AMENDED Article of Incorporation – African People's Education & Defense Fund, Inc.

Article III. Purposes

Section 1. General Purposes: Said corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, educational, and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

The assets and property of this corporation are irrevocably dedicated to charitable and educational purposes meeting the requirements for exemption provided by Section 214 of the California Revenue and Taxation Code, and other similar requirements of other revenue and taxation codes of other states, and as otherwise required under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Section 2. Special purposes: This corporation, pursuant to these purposes, is organized and operated anywhere without limitations to the territory of the United States for:

1. Advancement of education or science.
2. Defense of human and civil rights secured by law.
3. Relief of the poor, the distressed, or the underprivileged.
4. Combat of community deterioration and juvenile delinquency.
5. Other purposes tax-exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Section 3. Restrictions: This corporation is incorporated as a separate fund of the J.W. Foundation, a charitable trust, organized and operated for such purposes as described herein, and contributions made to it will be deductible as provided under Section 170 of the Internal Revenue Code.

This corporation shall organize and operate exclusively as a public charity with sufficient broad-based public support to avoid being described as a private foundation as defined in Section 509 of the Internal Revenue Code.

No part of the net income or assets of this corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or any other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in this Article.

No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provisions of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities

not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Upon dissolution of this corporation, its assets remaining after payment, or provision of payment, of all debts and liabilities of this corporation, shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation, or corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes meeting the requirements for exemption provided by Section 214 of the California Revenue and Taxation Code, and other similar requirements of other revenue and taxation codes of other states, and which has established its tax exempt status under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
