Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 617.0202. Florida Statutes, the undersigned Florida nonprofit corporation adopts the following articles of incorporation:

ARTICLE I NAME

The name of this corporation shall be INTERNATIONAL CARIBBEAN CHRISTIAN LEADERSHIP. INC.

ARTICLE II PRINCIPAL OFFICE

ARTICLE III PURPOSE

A. This corporation is a not-for-profit corporation and is not organized for the private gain of any person. It is organized under Chapter 617.0202. Florida Statutes, for charitable, scientific and educational purposes.

This corporation is organized and operated exclusively for charitable, scientific and educational purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, (the "Code") or any future federal tax code.
- C. The duration of the corporation is perpetual.
- D. The corporation shall not have capital stock.

E. The Corporation shall have only one (1) class of membership, the Board of Directors members, which shall be voting members. The affairs of and management of the Corporation are reserved in the Board of Directors whose members shall have a fiduciary obligation to the Corporation.

ARTICLE IV MANNER OF ELECTION

The initial Board of Directors shall be appointed by the President or as otherwise stated in the Bylaws. The Board of Directors shall consist of not less than three (3) persons. The number of Directors may be increased or decreased from time to time by approval of the Board. Directors of the Corporation shall be appointed by the President at the annual meeting of Directors and shall serve until the succeeding annual meeting and/or until their successors have been qualified and appointed.

ARTICLE IX OTHER PROVISIONS

A. This corporation is organized and operated exclusively for charitable, scientific and educational purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, (the "Code") or any future federal tax code.

- B. No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate or intervene in any political campaign (including the publishing or distribution of statements) on behalf of any candidate for public office.
- C. The property of the Corporation is dedicated to nonprofit charitable, scientific and educational purposes. No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of its directors, officers, or to any other individual, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered, and to make payments in the furtherance of the nonprofit purposes of the Corporation.
- D. Upon the winding up and dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or adequately providing for all the debts, obligations, and liabilities of the Corporation, distribute the remaining assets of the Corporation exclusively for the nonprofit purposes of the Corporation to an organization which is organized and operated exclusively for nonprofit purposes and which is tax exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, or shall distribute the remaining assets of the Corporation to such other organization or organizations which are organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes and which are tax exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, as the Board of Directors in its sole discretion shall determine.
- 2. In furtherance of its nonprofit tax-exempt purposes, the Corporation shall have the following powers and authority:
 - (a) To do all acts, perform all functions, and carry on all activities permitted by the nonprofit corporation laws of the State of Florida or of any other State in which the Corporation is qualified to act.
 - (b) To have and exercise all powers and rights enjoyed by corporations generally in the State of Florida, and in any State in which the Corporation is qualified to act, as long as the exercise of such powers is not specifically prohibited for nonprofit corporations.

- (c) To use all media, whether now known or hereafter discovered, including, but not limited to, internet, print, television, satellite, and radio,
- (d) To exercise such incidental powers as may reasonably be necessary to carry out the purposes for which the Corporation is established, provided that such incidental powers shall be exercised in a manner consistent with its tax-exempt status as set forth in Section 501(c)(3) of the Code.
- (e) Notwithstanding any other provisions of the Articles of Incorporation or the Bylaws, the Corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activity or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the nonprofit charitable, scientific and educational purposes of the Corporation, and the Corporation shall not carry on any activity not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, or under the corresponding section of any future United States revenue law; or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under 170(b)(1)(A)(i) of the Code, or the corresponding section of any future United States revenue law.
