**ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
FOR
HOLLYWOOD CIRC MASTER
ASSOCIATION, INC.**

The undersigned incorporator, for the purpose of forming a corporation not for profit pursuant to the laws of the State of Florida, hereby adopts the following Articles of Incorporation:

**ARTICLE 1
NAME**

The name of the corporation shall be **HOLLYWOOD CIRC MASTER ASSOCIATION, INC.** For convenience, the corporation shall be referred to in this instrument as the "Association" or the "Master Association", these Articles of Incorporation as the "Articles", and the By-Laws of the Master Association as the "By-Laws".

**ARTICLE 2
OFFICE**

The principal office and mailing address of the Master Association shall be at 1776 Polk Street, Suite 200, Hollywood, Florida 33020, or at such other place as may be subsequently designated by the Board of Directors. All books and records of the Master Association shall be kept at its principal office or at such other place as may be permitted by the Act.

**ARTICLE 3
PURPOSE**

The objects and purposes of the Master Association are those objects and purposes as are authorized by the **Master Declaration of Covenants, Restrictions and Easements for Hollywood Circ**, recorded (or to be recorded) in the Public Records of Broward County Florida, as hereafter amended and/or supplemented from time to time (the "Declaration" or "Master Covenants"). All of the definitions set forth in the Master Covenants are hereby incorporated herein by this reference. The further objects and purposes of the Master Association are to preserve the values and amenities in The Properties and to maintain the Common Areas thereof as well as the Shared Infrastructure and Master Association Maintenance Areas for the benefit of the Owners who become Members of the Master Association.

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ARTICLE 4 DEFINITIONS

The terms used in these Articles shall have the same definitions and meanings as those set forth in the Master Covenants, unless herein provided to the contrary, or unless the context otherwise requires.

ARTICLE 5 POWERS

The powers of the Master Association shall include and be governed by the following:

5.1 General. The Master Association shall have all of the common-law and statutory powers of a corporation not for profit under the Laws of Florida, except as expressly limited or restricted by applicable law, the terms of these Articles, the Master Covenants or the By-Laws.

5.2 Enumeration. In addition to the powers set forth in Section 5.1 above, the Master Association shall have all of the powers and duties set forth in Chapter 617, Florida Statutes and Chapter 720, Florida Statutes, except as limited by these Articles, the By-Laws and the Master Covenants (to the extent that they are not in conflict with applicable laws), all of the powers and duties set forth in the Master Covenants and all of the powers and duties reasonably necessary to operate the Master Association and The Properties pursuant to the Master Covenants and as more particularly described in the By-Laws, as they may be amended from time to time, including, but not limited to, the following:

(a) To make and collect Assessments and other charges against members as Owners (whether or not such sums are due and payable to the Master Association), and to use the proceeds thereof in the exercise of its powers and duties.

(b) To buy, accept, own, operate, lease, sell, trade and mortgage both real and personal property in accordance with the provisions of the Master Covenants.

(c) To maintain, repair, replace, reconstruct, add to and operate the Common Areas, Shared Infrastructure and other property acquired or leased by the Master Association, in accordance with the provisions of the Master Covenants.

(d) To purchase insurance upon the Common Areas and Shared Infrastructure and insurance for the protection of the Master Association, its officers, directors and Owners.

(e) To make and amend reasonable rules and regulations for the maintenance, conservation and use of The Properties and for the health, comfort, safety and welfare of the Owners.

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(f) To approve or disapprove the leasing, transfer, ownership and possession of Units as may be provided by the Master Covenants.

(g) To enforce by legal means the provisions of the Master Covenants, these Articles, the By-Laws, the rules and regulations for the use of the Common Areas and applicable law.

(h) To contract for the management and maintenance of the Common Areas and/or Shared Infrastructure and to authorize a management agent (which may be an affiliate of the Declarant) to assist the Master Association in carrying out its powers and duties by performing such functions as the submission of proposals, collection of Assessments, preparation of records, enforcement of rules and maintenance, repair and replacement of the Common Areas and/or Shared Infrastructure with such funds as shall be made available by the Master Association for such purposes. The Master Association and its officers shall, however, retain at all times the powers and duties to make Assessments, promulgate rules and execute contracts on behalf of the Master Association.

(i) To employ personnel to perform the services required for the proper operation of the Common Areas and/or Shared Infrastructure.

(j) To (i) operate and maintain the surface water management system in accordance with the permit issued by the South Florida Water Management District (the "District" or "SFWMD"), (ii) carry out, maintain, and monitor any required wetland mitigation tasks and (iii) maintain copies of all permitting actions with regard to the SFWMD.

(k) To assume all of Declarant's and its affiliates' responsibilities to the State of Florida, the County, the City, and its and their governmental and quasi-governmental subdivisions and similar entities of any kind with respect to the Common Areas (including, without limitation, any and all obligations imposed by any permits or approvals issued by the State, County and/or City, as same may be amended, modified or interpreted from time to time) and indemnify and hold Declarant and its affiliates harmless with respect thereto in the event of the Master Association's failure to fulfill those responsibilities.

(l) To execute all documents or consents, on behalf of all Owners (and their mortgagees), required by all governmental and/or quasi-governmental agencies in connection with land use and development matters (including, without limitation, plats, waivers of plat, unities of title, covenants in lieu thereof, etc.), and in that regard, each Owner, by acceptance of the deed to such Owner's Unit, and each mortgagee of a Unit Owner by acceptance of a lien on said Unit, appoints and designates the President of the Master Association as such Owner's and mortgagee's agent and attorney-in-fact to execute any and all such documents or consents.

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5.3 Master Association Property. All funds and the title to all properties acquired by the Master Association and their proceeds shall be held for the benefit and use of the members in accordance with the provisions of the Master Covenants, these Articles and the By-Laws.

5.4 Distribution of Income; Dissolution. The Master Association shall not pay a dividend to its members and shall make no distribution of income to its members, directors or officers, and upon dissolution, all assets of the Master Association shall be transferred only to another non-profit corporation or a public agency or as otherwise authorized by the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act (Chapter 617, Florida Statutes).

5.5 Limitation. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Master Covenants, the By-Laws or these Articles to the contrary before commencing litigation against any party in the name of the Master Association involving amounts in controversy in excess of One Hundred Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$100,000.00), the Master Association must obtain the affirmative approval of a majority of the voting interests at a meeting of the membership at which a quorum has been attained. The powers of the Master Association shall be subject to and shall be exercised in accordance with the provisions hereof and of the Master Covenants, the By-Laws and applicable law, provided that in the event of conflict, the provisions of applicable law shall control over those of the Master Covenants and By-Laws.

ARTICLE 6 MEMBERS

6.1 Membership. The members of the Master Association shall consist of the Declarant and all persons or entities who are, from time to time, record Owners of a fee interest in any Parcel, provided, however, that as to any Submitted Parcel, each Unit Owner shall be deemed to be the Member of the Master Association. Notwithstanding anything else to the contrary, any such person or entity who holds such interest merely as security for the performance of an obligation shall not be a Member of the Master Association.

6.2 Assignment. The share of a member in the funds and assets of the Master Association cannot be assigned, hypothecated or transferred in any manner except as an appurtenance to the Parcel for which that share is held.

6.3 Voting. The Master Association shall have two (2) classes of voting membership:

Class A Members shall be all those Owners (including Condominium Unit Owners), as defined in Section 6.1, with the exception of the "Declarant" (as long as the Class B Membership shall exist, and thereafter, the Declarant shall be a Class A Member to the extent it would otherwise qualify). Each Parcel shall have the following number of votes on all Master Association matters:

Hotel Parcel - One Hundred (100) votes.

Condo Parcel -	One Hundred (100) votes.
Grocery Parcel -	One Hundred (100) votes.
Retail Parcel -	Five (5) votes.
Office Parcel -	Five (5) votes

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To the extent that additional Parcels are added to The Properties, any additional Residential Parcel shall be entitled to 100 votes and any additional Commercial Parcel shall be entitled to 5 votes, unless a different allocation of votes is established in the Supplemental Declaration adding the Parcel to The Properties.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, Class A Members who are governed by a Parcel Specific Declaration (e.g., a Parcel submitted to the condominium form of ownership) shall only vote through a Voting Member and said Class A Members shall be entitled to elect from among themselves, respectively, one Voting Member for each such Parcel, each such Voting Member to have and cast the number of votes equal to the aggregate of the votes entitled to be cast by the Owners within the applicable Parcel.

As to any Condominium Submitted Parcel, the first election of such Voting Member for a particular Parcel shall be conducted at or immediately following the meeting at which control of such Parcel Specific Manager is turned over to its members other than the developer/declarant (i.e., at which the non-developer/declarant members elect a majority of the board of directors) and prior to such time, the Voting Member for the members within the Parcel shall be the developer of the community governed by the Parcel Specific Declaration. At such time, and at all times thereafter, the Parcel Specific Manager shall elect its Voting Member in the same manner as it elects its board of directors, subject to the same rules as those applicable to its directors as to the term of office, removal, replacement and other matters. In the event that the members of a Parcel Specific Manager of a Condominium Submitted Parcel do not elect a Voting Member, the President of such Parcel Specific Manager shall perform the duties of the Voting Member.

Class B Member. The Class B Voting Member shall be the Declarant, or a representative thereof, who shall have and cast one (1) vote in all Master Association matters, plus two (2) votes for each vote which may be cast, in the aggregate, by the Class A Members and/or Voting Members. Such Class B Voting Member may be removed and replaced by the Declarant in its sole discretion. The Class B Membership shall cease and terminate at such time as the Declarant elects, but in no event later than the time period set forth in Section 6.6 below.

All votes shall be exercised or cast in the manner provided by the Master Covenants and By-Laws.

6.4 Meetings. The By-Laws shall provide for an annual meeting of Members, and may make provision for regular and special meetings of Members other than the annual meeting.

6.5 General Matters. When reference is made herein, or in the Master Covenants, By-Laws or otherwise, to a majority or specific percentage of Members or Voting Members, such reference shall be deemed to be reference to a majority or specific percentage of the votes of the Members eligible to be cast by their respective Voting Members present at a duly constituted meeting thereof (i.e., one for which proper notice has been given and at which quorum exists) and not of the Members themselves (or their Parcels) or of the individual Voting Members themselves.

6.6 Turnover. Unless the Class B Voting Member elects to terminate the Class B Membership sooner, the Class B Membership shall cease and terminate three (3) months after ninety (90%) percent of the aggregate of the Units (which are part of any Submitted Parcels) and Parcels (which are not a Submitted Parcel) that will be operated ultimately by the Master Association have been conveyed to purchasers (other than purchasers who are builders, contractors, or others who purchase a Parcel for the purpose of constructing improvements thereon for resale). The Declarant is entitled (but not obligated) to designate at least one (1) member of the Board of Directors as long as the Declarant holds for sale in the ordinary course of business five percent (5%) of the Units (as to Condominium Submitted Parcels) and Parcels that will be operated ultimately by the Master Association.

The Declarant may transfer control of the Master Association to Unit Owners other than the Declarant ("Turnover") prior to such dates in its sole discretion by causing enough of its appointed Directors to resign, whereupon it shall be the affirmative obligation of Unit Owners other than the Declarant to elect Directors and assume control of the Master Association. Provided at least thirty (30) days' notice of Declarant's decision to cause its appointees to resign is given to Unit Owners, neither the Declarant, nor such appointees, shall be liable in any manner in connection with such resignations even if the Unit Owners other than the Declarant refuse or fail to assume control.

ARTICLE 8 TERM OF EXISTENCE

The Master Association shall have perpetual existence. In the event that the Master Association is dissolved, and to the extent that responsibility for the surface water management system is the responsibility of the Master Association, then the property consisting of the surface water management system and the right of access to the portions of the Condominium Property containing the surface water management system shall be conveyed to an appropriate agency of local government. If it is not accepted, then the surface water management system must be dedicated to a similar non-profit corporation. Further, in the event of any dissolution of the Association, any Owner may petition the circuit court for the appointment of a receiver to manage the affairs of the Association.

ARTICLE 9 OFFICERS

The affairs of the Master Association shall be administered by the officers holding the offices designated in the By-Laws. The officers shall be elected by the Board of Directors of the Master Association at its first meeting following the annual meeting of the Members of the Master Association and shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Directors. The By-Laws may provide for the removal from office of officers, for filling vacancies and for the duties and qualifications of the officers. The names and addresses of the officers who shall serve until their successors are designated by the Board of Directors are as follows:

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ARTICLE 10 DIRECTORS

10.1 Number and Qualification. The property, business and affairs of the Master Association shall be managed by a Board of Directors, which shall consist of three (3) persons appointed by the Declarant for so long as the Class B Membership exists. At such time as the Class B Membership expires, the Board shall consist of five (5) persons. A majority of the directors in office shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Directors need not be Members of the Master Association.

10.2 Duties and Powers. All of the duties and powers of the Master Association existing under the Act, the Master Covenants, these Articles and the By-Laws shall be exercised exclusively by the Board of Directors, its agents, contractors or employees, subject only to approval by Unit Owners through their Voting Members when such approval is specifically required.

10.3 Appointment/Election of Members of Board of Directors. From and after the turnover of control of the Master Association to Members other than the Declarant, The Board shall consist of seven (7) Directors, such Directors to be elected or designated as follows at the annual meeting of the Members in the manner described below and subject to the qualifications set forth in the By-Laws. Directors may be removed and vacancies on the Board of Directors shall be filled in the manner provided by the By-Laws.

(a) Two (2) Directors for the Condo Parcel shall be elected or designated by the Parcel Specific Manager for the Condo Parcel

(b) One (1) Director for the Hotel Parcel shall be elected or designated by the Hotel Parcel Owner.

(c) One (1) Director for the Grocery Parcel shall be elected or designated by the Grocery Parcel Owner.

(d) One (1) Director for the Retail Parcel shall be elected or designated by the Retail Parcel Owner.

(e) One (1) Director for the Office Parcel shall be elected or designated by the Office Parcel Owner.

(f) One (1) Director shall be elected at large, annually, by the plurality vote attributable to all Parcels, at the annual meeting of the Master Association or otherwise at a duly called meeting for such purpose.

A Voting Member as aforesaid may also serve as a Director.

10.4 Term of Declarant's Directors. The Declarant shall appoint the Members of the first Board of Directors and their replacements who shall hold office for the periods described in the By-Laws.

10.5 First Directors. The names and addresses of the Members of the first Board of Directors who shall hold office until their successors are elected and have taken office, as provided in the By-Laws, are as follows:

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ARTICLE 11

11.1 Standards. A Director shall discharge his duties as a director, including any duties as a Member of a Committee: In good faith; with the care an ordinary prudent person in a like position would exercise under similar circumstances; and in a manner reasonably believed to be in the best interests of the Master Association. Unless a Director has knowledge concerning a matter in question that makes reliance unwarranted, a Director, in discharging his duties, may rely on information, opinions, reports or statements, including financial statements and other data, if prepared or presented by: one or more officers or employees of the Master Association whom the Director reasonably believes to be reasonable and competent in the manners presented; legal counsel, public accountants or other persons as to matters the Director reasonably believes are within the persons' professional or expert competence; or a Committee of which the Director is not a Member if the Director reasonably believes the Committee merits confidence. A Director is not liable for any action taken as a director, or any failure to take action, if he performed the duties of his office in compliance with the foregoing standards.

ARTICLE 12

INDEMNIFICATION PROVISIONS

12.1 Indemnitees. The Master Association shall indemnify any person who was or is a party to any proceeding (other than an action by, or in the right of, the Master Association) by reason of the fact that he is or was a director, officer, employee or agent (each, an "indemnatee") of the Master Association, against liability incurred in connection with such proceeding, including

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any appeal thereof, if he acted in good faith and in a manner he reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the Master Association and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe his conduct was unlawful. The termination of any proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, or conviction or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent shall not, of itself, create a presumption that the person did not act in good faith and in a manner which he reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the Master Association or, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had reasonable cause to believe that his conduct was unlawful.

12.2 Indemnification. The Master Association shall indemnify any person, who was or is a party to any proceeding by or in the right of the Master Association to procure a judgment in its favor by reason of the fact that he is or was a director, officer, employee, or agent of the Master Association against expenses and amounts paid in settlement not exceeding, in the judgment of the board of directors, the estimated expense of litigating the proceeding to conclusion, actually and reasonably incurred in connection with the defense or settlement of such proceeding, including any appeal thereof. Such indemnification shall be authorized if such person acted in good faith and in a manner he reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the Master Association, except that no indemnification shall be made under this subsection in respect of any claim, issue, or matter as to which such person shall have been adjudged to be liable unless, and only to the extent that, the court in which such proceeding was brought, or any other court of competent jurisdiction, shall determine upon application that, despite the adjudication of liability but in view of all circumstances of the case, such person is fairly and reasonably entitled to indemnity for such expenses which such court shall deem proper.

12.3 Indemnification for Expenses. To the extent that a director, officer, employee, or agent of the Master Association has been successful on the merits or otherwise in defense of any proceeding referred to in subsection 12.1 or 12.2, or in defense of any claim, issue, or matter therein, he shall be indemnified against expenses actually and reasonably incurred by him in connection therewith.

12.4 Determination of Applicability. Any indemnification under subsection 12.1 or subsection 12.2, unless pursuant to a determination by a court, shall be made by the Master Association only as authorized in the specific case upon a determination that indemnification of the director, officer, employee, or agent is proper under the circumstances because he has met the applicable standard of conduct set forth in subsection 12.1 or subsection 12.2. Such determination shall be made:

(a) By the board of directors by a majority vote of a quorum consisting of directors who were not parties to such proceeding;

(b) If such a quorum is not obtainable or, even if obtainable, by majority vote of a Committee duly designated by the Board of Directors (in which directors who are

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parties may participate) consisting solely of two or more Directors not at the time parties to the proceeding;

(c) By independent legal counsel:

(i) selected by the Board of Directors prescribed in paragraph (a) or the committee prescribed in paragraph (b); or

(ii) if a quorum of the Directors cannot be obtained for paragraph (a) and the Committee cannot be designated under paragraph (b), selected by majority vote of the full Board of Directors (in which Directors who are parties may participate); or

(d) By a majority of the voting interests of the Members of the Master Association who were not parties to such proceeding.

12.5 Determination Regarding Expenses. Evaluation of the reasonableness of expenses and authorization of indemnification shall be made in the same manner as the determination that indemnification is permissible. However, if the determination of permissibility is made by independent legal counsel, persons specified by paragraph 10.5 shall evaluate the reasonableness of expenses and may authorize indemnification.

12.6 Advancing Expenses. Expenses incurred by an officer or director in defending a civil or criminal proceeding may be paid by the Master Association in advance of the final disposition of such proceeding upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of such director or officer to repay such amount if he is ultimately found not to be entitled to indemnification by the Master Association pursuant to this section. Expenses incurred by other employees and agents may be paid in advance upon such terms or conditions that the Board of Directors deems appropriate.

12.7 Exclusivity; Exclusions. The indemnification and advancement of expenses provided pursuant to this section are not exclusive, and the Master Association may make any other or further indemnification or advancement of expenses of any of its directors, officers, employees, or agents, under any bylaw, agreement, vote of shareholders or disinterested directors, or otherwise, both as to action in his official capacity and as to action in another capacity while holding such office. However, indemnification or advancement of expenses shall not be made to or on behalf of any director, officer, employee, or agent if a judgment or other final adjudication establishes that his actions, or omissions to act, were material to the cause of action so adjudicated and constitute:

(a) A violation of the criminal law, unless the director, officer, employee, or agent had reasonable cause to believe his conduct was lawful or had no reasonable cause to believe his conduct was unlawful;

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(b) A transaction from which the director, officer, employee, or agent derived an improper personal benefit; or

(c) Willful misconduct or a conscious disregard for the best interests of the Master Association in a proceeding by or in the right of the Master Association to procure a judgment in its favor or in a proceeding by or in the right of the Members of the Master Association.

12.8 Continuing Effect. Indemnification and advancement of expenses as provided in this section shall continue as, unless otherwise provided when authorized or ratified, to a person who has ceased to be a director, officer, employee, or agent and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors, and administrators of such a person, unless otherwise provided when authorized or ratified.

12.9 Application to Court. Notwithstanding the failure of the Master Association to provide indemnification, and despite any contrary determination of the Board or of the Members in the specific case, a director, officer, employee, or agent of the Master Association who is or was a party to a proceeding may apply for indemnification or advancement of expenses, or both, to the court conducting the proceeding, to the circuit court, or to another court of competent jurisdiction. On receipt of an application, the court, after giving any notice that it considers necessary, may order indemnification and advancement of expenses, including expenses incurred in seeking court-ordered indemnification or advancement of expenses, if it determines that:

(a) The director, officer, employee, or agent is entitled to mandatory indemnification under subsection 12.3 in which case the court shall also order the Master Association to pay the director reasonable expenses incurred in obtaining court-ordered indemnification or advancement of expenses;

(b) The director, officer, employee, or agent is entitled to indemnification or advancement of expenses, or both, by virtue of the exercise by the Master Association of its power pursuant to subsection 12.7; or

(c) The director, officer, employee, or agent is fairly and reasonably entitled to indemnification or advancement of expenses, or both, in view of all the relevant circumstances, regardless of whether such person met the standard of conduct set forth in subsection 12.1, subsection 12.2, or subsection 12.7, unless (a) a court of competent jurisdiction determines, after all available appeals have been exhausted or not pursued by the proposed indemnitee, that he did not act in good faith or acted in a manner he reasonably believed to be not in, or opposed to, the best interest of the Master Association, and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, that he had reasonable cause to believe his conduct was unlawful, and (b) such court further specifically determines that indemnification should be denied. The termination of any proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, conviction or upon a plea of nolo contendere

or its equivalent shall not, of itself, create a presumption that the person did not act in good faith or did act in a manner which he reasonably believed to be not in, or opposed to, the best interest of the Master Association, and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, that he had reasonable cause to believe that his conduct was unlawful.

12.10 Definitions. For purposes of this Article 12, the term "expenses" shall be deemed to include attorneys' fees, including those for any appeals; the term "liability" shall be deemed to include obligations to pay a judgment, settlement, penalty, fine, and expenses actually and reasonably incurred with respect to a proceeding; the term "proceeding" shall be deemed to include any threatened, pending, or completed action, suit, or other type of proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative, and whether formal or informal; and the term "agent" shall be deemed to include a volunteer; the term "serving at the request of the Master Association" shall be deemed to include any service as a director, officer, employee or agent of the Master Association that imposes duties on such persons.

12.11 Amendment. Anything to the contrary herein notwithstanding, no amendment to the provisions of this Article 12 shall be applicable as to any party eligible for indemnification hereunder who has not given his prior written consent to such amendment.

ARTICLE 13 BY-LAWS

The first By-Laws of the Master Association shall be adopted by the Board of Directors and may be altered, amended or rescinded in the manner provided in the By-Laws and the Master Covenants.

ARTICLE 14 AMENDMENTS

Amendments to these Articles shall be proposed and adopted in the following manner:

14.1 Notice. Notice of a proposed amendment shall be included in the notice of any meeting at which the proposed amendment is to be considered and shall be otherwise given in the time and manner provided in Chapter 617, Florida Statutes. Such notice shall contain the proposed amendment or a summary of the changes to be affected thereby.

14.2 Adoption. Amendments shall be proposed and adopted in the manner provided in Chapter 617, Florida Statutes and in the Act (the latter to control over the former to the extent provided for in the Act).

14.3 Declarant Amendments. Notwithstanding anything herein contained to the contrary, to the extent lawful, the Declarant may amend these Articles consistent with the

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provisions of the Master Covenants allowing certain amendments to be effected by the Declarant alone.

14.4 Recording. A copy of each amendment shall be filed with the Secretary of State pursuant to the provisions of applicable Florida law, and a copy certified by the Secretary of State shall be recorded in the public records of Broward County, Florida with an identification on the first page thereof of the book and page of said public records where the Master Covenants were recorded which contains, as an exhibit, the initial recording of these Articles.
