To hold funds solely and exclusively for the benefit of the Members for purposes set forth, in these Articles of Incorporation.

To promulgate and enforce rules, regulations, by-laws, covenants, restrictions, and agreements to effectuate the purposes for which the Association is organized.

To delegate power or powers where such is deemed in the interest of the Association.

To purchase, lease, hold, sell, mortgage, or otherwise acquire or dispose of, real or personal property, to enter into, make perform or carry out contracts of every kind with any person, firm, corporation, or association, to do any and all acts necessary or expedient for carrying on any and all of the activities and pursuing any and all of the objects and purposes set forth in the Articles of Incorporation and not forbidden by the law of the State of Florida.

Article IV. VOTING AND ASSESSMENTS

Subject to the restrictions and limitations hereinafter set forth, there shall be one (1) vote attributable to each Lot. When one or more persons holds such interest or interests in any Lot, or when ownership of a Lot, all such persons shall be Members, and the vote for such Lot shall be exercised as they among themselves determine, or as provided by applicable covenants or restrictions, but in no event shall more than one (1) vote be cast with respect to each one Lot. The termination of any such action, suit or proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, conviction, or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent shall not in itself create a presumption that any such Director or officer did not act in good faith in the reasonable belief that such action was in the best interests of the Association or that he had reasonable grounds for belief that such action was unlawful.

By or in the right of the Association to procure a judgment in its favor by reason of a member being or having been a Director or officer of the Association, or by reason of a member being or having been a Director, officer, employee, or agent of any other corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise which the member served at the request of the Association, against the reasonable expenses, including attorneys' fees, actually and necessarily incurred by the member in connection with the defense or settlement of such action, or in connection with an appeal therein, if such person acted in good faith in the reasonable belief that such action was in the best interests of the Association. The Board of Directors shall determine whether the amount for which a Director or officer seeks indemnification was properly incurred and whether such Director or officer acted in good faith and in a manner the member reasonably believed to be in the best interests of the Association, and whether there was reasonable ground for belief that such action was unlawful. No contract or transaction between the Association and one or more of its Directors or officers, or between the Association and any other corporation, pagenership, association or other organization in which one or more of its Directors or officers are Directors or officers, or have a financial interest, shall be invalid, void or voidable solely for this reason, or solely because the Director or officer is present at or participates in the meeting of the Board or committee thereof which authorized the contract or transaction, or solely because his or their votes are counted for such purpose. No Director or officer of the Association shall incur liability by reason of the fact thaphe is or may be interested in any such contract or transaction.

Interested Directors may be counted in determining the presence of a quorum at a meeting of the Board of Directors or of a committee which authorized the contract or transaction.

Article XII. DISSOLUTION OF THE ASSOCIATION

Upon dissolution of the Association, all of its assets remaining after provision for creditors and payment of all costs and expenses of such dissolution shall be distributed in the following manner:

Real property contributed to the Association without the receipt of other than nominal consideration by or on behalf of the Declarant (or its predecessor in interest) shall be returned to the contributor (whether or not the Declarant at the time of such dissolution), unless it refuses to accept the conveyance (in whole or in part).

Dedication to any applicable municipal or other governmental authority of any property determined by the Board of Directors of the Association to be appropriate for such dedication and which the authority is willing to accept.

Remaining assets shall be distributed among the Members, subject to the limitation set forth below, each Member's share of the assets to be determined by multiplying such remaining assets by a fraction the numerator of which is all amounts assessed by the Association since its organization against the Property which is owned by the Member at that time, and the denominator of which is the total amount (excluding penalties and interest) assessed by the Association against all properties which at the time of dissolution are part of the Property. The year of dissolution shall count as a whole year for purpose of the preceding fractions.

The Association may be dissolved upon a resolution to that effect being approved by two-thirds (2/3) of the Members of the Board of Directors, and, if such decree be necessary at the time of dissolution, after receipt of an appropriate decree as set forth in Section 617.0505, Florida Statutes, or statute of similar import. In the event of incorporation by annexation or otherwise of all or part of the Property by a political subdivision of the State of Florida, the Association may be dissolved in the manner set forth above.

Subject to the provisions of the Declaration applicable to the Property and to the extent permitted by law, the Association may participate in mergers and consolidations with other not-for-profit corporations organized for the same purposes, provided that any such merger or consolidation shall have the assent of two-thirds (2/3) of the total votes of the membership who are voting in person or by proxy at a meeting duly called for this purpose, written notice of which shall be mailed to all Members at least thirty (30) days in advance and shall set forth the purpose of the meeting.
