ARTICLE III: The specific Purpose for which this corporation is organized is: This corporation is organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

ARTICLE IV: The Officers and Directors of the corporation are elected.

ARTICLE X: Conflict of Interest Resolution

- (1) Any director, officer or key employee who has an interest in a contract or other transaction presented to the Board or a committee thereof for authorization, approval, or ratification shall make a prompt and full disclosure of their interest to the Board or committee prior to its acting on such a contract or transaction. Such disclosure shall include any relevant material; facts known to such person about the contract or transaction that might be reasonable construed to be averse to the corporation's interest.
- (2) No member or director shall cast a vote on any matter which has a direct bearing on services to be provided by that member, director or any organization which such member or director represents or which such member or director has an ownership interest or is otherwise interested or affiliated, which would directly or indirectly benefit such member or director. All such services shall be fully disclosed or known to the Board members present at the meeting at which such contract shall be authorized.

ARTICLE XI: Dissolution

Upon winding up or dissolution of this corporation, after paying or adequately providing for the debts and obligations of the corporation, the remaining assets shall be distributed to a non-profit fund, foundation, or corporation, which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious and/or scientific purposes and which has established its tax-exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

ARTICLE XII: Document Destruction

Document Retention and Destruction policy which follows identifies the record retention responsibilities of staff, volunteers, members of the board of directors, and outsiders for maintaining and documenting the storage and destruction of the organization's documents and records.

The organization's staff, volunteers, members of the board of directors, committee members and outsiders (independent contractors via agreements with them) are required to honor the following rules:

ARTICLE XIII: Whistleblower Protection Policy

The organization requires directors, officers and employees to observe high standards of business and personal ethics in the conduct of their duties and responsibilities. As employees and representatives of The Golden Ribbon Foundation ("the Foundation") must practice honesty and integrity in fulfilling our responsibilities and comply with all applicable laws and regulations.

Reporting Responsibility

This Whistleblower Policy is intended to encourage and enable employees and others to raise serious concerns internally so that the Foundation can address and correct inappropriate conduct and actions. It is the responsibility of all board members, officers, employees and volunteers to report concerns about violations of the Foundation's code of ethics or suspected violations of law or regulations that govern its operations.

No Retaliation

It is contrary to the values of the Foundation for anyone to retaliate against any board member, officer, and employee or volunteer who in good faith reports an ethics violation, or a suspected violation of law, such as a complaint of discrimination, or suspected fraud, or suspected violation of any regulation governing the operations of the Foundation. An employee who retaliates against someone who has reported a violation in good faith is subject to discipline up to and including termination of employment.

Reporting Procedure

The Foundation has an open-door policy and suggests that employees share their questions, concerns, suggestions or complaints with their supervisor. If you are not comfortable speaking with your supervisor or you are not satisfied with your supervisor's response, you are encouraged to speak with the President or an Executive Director, or a Board member, if the organization is very small and involving the board would be appropriate. Supervisors and managers are required to report complaints or concerns about suspected ethical and legal violations in writing to the President, who has the responsibility to investigate all reported complaints.

Employees with concerns or complaints may also submit their concerns in writing directly to their supervisor or the Executive Director or the organization's Compliance Officer.

Compliance Officer, Chairman of the Board, President

The above individuals are responsible for ensuring that all complaints about unethical or illegal conduct are investigated and resolved. The above individuals will advise the President, Chairman of the Board and/or the Board of Directors of all complaints and their resolution and will report at least annually to the Treasurer/Chair of the Finance Committee/Audit Committee on compliance activity relating to accounting or alleged financial improprieties.

Accounting and Auditing Matters

The President shall immediately notify the Audit Committee / Finance Committee of any concerns or complaint regarding corporate accounting practices, internal controls or auditing and work with the committee until the matter is resolved.

Acting in Good Faith

Anyone filing a written complaint concerning a violation or suspected violation must be acting in good faith and have reasonable grounds for believing the information disclosed indicates a violation. Any allegations that prove not to be substantiated and which prove to have been made maliciously or knowingly to be false will be viewed as a serious disciplinary offense.

Confidentiality

Violations or suspected violations may be submitted on a confidential basis by the complainant. Reports of violations or suspected violations will be kept confidential to the extent possible, consistent with the need to conduct an adequate investigation.

Handling of Reported Violations

The President will notify the person who submitted a complaint and acknowledge receipt of the reported violation or suspected violation. All reports will be promptly investigated and appropriate corrective action will be taken if warranted by the investigation.
