ARTICLES OF DISSOLUTION

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Members of the Corporation, by majority consent, agree to the dissolution of the Corporation, all as set forth above.

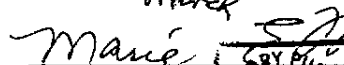
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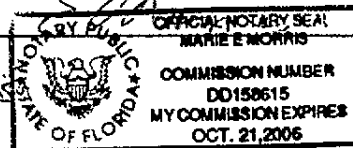
