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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

JAMES MICHAEL MATTHEW INSTITUTE INC.

In compliance with Chapter 617 (Corporations Not for Profit) of the Florida Statutes

ARTICLE I

<u>Name</u>. The name of the corporation is James Michael Matthew Institute Inc. (the "Corporation").

ARTICLE II

Purposes. The Corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code. In accordance with the foregoing purposes, a purpose of the Corporation for which it is organized is to assist as a not for profit in workforce training in fields related to environment and climate change. In accordance with the charitable, religious, educational and scientific purposes of the not for profit Corporation, other purposes of the Corporation consist of not for profit assistance, activities and services in regard to hunger; homelessness; climate change; environment; not-for-profit nonacademic organizations that consist of museums, observatories, research laboratories, professional societies and similar organizations in the United States associated with educational or research activities; housing; health; workforce and workforce training, development and education; community and economic plans and development; communication, culture and media; food and nutrition; youth, families and children; energy; conservation; security; and related not for profit assistance, activities and services in regard to infrastructure, facilities, innovation, research, technologies, capacity building and consortia and coalitions in accordance with the foregoing not for profit purposes.

ARTICLE III

Manner in which Directors Are Elected. The directors of the Corporation are to be elected or appointed by the method stated in the Bylaws of the Corporation.

ARTICLE IV

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Initial Principal Office. The street address of the initial principal office of the Corporation is the following: 11342 NW 67th Terrace, Alachua, Florida 32615. The mailing

address of the Corporation is the following: 5200 NW 43rd Street, Suite 102-200, Gainesville, Florida 32606.

ARTICLE V

<u>Registered Agent Name and Address</u>. The name and Florida street address of the initial registered office and the initial registered agent of the Corporation are the following: James M. Matthew, 11342 NW 67th Terrace, Alachua, Florida 32615. The undersigned registered agent hereby accepts appointment as registered agent of the Corporation and hereby states that I am familiar with, and accept, the obligations of that position.

ARTICLE VI

Incorporator. The name and mailing address of the incorporator of the Corporation are the following: James M. Matthew, 11342 NW 67th Terrace, Alachua, Florida 32615.

ARTICLE VII

Limiting Provisions. No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, trustees, officers or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article II hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in, (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

ARTICLE VIII

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<u>Dissolution</u>. Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so $\frac{1}{2^{n+1}}$ disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction of the county in which the

principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE IX

Effective Date. The effective date of these Articles of Incorporation is August 1, 2023.
