

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION  
OF  
GAINESVILLE JUNIORS VOLLEYBALL CLUB, INC.



1. Name. The name of the corporation shall be GAINESVILLE JUNIORS VOLLEYBALL, INC.
2. Purpose. The purposes for which this corporation is organized are as follows:
  - (a) To encourage and participate in girls' volleyball programs.
  - (b) To solicit and receive funds, gifts, endowments, donations, devises and bequests.
  - (c) To exercise all the powers enumerated in Section 617.021, Florida Statutes, as it now exists or is subsequently amended or superseded, and to do and perform such acts and to have such powers as shall be desirable and necessary in furtherance of any of the powers hereinabove enumerated which are not in derogation of the laws of the State of Florida.
3. Term of Existence. This corporation shall commence on April 19, 1995 and shall have perpetual existence unless it shall be dissolved according to the laws of the State of Florida.
4. Incorporator. The name and address of the incorporator is as follows: Terry L. Tougaw, P. O. Box 24, Gainesville, FL 32602.
5. Directors. The business affairs of the corporation shall be managed by the Board of Directors, which shall consist of not less than three nor more than nine persons. The term of office of the Directors and the manner of their election shall be stated in the bylaws.
6. Location and Agent. The street address in the State of Florida of the principal office, the mailing address of the corporation is P. O. Box 24, Gainesville, FL 32602 and the initial registered office of the corporation is 1225 N.E. 20th Place, Gainesville, Florida 32609 and the name of its initial resident agent at such address is Terry L. Tougaw.
7. Limitation. No part of the net earning of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, Directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth above. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities

not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provisions of any further United States Internal Revenue law) or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue law.)

8. Distribution of Assets Upon Dissolution. No person, firm or corporation shall ever receive any dividend or share in the income from the undertaking of this corporation and upon dissolution of this corporation all assets remaining after payment of the costs and expenses of such dissolution shall be distributed among one or more organizations which are qualified for exemption under Section 501(c)(3) and Section 170(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, for a public purpose, and none of the assets shall be distributed to any member, officer or director of this corporation.

The undersigned, being the original incorporator hereinbefore named, for the purposes of forming a nonprofit corporation under Chapter 617 of the Florida Statutes, hereby makes, subscribes, acknowledges and files these Articles, hereby declaring and certifying that the facts herein stated are true, and accordingly, have hereunto subscribed his name this 17<sup>th</sup> day of April, 1995. The undersigned is familiar with and accepts the duties and obligations as registered agent for said corporation.
