The duration of the corporate existence shall be perpetual.

Purpose

The purpose of this corporation shall be:

Bylaws for Professional Charter Captains of Sarasota Inc.

These articles outline the structure, governance, and operational guidelines of our organization.

Article I:

Professional Charter Captains of Sarasota Inc.

The purpose of the association:

To promote the interests of charter captains, foster cooperation among members, advocate for the industry, and enhance for hire charter opportunities for the community. To collectively retain legal counsel who can provide protection against legislation that could harm the livelihood of charter captains.

Article II:

Membership:

U.S. coast guard 6 pack license

Registered L.L.C. Business State of Florida

Membership Dues:

Annual membership dues shall be established by the Board of Directors and are payable by all members.

\$200 Initial Membership Fee (first year)

Article III:

Board of Directors Composition:

The Board of Directors shall consist of elected members, including a Chairman, Viće, chairman, Communications Secretary, Treasurer, and additional directors as necessary.

Powers and Duties:

The Board shall oversee the affairs of the association, manage finances, plan events, and make decisions on based on a vote from the membership.

Elections:

Directors shall be elected by the membership for 1 Year and elections shall be conducted according to established procedures.

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Meetings Regular Meetings:

The association shall hold regular meetings for members at least once per quarter.

Special Meetings:

Special meetings may be called by the Chairman or upon written request of a specified number of members.

Bank Account Withdrawals:

Any withdrawal of funds from the association's bank account shall require the signatures of two authorized individuals.

A. Authorized Signatories:

Authorized signatories shall include the Chairman, Vice Chairman and Treasurer, and/or any other designated officer approved by the Board of Directors.

B. Dual Signature Requirement:

No single individual shall have the authority to withdraw funds independently; instead, two authorized individuals must jointly sign withdrawal requests.

C. Record Keeping:

Documentation of all withdrawals, including the purpose and amount, shall be maintained and made available for inspection by members.
