ARTICLE III

PURPOSE

The purposes for which the corporation is organized are as follows:

- A. To promote the historic preservation of and to maintain the historic character of downtown Perry for the education and enjoyment of all residents of and visitors to Perry.
- B. To make available educational programs and activities to all residents of Perry in an effort to promote the history, culture and architecture of downtown Perry;
- C. To take remedial action to eliminate the physical, economic and social causes of deterioration of downtown Perry.
- D. To lessen the burdens of government by researching common community problems, generating restoration and renovation projects and assisting in economic activities which protect the public's investment in infrastructure.
- E. To aid; work with and participate in the activities of other organizations, individuals and public and private entities located within and outside Perry engaged in similar.
- F. To acquire, own, purchase, lease, dispose of and deal with real and personal property and interests, either absolutely or in trust therein and to apply gifts, grants, bequests, and devises and the proceeds thereof in furtherance of the purposes of the corporation. I
- G. To expand opportunities available to said residents and groups to obtain adequate medium and low-cost housing accommodations by constructing, rehabilitating, and providing decent, safe and sanitary housing in Taylor County for persons and families of medium and low income who otherwise would not be able to find or afford a suitable place to live. It is the purpose of the corporation thereby to relieve the poor, distressed, underprivileged and indigent by enabling them to secure the basic human needs of decent shelter and to thus lessen the burdens of government and promote the social welfare. To provide such housing through rehabilitation of existing substandard buildings and construction of new facilities for the purpose of combating the deterioration of the community and contributing to its physical improvement.
- H. To do such things and to perform such acts to accomplish its purposes as the Board of Trustees may determine to be appropriate and as are not forbidden by Section 501(c) (3) of the Code, with all the power conferred on nonprofit corporations under the laws of the State of Florida.
