof, if the person acted in good faith and in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the Association and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe the conduct was unlawful. The termination of any proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, or conviction or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent shall not, of itself, create a presumption that the person did not act in good faith and in a manner which he or she reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the Association.
- Indemnification. The Association shall indemnify any person who was or is a party to 14.2 any proceeding by the Association to procure a judgment in its favor by reason of the fact that the person is or was a director, officer, committee member, employee, or agent of the Association against expenses and amounts paid in settlement not exceeding, in the judgment of the Board of Directors, the estimated expense of litigating the proceeding to conclusion, actually and reasonably incurred in connection with the defense or settlement of such proceeding, including any appeal thereof. indemnification shall be authorized if such person acted in good faith and in a manner he reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the Association, except that no indemnification shall be made under this Section in respect of any claim, issue, or matter as to which such person shall have been adjudged to be liable unless, and only to the extent that, the court in which such proceeding was brought, or any other court of competent jurisdiction shall determine upon application that, despite the adjudication of liability but in view of all circumstances of the case, such person is fairly and reasonably entitled to indemnity for such expenses which such court shall desen proper.
- 14.3 Indemnification for Expenses. To the extent that a director, officer, committee member, employee, or agent of the Association has been successful on the merits or otherwise in defense of any proceeding referred to in Section 14.1 or 14.2, or in defense of any claim, issue, or matter therein, the person shall be indemnified against expenses actually not reasonably incurred by him in connection therewith.
- Determination of Applicability. Any indemnification under Section 14.1 or Section 22, unless pursuant to a determination by a court, shall be made by the Association onlycas authorized in the specific case upon a determination that indemnification of the director, officer, committee member, employee, or agent is proper under the circumstances because the person has met the applicable standard of conduct set forth in Section 14.1 or Section 14.2. Such determination shall be made:

- (a) By the Board of Directors by a majority vote of a quorum consisting of directors who were not parties to such proceeding;
- (b) If such a quorum is not obtainable, by majority vote of a Committee duly designated by the Board of Directors (in which directors who are parties may vote on the members of the Committee) consisting solely of two or more directors who are not at the time parties to the proceeding;
- (c) By independent legal counsel selected:
 - 1. by the Board of Directors prescribed in paragraph (a) or the Committee prescribed in paragraph (b); or
 - 2. if a quorum of the directors cannot be obtained for paragraph (a) and the Committee cannot be designated under paragraph (b), then by a majority of the voting interests of the Voting Members of the Association who were not parties to such proceeding.
- Advancing Expenses. Expenses incurred by a director or officer in defending a civil or criminal proceeding may be paid by the Association in advance of the final disposition of such proceeding upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of such director or officer to repay such amount if the person is ultimately found not to be entitled to indemnification by the Association pursuant to this section. Expenses incurred by committee members, employees or agents may be paid in advance upon such terms or conditions that the Board of Directors deems appropriate.
- 14.6 Exclusivity: Exclusions. The indemnification and advancement of expenses provided pursuant to this Article 14 are not exclusive, and the Association may make any other or further indemnification or advancement of expenses of any of its directors, officers, committee members, employees, or agents, under any bylaw, agreement, vote of Members or disinterested directors, or otherwise. However, indemnification or advancement of expenses shall not be made to or on behalf of any director, officer, committee member, employee, or agent if a judgment or other final adjudication establishes that his or her actions or omissions were material to the cause of action so adjudicated and constitute:
 - (a) A violation of the criminal law, unless the director, officer, committee member, employee, or agent had reasonable cause to believe his or her conduct was unlawful or had no reasonable cause to believe such conduct was unlawful or
 - (b) A transaction from which the director, officer, committee member employee cagent derived an improper personal benefit; or
 - (c) Willful misconduct or a conscious disregard for the best interests of the Association in a proceeding by or in the right of the Association factor of the a judgment in its favor or in favor of the members of the Association.
- 14.7 Continuing Effect. Indemnification and advancement of expenses as provided in this Article 14 shall continue to a person who has ceased to be a director, officer, committee member, employee, or agent and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors, and administrators of such a person, unless otherwise provided when authorized or ratified.

- Application to Court. Notwithstanding the failure of the Association to provide indemnification in any specific case, a director, officer, committee member, employee, or agent of the Association who is or was a party to a proceeding may apply for indemnification or advancement of expenses, or both, to the court conducting the proceeding, to the circuit court, or to another court of competent jurisdiction. On receipt of an application, the court, after giving any notice that it considers necessary, may order indemnification and advancement of expenses, including expenses incurred in seeking court ordered indemnification or advancement of expenses, if it determines that:
 - (a) The director, officer, committee member, employee, or agent is entitled to mandatory indemnification under Section 14.3, in which case the court shall also order the Association to pay the director reasonable expenses incurred in obtaining court ordered indemnification or advancement of expenses;
 - (b) The director, officer, employee, committee member, or agent is entitled to indemnification or advancement of expenses, or both, by virtue of the exercise by the Association of its power pursuant to Section 14.6; or
 - (c) The director, officer, committee member, employee, or agent is fairly and reasonably entitled to indemnification or advancement of expenses, or both, in view of all the relevant circumstances, regardless of whether such person met the standard of conduct set forth in Section 14.1, Section 14.2, or Section 14.6.
- Definitions. For purposes of this Article 14, the term "expenses" shall be deemed to include attorneys' fees, including those for any appeals; the term "liability" shall be deemed to include obligations to pay a judgment, settlement, penalty, fine, and expenses actually and reasonably incurred with respect to a proceeding; the term "proceeding" shall be deemed to include any threatened, pending, or completed action, suit, or other type of proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative, and whether formal or informal; and the term "agent" shall be deemed to include a volunteer.
- 14.10 <u>Amendment</u>. No amendment to any provision of this Article 14 shall be applicable as to any party eligible for indemnification hereunder who has not given his or her prior written consent to such amendment.

ARTICLE 15 INITIAL REGISTERED AGENT

CT Corporation System, whose address is 1200 South Pine Island Road, Plantation, Florida 33324, is hereby appointed as the initial registered agent of this Association.
