# ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

FILED 95 FEB 27 " 8 20

The undersigned, acting as incorporator(s) of a Corporation pursuant to, Chapter 617, Florida Statutes, adopt the following Articles of Incorporation.

### **ARTICLE 1**

The name of the corporation shall be: THE ASSOCIATION OF BLACK PSYCHOLOGISTS SOUTH FLORIDA CHAPTER, INCORPORATED

The principal place of business of this corporation shall be:20622N.W. 33 COURT Miami, Florida 33056

## ARTICLE II

The period of the duration of this corporation is perpetual unless dissolved according to law.

# ARTICLE III

# Scope and Purpose (Local)

The overall goals of the South Florida Chapter are identical to those of the national organization. In addition, specific local goals include the following: (1) To formulate opinions with policy implications concerning relevant psychological, sociological, economic and political issues which affect the Black community. (2) To work with local organizations in meeting the mental health needs of black people. (3) To encourage and support the involvement of membership in education and professional activities (in-service training, continuing education, independent research, licensure and certification, scholarly papers and publications, etc.). (4) To encourage and support the development of psychology students through recruitment, fellowship, support, curriculum development, internships, job or graduate school placement, etc.

To accomplish these purposes, the Association shall exercise, but not be limited to, the following specific functions:

(1) To establish a central local organization of black psychologists.

- (2) To develop funding sources for working capital, staff support, and education programs.
- (3) To seek funding for projects involving black psychologists, and to support scholarly papers, training programs, recruitment of students and faculty, and community mental health programs.
- (4) To establish Ad-Hoc committee(s) to survey and implement relevant programs or activities.
- (5) To participate with community organizations that have objectives consistent with the scope and purpose of the Atlanta Chapter of the Association of Black Psychologists.
- (6) To develop position papers and/or policy statements in regard to issues affecting black people.

### ARTICLE IV

The qualifications for members and the manner of their admission are:

- A. Membership in the organization is limited to those persons with a specific interest in the overall enhancement of black life.
- B. Membership shall be granted to black persons who hold a college degree, or its equivalent, in psychology, or related fields, or who are working in the field of psychology or related fields, or who are students in psychology or related fields.
- C. Valid membership in the chapter requires payment of both Chapter and National dues for the current fiscal year.
- D. Types of requirements for membership are as follows:
  - 1. Professional
    - a. Paid dues in full as a professional.
  - 2. Associate
    - a. Paid dues in full as an Associate.
  - 3. Student
- a. Paid dues in full as a student.
- 4. Affiliate
  - a. Paid dues in full as an Affiliate.

### Article IV Officers and Committee Chairpersons

- A The officers and committee chairpersons of the Chapter will be elected by a majority vote of members satisfying the requirements of a quorum.
- B. Appointment or election of assistant officers may be done by a majority vote of members when appropriate.
- C. All officers and chairpersons shall hold their positions for a term of two years. No person may hold more than one position simultaneously.
- D. The officers and chairpersons of the Chapter, and their respective responsibilities are as follows:
- E. The offices of President and Vice President shall be held by members who have at least an M.A. in Psychology, or related field , as determined by the membership.

### **Board of Directors**

- A. The Board of Directors is responsible for coordinating the activities of the organization in order to achieve those purposes outlined within these by-laws. In doing so, it functions in accordance with the organization's articles of incorporation, and in service to the general membership.
- B. The Board of Directors shall be composed of the elected officers and committee chairpersons of the Chapter.
- C. Any member of the Board of Directors may resign by notice in writing to the President, and in the President's case, by notice to the Vice President.

# <u>Voting</u>

- A. Each member is entitled to one vote.
- B. The quorum required for valid voting shall consist of those members present, plus properly submitted proxies.
  - C. Proxies are limited to written and signed statements.

### **Dues**

A. The dues of the Chapter shall be determined periodically by a majority vote of members satisfying the requirements of a quorum.

### **Amendments**

- A. A formal resolution to alter, amend, repeal, or enact new by-laws may be proposed by any member.
- B. Written notice of the proposed resolution must be provided for the full membership.
- C. Voting on the proposed resolution would be held at the next scheduled Chapter meeting.
- D. Proposed amendments will be approved by a majority vote of members satisfying the requirements of a quorum.

# The following officers and chairs were passed with accompanying responsibilities:

President

- preside over general and executive meetings
- responsible for overall coordination and functioning of chapter
- serves as an ad his member of each committee - serves as liaison between chapter and national
- represents organization as its official spokesperson

Vice President

- assumes responsibilities of president in his/her absence
- serves as member of the program committee
- prepares general meeting agenda at the direction of the Exec. Cte.

Secretary

- complies and maintains records of the chapter
- records and disseminates minutes of the general meetings
- records minutes of Exec., Cte. meetings
- assists president with correspondence as needed
- serves on the Communication Cte.

Treasurer

- recipient and disburser of all monies
- serves on Fundraising Cte.
- maintains membership and financial records
- provides financial advice
- prepares financial reports as required

Student Liaison

- responsible for student membership
- serves as advocate for student concerns
- serves on membership cte.
- N.B. Student status determined by type of membership
