## ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

Sovereign Isle Homeowner's Association, Inc.

The undersigned, for purpose of forming a nonprofit corporation under the Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act, Florida Statutes Chapter 617, do hereby make and adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

#### ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this corporation is: Sovereign Isle Homeowner's Association, Inc.

#### ARTICLE II - NOT FOR PROFIT

The Corporation is a corporation not for profit as defined by Section 617.01, Florida Statutes. The Corporation is not formed for pecuniary profit. No part of the income or assets of the Corporation is distributable to or for the benefit of its Members, Directors or Officers, except to the extent permissible under law.

#### ARTICLE III - DURATION

The duration of the Corporation is perpetual.

#### ARTICLE IV - PURPOSES

The Corporation is organized, and shall be operated exclusively for, the following purposes:

- A. To promote the health, safety and social welfare of the owners of property within that area referred to as "property" in the declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions for Sovereign Isle to be recorded in the Public Records of Okaloosa County, Florida.
- B. To maintain and/or repair landscaping in the general and/or common areas, parks, drainage, easements, streets and other common areas, structures, and other improvements in Sovereign Isle, or appurtenant thereto, for which the obligation to maintain and repair has been delegated and accepted.

- C. To control the specifications, architecture, design, appearance, elevation and location of and landscaping around all buildings and improvements of any type, including walls, fences, swimming pools, antennae, sewers, drains, disposal systems, or other structures constructed, placed or permitted to remain in Sovereign Isle, as well as the alteration, improvement, addition and/or change thereto.
- D. To provide or provide for private security, fire protection, and such other services the responsibility for which has been or may be accepted by the Association, and the capital improvements and equipment related thereto, in Sovereign Isle.
- E. To provide, purchase, acquire, replace, improve, maintain and/or repair such buildings, structures, street lights and other structures, landscaping, paving and equipment, both real and personal, related to the health, safety and social welfare of the members of the Association, as the Board of Directors in its discretion determines necessary, appropriate, and/or convenient.
- F. To operate without profit for the sole and exclusive benefit of its members.
- G. To perform all of the functions contemplated of the Association, and undertaken by the Board of Directors of the Association, in the Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions hereinabove described.

#### ARTICLE V - GENERAL POWERS

The general powers that the Association shall have are as follows:

- A. To hold funds solely and exclusively for the benefit of the members for purposes set forth in these Articles of Incorporation.
- B. To promulgate and enforce rules, regulations, bylaws, covenants, restrictions and agreements to effectuate the purposes for which the Association is organized.
- C. To delegate power or powers where such is deemed in the interest of the Association.

- D. To purchase, lease, hold, mortgage or otherwise acquire or dispose of, real or personal property, except to the extent restricted hereby; to enter into, make, perform or carry out, contracts of every kind with any person, firm, corporation, association or other entity; to do any and all acts necessary or expedient for carrying on any and all of the activities and pursuing any and all of the objects and purposes set forth in the Articles of Incorporation and not forbidden by the laws of the State of Florida.
- E. To fix assessments to be levied against property, to defray expenses and the cost of effectuating the objects and purposes of the Association, and to create reasonable reserves of such expenditures, and to authorize its Board of Directors, in its discretion, to enter into agreements with mortgage companies and other organizations for collection of such assessments.
- F. To charge recipients for services rendered by the Association and the uses for use of Association property when such is deemed appropriate by the Board of Directors of the Association.
- G. To pay taxes and other charges, if any, on or against property owned or accepted by the Association.
- H. In general, to have all powers conferred upon a corporation by the laws of the State of Florida, except as prohibited herein.

#### ARTICLE VI - MEMBERS

- A. The members shall consist of the property owners in Sovereign Isle, the property comprising Sovereign Isle being described in Sections C and D of this Article, and all such property owners shall be members of the Association. There shall be two (2) classes of members, as follows:
- 1. Class A Members. Class A members shall be all property owners, including the Developer. Owners of the property shall automatically become Class A members upon purchase of such property.
- 2. Class B Members. Class B members shall be Emerald Coast Ventures, Inc., a Florida Corporation, or its designee, successor or assignee, as Developer of Sovereign Isle.

- B. "Developer", "Owner", "Lot", and any other defined terms used herein, and elsewhere in the Articles, are used with the definitions given those terms in the aforesaid Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions for Sovereign Isle.
- C. Sovereign Isle consists of that certain real property situated in Okaloosa County, Florida, described as follows:

BEGINNING AT A PERMANENT REFERENCE MONUMENT MARKING THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF EMERALD BREEZE ESTATES AS RECORDED IN PLATBOOK 11, PAGE 71, OKALOOSA COUNTY, FLORIDA PROCEED NORTH 08 DEGREES 57 MINUTES 20 SECONDS EAST 533 01 FEET ALONG THE EAST LINE OF SAID SUBDIVISION, THENCE SOUTH 81 DEGREES 25 MINUTES 22 SECONDS EAST 717.76 FEET TO A POINT ON THE WESTERLY RIGHT OF WAY OF COMMODORE POINT ROAD, A PROPOSED 66 FOOT RIGHT OF WAY, THENCE SOUTHWESTERLY ALONG SAID RIGHT OF WAY AND A CURVE TO THE RIGHT HAVING A RADIUS OF 234.00 FEET AND A CENTRAL ANGLE OF 16 DEGREES 25 MINUTES 01 SECONDS, AN ARC DISTANCE OF 67.05 FEET (CHORD BEARING AND DISTANCE, SOUTH 08 DEGREES 05 MINUTES 56 SECONDS WEST 66.82 FEET), TO THE END OF CURVE, THENCE CONTINUE ALONG SAID RIGHT OF WAY 16 DEGREES 18 MINUTES 27 SECONDS WEST 36.05 FEET TO THE BEGINNING OF A CURVE TO RIGHT HAVING A RADIUS OF 214.00 FEET AND A CENTRAL ANGLE OF 32 DEGREES 15 MINUTES 19 SECONDS, THENCE SOUTHWESTERLY ALONG SAID CURVE AN ARC DISTANCE OF 120.47 FEET (CHORD BEARING AND DISTANCE, SOUTH 32 DEGREES 26 MINUTES 06 SECONDS WEST 118.89 FEET, THENCE SOUTH DEGREES 55 MINUTES 39 SECONDS WEST 321.74 FEET TO THE NORTH LINE OF A SECOND 100 FOOT GULF POWER EASEMENT, THENCE NORTH 81 DEGREES 25 MINUTES 22 SECONDS WEST 666.94 FEET ALONG SAID NORTH LINE TO THE POINT OF BEGINNING. CONTAINS 8.3 ACRES, MORE OR LESS AND LYING AND BEING IN UN-SECTIONALIZED TOWNSHIP 2 SOUTH, RANGE 22 WEST, OKALOOSA COUNTY, FLORIDA. BEARINGS BASED ON THE EAST BOUNDARY LINE OF EMERALD BREEZE ESTATES BEING NORTH 08 DEGREES 57 MINUTES 20 SECONDS, EAST, AS SHOWN ON PLAT.

D. Developer may, but may have no obligation to, add at any time, from time to time, to the scheme of the Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions for Sovereign Isle, all or any portion of property owned by Developer, or to be owned by Developer, in Sections \_\_\_\_\_, Township \_\_\_\_\_, Range\_\_\_\_\_, Okaloosa County, Florida, as provided in the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions for Sovereign Isle. Developer contemplates that future developments of lands in Sections \_\_\_\_\_, Township \_\_\_\_\_\_, Range\_\_\_\_\_, Okaloosa County, Florida, shall be a phase type development utilizing this Homeowners Association as a master association to own and/or maintain, and to operate and regulate the common areas, as described in the Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions for Sovereign Isle, and additional common areas which may be subsequently submitted as a result of phase development.

Should Developer add additional land to the scheme of the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions for Sovereign Isle, each property owner

in such phase shall automatically become a member of this Association as specified in Section A of this Article.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, Developer shall have no obligation whatsoever to add any additional lands to the scheme of the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions for Sovereign Isle.

The Developer of Sovereign Isle shall lose the right to appoint a majority of the Board of Directors upon the earlier of (a) not later than two (2) years after the Developer has sold the last lot to its final retail purchaser, or (b) ten (10) years after the date of the Declaration, and Class A Members shall thereafter elect all Directors.

#### ARTICLE VII - LIMITATION

No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of or be distributable to its Members, Directors or Officers, but the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article 4 (Purposes) hereof.

## ARTICLE VIII - INITIAL REGISTERED AGENT AND STREET ADDRESS

The name and the street address of the initial registered agent is Bruce A. Haught, 305 Main St., Destin, FL 32541. This is also the mailing address of the corporation.

#### ARTICLE IX - VOTING and ASSESSMENTS

A. Subject to the restrictions and limitations hereinafter set forth, each member shall be entitled to one (1) vote for each lot in which they held the interest required for membership. When one or more persons hold such interest or interest in any lot, all such persons shall be members, and the vote for such lot shall be exercised as they among themselves determine, but in no event shall more than one vote be cast with respect to any lot. Except where otherwise required under the provisions of these Articles, the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions for Sovereign Isle, or bylaws, the affirmative vote of the owners of a majority of lots represented at any meeting of the members duly called and

at which a quorum is present, shall be binding upon the members.

- B. The Developer shall have the right to appoint a majority of the Board of Directors as long as it owns at least one (1) lot in Sovereign Isle.
- C. The Association will obtain funds with which to operate by assessment of its members in accordance with the provisions of the Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions for Sovereign Isle, as supplemented by the provisions of the Articles and Bylaws of the Association relating thereto.

#### ARTICLE X - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- A. The affairs of the Association shall be managed by a Board of Directors consisting of five (5) Directors. So long as Developer shall have the right to appoint a majority of the Board of Directors, and Directors need not be members of the Association and need not be residents of the State of Florida: thereafter, all Directors shall be members of the Association and residents of the State of Florida. There shall be two (2) Directors appointed by members so long as the Class B Member has the right to appoint a majority of the Board of Directors. Elections shall be by plurality vote. At the first annual election of the Board of Directors the term of office of the elected Director receiving the highest plurality of votes shall be established at one (1) year. In addition, the Class B member shall elect two (2) Directors to serve for terms of two (2) years and one (1) Director to serve for a term of one (1) year. Thereafter, as many Directors shall be elected and appointed, as the case may be, as there are regular terms of office of Directors expiring at such time, and the term of the Directors so elected or appointed at each annual election shall be for two (2) years expiring at the second annual election following their election, and thereafter until their successors are duly elected and qualified, or until removed from office with or without cause by the affirmative vote of a majority of the members which elected or appointed them. In no event can a Board member appointed by Class B Member be removed except by action of the Class B Member. Any Director appointed by the Class B Member shall serve at the pleasure of the Class B Member, and may be removed from office, and a successor Director may be appointed, at any time by the Class B Member.

#### ARTICLE XI - OFFICERS

A. The officers of the Association shall be a President, a Vice President, A Secretary and an Treasurer, and such other officers as the Board may from time to time by resolution create. Any Two (2) or more offices may be held by the same person except the offices of President and Secretary. Officers shall be elected for one (1) year terms in accordance with the procedures set forth in the Bylaws. The names of the officers who are to manage the affairs of the Association until the annual meeting of the Board of Directors to be held in the year 1996 and until their successors are duly elected and qualified are:

ARTICLE XII - AMENDMENT TO ARTICLES OF

#### INCORPORATION

These Articles may be altered, amended or repealed by resolution of the Board of Directors. No amendment affecting Emerald Coast Ventures, Inc., a Florida corporation, or its successors or assigns, as Developer of Sovereign Isle (as same is defined in the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions for Sovereign Isle) shall be effective without the prior written consent of said Emerald Coast Ventures, Inc., or its successors or assigns, as Developer.

## ARTICLE XIV - INDEMNIFICATION OF OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS

- A. The Association hereby indemnifies any Director or officer made a party or threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or completed action, suit or proceeding:
- 1. Whether civil, criminal, administrative, or investigative, other than one by or in the right of the Association to procure a judgement in its favor, brought to impose a liability or penalty on such person for an act alleged to have been committed by such person in his capacity as Director or officer of the

Association, or in his capacity as Director, officer, employee or agent of any other corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise which he served at the request of the Association, against judgments, fines, amounts paid in settlement and reasonable expenses, including attorneys' fees, actually and necessarily incurred as a result of such action, suit or proceedings or appeal therein, if such person acted in good faith in the reasonable belief that such action was in the best interests of the Association and in criminal actions or proceedings, without reasonable grounds for belief that such action was unlawful. The termination of any such action, suit or proceedings by judgment, order, settlement, conviction or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent shall not in itself create a presumption that any such Director or officer did not act in good faith in the reasonable belief that such action was in the best interests of the Association or that he had reasonable grounds for belief that such action was unlawful.

- 2. By or in the right of the Association to procure a judgment in its favor by reason of his being or having been a Director or officer of the Association, or by reason of his being or having been a Director, officer, employee or agent of any other corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise which he served at the request of the Association, against the reasonable expenses, including attorneys' fees, actually and necessarily incurred by him in connection with the defense or settlement of such action, or in connection with an appeal therein if such person acted in good faith in the reasonable belief that such action was in the best interests of the Association. Such person shall not be entitled to indemnification in relation to matters to which such person has been adjudged to have been guilty of negligence or misconduct in the performance of his duty to the Association unless, and only to the extent that, the court, administrative agency, or investigative body before which such action, suit or proceeding is held shall determine upon application that, despite the adjudication of liability but in view of all circumstances of the case, such person is fairly and reasonably entitled to indemnification for such expense which such tribunal shall deem proper.
- B. The Board of Directors shall determine whether amounts for which a Director or officer seeks indemnification were properly incurred and whether such Director or officer acted in good faith and in a manner he reasonable believed to be in the best interest of the Association, and whether, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, he had no reasonable ground for belief that such action was unlawful. Such determination shall be made by the Board of Directors by a majority vote of a quorum consisting of Directors who were not

parties to such action, suit or proceeding.

C. The foregoing rights of indemnification shall not be deemed to limit in any way the powers of the Association to indemnify under applicable law.

### ARTICLE - XV TRANSACTION IN WHICH DIRECTORS OR OFFICERS ARE INTERESTED

- A. No contract or transaction between the Association and one or more of its Directors officers, or between the Association and any other corporation, partnership, association, or other organization in which one or more of its Directors or officers are Directors or officers, or have a financial interest shall be invalid, void or voidable solely for the reason, or solely because the Director or officer is present at or participates in the meeting of the Board or committee thereof which authorized the contract or transaction, or solely because his or their votes are counted for such purpose. No Director or officer of the Association shall incur liability by reason of the fact that he is or may be interest in any such contract or transaction.
- B. Interested Directors may be counted in determining the presence of a quorum at a meeting of the Board of Directors or of a committee which authorized the contract or transaction.

#### ARTICLE XVI - DISSOLUTION IF THE ASSOCIATION

- A. Upon dissolution of the Association, all of its assets remaining after provision for creditors and payment of all costs and expenses of such dissolution shall be distributed in the following manner:
- 1. Real property contributed to the Association without the receipt of other than nominal consideration by the Class B Member (or its predecessor in interest) shall be returned to the Class B Member (whether or not a Class B Member at the time of such dissolution), unless it refuses to accept the conveyance (in whole or 1. part).
- 2. Dedication to any applicable municipal or other governmental authority of any property determined by the Board of Directors to the Association to be appropriate for such dedication and which the authority is willing to accept.
  - A. Remaining assets shall be distributed among the members, subject to the

limitations set forth below, as tenants in common, each member's share of the assets to be determined in accordance with its voting rights.

B. The Association may be dissolved upon a resolution to that affect being recommended by three-forths (3/4 ths) of the members of the Board of Directors, and, if such decree be necessary at the time of dissolution, after receipt of an appropriate decree as set forth in Florida Statutes Section 617.05 or statute of similar import, and approved by two-thirds (2/3 rds) of the voting rights of the Association's members.

#### ARTICLES OF AMENDMENT TO ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF Sovereign Isle Homeowner's Association, Inc.

Pursuant to the provisions of section 617.1006, Florida Statutes, the undersigned corporation adopts the following articles of amendment to its articles of incorporation:

FIRST: Amendments Adopted:

A. Article VI of the articles of incorporation is hereby amended to read:

A. The members shall consist of the property owners in Sovereign Isle, the property comprising Sovereign Isle being described in Sections C and D of this Article, and all such property owners shall be members of the Association. There shall be two (2) voting classes of members, as follows:

Class A: Class A member(s) shall be all Owners with the exception of the Declarant (who shall be come a Class A member when Declarant's Class B membership ceases as provided hereafter) and shall be entitled to one vote for each Lot owned. When more than one person holds an interest in any Lot, all such persons shall be members and the vote for such lot shall be exercised as they among themselves determine, but in no event shall more than one (1) vote be cast with respect to any lot.

Class B: Class B member shall be Declarant and who shall be entitled to three (3) votes for each Lot owned. The Class B membership shall cease and be converted to Class A membership when the total votes outstanding in the Class B membership equals the total votes outstanding in Class A membership.

- B. "Developer", "Owner", "Lot", and any other defined terms used herein, and elsewhere in the Articles, are used with the definitions given those terms in the aforesaid Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions for Sovereign Isle.
- C. Sovereign Isle consists of that certain real property situated in Okaloosa County, Florida, described as follows:

LOTS 1 THROUGH 25, INCLUSIVE, BLOCK A; LOTS 1 THROUGH 13, INCLUSIVE, BLOCK B; THAT PORTION SHOWN AS "COMMON AREA"; SOVEREIGN ISLE AS RECORDED IN THE PUBLIC RECORDS OF OKALOOSA COUNTY IN PLAT BOOK 15, AT PAGE 55.

D. Developer may, but may have no obligation to, add at any time, from time to time, to

the scheme of the Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions for Sovereign Isle, all or	
of property owned by Developer, or to be owned by Developer, in Sections, Tov	
Range, Okaloosa County, Florida, as provided in the Declaration of Covenants, (	Conditions
and Restrictions for Sovereign Isle. Developer contemplates that future developments	s of lands in
Sections, Township, Range, Okaloosa County, Florida, shall be a	i phase type
development utilizing this Homeowners Association as a master association to own at	id/or
maintain, and to operate and regulate the common areas, as described in the Declaration	on of
Covenants and Restrictions for Sovereign Isle, and additional common areas which m	iay be
subsequently submitted as a result of phase development.	

Should Developer add additional land to the scheme of the Declaration of Covenants. Conditions and Restrictions for Sovereign Isle, each property owner in such phase shall automatically become a member of this Association as specified in Section A of this Article.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, Developer shall have no obligation whatsoever to add any additional lands to the scheme of the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions for Sovereign Isle.

The Developer of Sovereign Isle shall lose the right to appoint a majority of the Board of Directors upon the earlier of (a) not later than two (2) years after the Developer has sold the last lot to its final retail purchaser, or (b) ten (10) years after the date of the Declaration, and Class A Members shall thereafter elect all Directors.

SECOND: The date of adoption of the amendments: August 28, 1995.

THIRD: The amendments have been approved by unanimous vote of the Board of Directors.

FOURTH: There are no members entitled to vote on the amendment.
