ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

SHILOH COMMUNITY CHURCH, INC.

The undersigned pursuant to the applicable provisions of the Florida Not for Profit Act. hereby adopts the following articles of incorporation:

ARTICLE ONE

NAME

The name of this corporation shall be Shiloh Community Church, Inc. (the "Corporation")

ARTICLE TWO

ADDRESS OF PRINCIPAL OFFICE

The address of the principal office of the Corporation shall be 4574 Capital Drive. Lake Worth, FL 33463.

ARTICLE THREE

PURPOSES AND POWERS

This Corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious and educational purposes, within the meaning of 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or the corresponding provisions of any future federal tax code, hereinafter the "Code", in particular:

- 1. To receive and administer funds and to operate exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, literary or educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or comparable provisions of subsequent legislation (the "Code"). Among those purposes is:
- 2. To own property, including real property, tangible and intangible property, to be operated, invested and otherwise used for the benefit of or on behalf of the Shiloh Community Church, Inc;
- 3. To make distributions to or on behalf of the Shiloh Community Church, Inc. for its religious, charitable and educational purposes, determined from time to time by the directors of the corporation, in their sole and exclusive discretion:

4. To engage in any and all lawful activities to accomplish the foregoing purposes except as restricted herein.

ARTICLE FOUR

LIMITATIONS

The corporation shall be operated exclusively for charitable, educational and scientific purposes as a nonprofit corporation. No individual trustee or member of the corporation shall have any title to or interest in the corporate property or earnings in his or her individual or private capacity and no part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of any director, trustee, officer, member or any private shareholder or individual. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, nor shall the corporation participate in or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of (or in opposition to) any candidate for public office.

ARTICLE FIVE

Amendments to the articles of incorporation shall be adopted by a two-thirds (2/3's) majority affirmative vote of the board of directors, then in office, of Shiloh Community Church, Inc., at any regular meeting; or special meeting called for that purpose, in which a quorum is present.

ARTICLE ELEVEN

REGISTERED AGENT

ARTICLE THIRTEEN

DISSOLUTION

In the event of dissolution, the residual assets of the Corporation shall be turned over to one or more organizations which themselves sare exempt from federal income tax as organizations described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law, or to the federal, state, or local government for exclusively public purposes.
