Amended ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF

AFFORDABLE HOME OWNERSHIP CORPORATION A NON-PROFIT CORPORATION

These Articles of Incorporation are signed and acknowledged by the non-profit corporation under the

provisions of the Florida Non-Profit Corporation Act as follows:

ARTICLE I

Name: The name of the proposed corporation is Affordable Home

Ownership Corporation.

ARTICLE II

Duration: The duration of the corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE III

The location of the corporation is the City of Jacksonville,
County of Duval, and State of Florida. The address of the
registered office is 11510 Laguna Court, Jacksonville, Florida
32218. The name of the registered agent at said address is
R.L. Smith. Principal office of corporation is the same as
Registered Agent. Telephone (904) 332222


ARTICLE IV

<u>Purpose</u>: The corporation is organized as a non-profit corporation for the following purposes:

(A) The specific and primary purposes are:

Offices:

- (1) To raise the economic, educational and social levels of the underprivileged residents of Lake City (Columbia County), Florida, and its trade area, who are substantially underemployed and have low income, by fostering and promoting community-wide interest and concern for the problems of such residents, and to that end;
 - (a) Racial tension, prejudice, and discrimination of economic and otherwise may be eliminated;
 - (b) Sickness, poverty and crime may be lessened and;
 - (c) Educational and economic opportunities may be expanded among the residents of Lake City (Columbia County), Florida, and its trace area.



ARTICLE IV (continued)

- (2) To expand the opportunities available to said residents to own, manage, and operate business enterprises in economically underprivileged or depressed areas; to assist said residents and groups in developing management skills necessary for the successful operation of business enterprises; to provide financial support for the successful operation of business enterprises by said residents and to assist said residents in obtaining such financial support from other sources.
- (3) To aid, support and assist by gifts, contributions or otherwise, other corporations, community chests, funds and foundations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, religious, scientific, literary or educational purposes, no part of the net earnings of which inures to the benefit of any private shareholders or individual, and no substantial part of the activities of which is carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation.
- (4) To do any and all lawful activities which may be necessary, useful or desirable for the furtherance, accomplishment, fostering or attainment of the foregoing purposes, either directly or indirectly, and either along or in conjunction or cooperation with others, whether such others be persons or organizations of any kind or nature such as corporations, firms, associations, trust, institutions, foundations, or governmental bureaus, departments or agencies.
- (B) In furtherance, but not in limitation, of the foregoing charitable and educational purposes, the corporation shall have the following powers:
 - (1) To solicit, collect, and receive money and other assets, and to administer funds and contributions received by grant, gift, deed bequest or device and otherwise to acquire money, securities, property, rights and services of every kind and description, and to hold, invest, expand, contribute, use, sell or otherwise dispose of any money, securities, property,

rights or services so acquired for the purpose above mentioned:

- (2) To borrow money and to make, accept, endorse, execute and issue bonds, debentures, promissory notes, and other corporate obligations, for monies borrowed, or in payment for property acquired or for any of the purposes of the corporation, and to secure payment of any such obligation by mortgage, ledge, deed, indenture, agreement or other instrument of trust, or by other lien upon, assignment of or agreement in regard to all or any part of the property, rights or privileges of the corporation;
- (3) To invest and reinvest its funds in such mortgages, bonds, notes, debentures, shares of preferred and common stock, and any other securities of any kind whatsoever, and property, real, personal or mixed, tangible or intangible, all as the corporation's board of directors shall deem advisable, and as may be permitted by law;
- (4) To provide advice, support, credit, funds, capital, gifts and all other lawful forms of assistance, financial and otherwise, to or for use in business enterprises owned, or destined to be owned, by said residents and groups.
- (5) To furnish management, administrative and other business advice, support, training and technical assistance to said residents and groups in order to enable them to develop necessary skills to successfully operate business ventures.
- (6) To encourage and voluntarily assist said residents and groups to organize, create, acquire, obtain financing for, own, manage and operate business enterprises.
- (7) To obtain information and conduct research, studies and analysis of the problems of said community, and prepare and publish reports as to any and all matters that may be of use in furthering the expansion of residents and groups, as to markets, products, services, skills, sources of financing and any and all other matters.

· ARTICLE IV (continued)

- (8) To conduct educational and other efforts to eliminate prejudice and discrimination in the business and financial communities and to foster the establishment of sound and constructive relationships between the business and financial communities and said residents and groups seeking opportunities to business.
- (9) To aid, support and assist by gifts, contributions, loans, investments and other lawful forms of assistance, other persons or organizations seeking to expand the opportunities for business ownership by said residents and groups in organizing, creating, acquiring, obtaining financing for, owning, managing and operating business enterprises.
- (10) To conduct educational activities designed to provide counseling, instruction or training of said residents and groups for the purpose of improving or training of said residents and groups for the purpose of improving or developing their capabilities, language and job skills, and the instruction of the public on subjects useful to said residents and groups, and beneficial to the community as a whole, and "production of affordable housing."
- (11) To engage in housing construction and related activities in order to improve the living conditions of said residents.
- (11B) To acquire, construct, provide, and operate rental housing and related facilities suited to the special needs and living requirements of eligible occupants, without regard to age, race, color, religion, sex, marital status, physical or mental handicap (must possess capacity to enter into a legal contract) or national origin;

To acquire, construct, provide and/or operate other housing including self-help housing, to fulfill the needs of very low, low and moderate income persons within the state, without regard to age, race, color, religion, sex, marital status, physical or mental handicap (must possess capacity to enter into a legal contract) or national origin;

ARTICLE IV (continued)

To acquire, improve, and operate any real or personal property or interest or right herein or appurtenant thereto;

To sell, convey, assign, mortgage, lease any real and personal property;

To borrow money and to execute such evidence of indebtedness and such contracts, agreements, and instruments as may be necessary, and to execute and deliver any mortgage, deed of trust, assignment of income, or other security instrument in connection therewith; and to do all things necessary and appropriate for carrying out and exercising the foregoing purposes and powers.

- (12) To engage in the activity of operating business ventures for the purpose of providing job training, employment, and managerial development opportunities to said residents for the charitable purpose of furthering the economic development of the community, and the "production of affordable housing."
- (13) To engage in any and all other activities which will directly or indirectly improve the welfare and economic conditions of said residents and groups; and
- (14) To exercise all other rights and powers conferred upon corporations formed under the General Non-profit Corporation Law of the State of Florida., provided, however, that the company shall not engage in any activities or exercise any powers, including those specifically mentioned herein, that are not in furtherance of the specific and primary charitable, and educational purposes of the corporation.
- (C) All of the foregoing purposes and powers shall be exercised exclusively for charitable and educational purposes in such manner that the company shall qualify as an exempt organization under section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954.

ARTICLE V

Qualification of Members. Any person eighteen (18) years of age or older who resides, or who is employed or who does business in Lake City (Columbia County) Florida, and its trade area, is eligible for membership in this corporation.

The corporation requests a \$25.00 a year membership fee from those who can afford to pay it, but the \$25.00 membership fee is not a criteria for membership. The conditions and regulations of membership shall be determined and fixed in the corporation's by-laws.

ARTICLE VI

No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in, any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provisions of these Articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from federal and state income taxes under section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954.

ARTICLE VIII (continued)

The officers of the corporation shall be elected by the board of directors of the corporation and each officer must be a member in good standing.

ARTICLE IX

<u>Board of Directors</u>: The board of directors' election or appointment shall be contained in the corporation's by-laws. The names and addresses of the initial directors until the first meeting of the corporation are:

The number of directors may be fixed or changed from time to time by amendment of the By-laws of this corporation adopted by the vote of the members of the corporation entitled to vote at a meeting of members of the corporation called pursuant to the By-laws, but in no event shall the number of directors be less than five (5).

ARTICLE X

The By-laws may be amended at a special call meeting of the membership for that purpose as outlined in the By-laws.

ARTICLE XI

The corporation is formed solely for charitable and educational purposes. The corporation is not organized, nor shall it be operated for the primary purpose of generating pecuniary gain of profit, and it will not distribute any gain, profit, or dividends to the members thereof, or to any individual, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of its specific and primary purposes. The property, assets, profit, and net income of the corporation are irrevocably dedicated to charitable, educational and scientific purposes, and no part of the profit or net income of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of any director, officer, or member thereof or to the benefit of any individual.

ARTICLE XII

Upon winding up and dissolution of the corporation, the assets of the corporation remaining after payment of, or provision for payment of, all debts and liabilities of the corporation shall be distributed to an organization and used exclusively to accomplish the general purposes for which this corporation is organized. If the corporation holds any assets in trust, such assets shall be disposed of in such manner as may be directed by decree of the appropriate Court of Duval County, in which the corporation's principal office is located, upon petition thereof by the Attorney General or by any person concerned in the liquidation.

ARTICLE XIII

In the event that this corporation shall become a "private foundation" within the meaning of section 509 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, the corporation shall distribute its income for each taxable year at such time and in such manner as not to subject it to tax under section 4942 of the Internal Revenue Code; shall not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in section 494(d) of the Internal Revenue Code; shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in section 4943(c) of the Internal Revenue Code; shall not make any investment in such manner as to subject it to tax under section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code; and shall not make any taxable expenditures as defined in the section 4943(d) of the Internal Revenue Code.

ARTICLE XIV

Any person (and the heirs, executors and administrators of such person) made or threatened to be made a party to any action, suit or proceeding by reason of the fact that he is or was a director or officer of the corporation shall be indemnified by the corporation against any and all liability and the reasonable expenses, including attorneys' fees and disbursements, incurred by him (or by his heirs, executors or administrators) in connection with the defense or settlement of such action, suit or proceeding, or in connection with any appearance therein, except in relation to matters as to which it shall be adjucged in such action, suit or proceeding that such director or officer is liable for negligence or misconduct in the performance of his duties. Such right of indemnification shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which such director or officer (or such heirs, executors or administrators) may be entitled apart from this Article.
