ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF CAREER CATALYST INSTITUTE, INC.

SECRETARY OF STATE

The undersigned incorporator signs and delivers these Articles of Incorporation in order to forms a corporation not for profit under the laws of the State of Florida.

ARTICLE I. NAME

The name of this corporation is Career Catalyst Institute, Inc.

ARTICLE II. PRINCIPAL OFFICE AND MAILING ADDRESS

The principal place of business and mailing address of the Corporation is 1830 North University Drive, #298, Plantation, FL 33322.

ARTICLE III. PURPOSES

- A. The corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, educational and cultural purposes under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code. The primary purpose of the corporation is to foster career growth and development by providing accessible training, mentorship, and resources. The purposes of the corporation shall, however, be limited in all events to exempt purposes described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 as amended. Furthermore, this corporation may engage in only activities permitted under the laws of the State of Florida and the United States of America as shall constitute activities in furtherance of such exempt purposes. In furtherance of its exempt purposes, the corporation may promote, establish, conduct and maintain activities on its behalf, and it may contribute to or otherwise assist other corporations, organizations and institutions carrying on exempt activities.
- B. As a means and incidental to accomplishing the purposes for which this corporation is being operated, it shall have the following powers:
 - 1. To solicit, accept, acquire, receive and hold by bequest, devise, grant, gift, purchase, exchange, lease, transfer, or otherwise, for any of its objects and purposes, any property, both real and personal, of whatever nature or description and wherever situated; and
 - 2. To sell, exchange, convey, mortgage, lease, transfer or otherwise dispose of any such property, both real and personal, as the objects and purposes of the corporation may require, subject to such limitations as may be prescribed by law; and
 - 3. To borrow money but only as authorized by its Board of Directors, and, from time to time, to make, accept, endorse, execute and issue bonds, debentures, promissory notes, bills of exchange and other obligations of the corporation for monies borrowed or in

payment for property acquired or for any of the other purposes of the corporation, and to secure the payment of any such obligations by mortgages, pledge, deed, indenture, agreement or other instrument of trust, or by other lien upon, assignment of, or agreement in regard to all or any part of the property, rights or privileges of the corporation, wherever situated; and

- 4. To invest or reinvest its funds in such stocks, bonds, debentures, mortgages or other investments or securities and property as its Board of Directors shall deem advisable, subject to the limitations and conditions contained in any bequest, devise, grant or gift; and
- 5. To maintain a margin account and conduct business in the margin account in the same fashion in which an individual may conduct business, including but not limited to buying on margin, selling short, buying and selling options, maintaining a special subscription account and dealing in commodities; and
- 6. To contract with for profit other not-for profit entities and individuals in order to accomplish its mission and goals; and
- 7. In general, to exercise such other powers which now are or which hereafter may be conferred by law upon a corporation organized for the purposes hereinabove set forth or necessary or incidental to the powers so conferred or conducive to the attainment of the purposes of the corporation, subject to such limitations as are or may be prescribed by law.
- C. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, this corporation may exercise only such powers as are in furtherance of the exempt purposes of organizations set forth in Section 501(C)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended and its Regulations as the same now exist, or as they may be hereafter amended from time to time.
- D. No part of the net earnings or principal of this corporation shall inure to the benefit of any member of the Board of Directors or any other individual except that this corporation may make payments of reasonable compensation for services rendered. The corporation shall never be operated for the primary purpose of carrying on a trade or business for profit.
- E. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office

ARTICLE IV. DIRECTORS
