ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF

S.U.P.P.O.R.T. MINISTRIES, INC. (Services Uplifting Potential Persons Over Rough Trifals)

The undersigned, acting as incorporator of S.U.P.P.O.R.T. MINISTRIES, INC., under the Florida Not-For-Profit Corporation Act, adopts the following Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE I. NAME

The name of the corporation is: S.U.P.P.O.R.T. Ministries, Inc.

ARTICLE II. PRINCIPAL PLACE OF BUSINESS AND MAILING ADDRESS

The principal place of business of the corporation is 412 Zack Street, Tampa, Florida 33602. The mailing address of the corporation is 7517 W. Waters Avenue, Suite 128, Tampa, Florida 33615.

ARTICLE III. DURATION AND COMMENCEMENT OF EXISTENCE

The existence of the corporation will commence on the date of filing of these Articles of Incorporation. The term of existence of the corporation is perpetual.

ARTICLE IV. PURPOSE

The corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, cientific, literary and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law. Within the scope of the foregoing, the corporation is specifically organized to (1) provide assistance, support, and guidance to any human being without regard to race, creed, color, religion, or national origin; and (2) build self-esteem, self-reliance, and skills which will empower and nurture individuals to become more productive members of the community.

ARTICLE V. ACTIVITIES NOT PERMITTED

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that

the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in this Article Three. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the corporation shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation qualifying for exemption from federal income tax as an organization described by Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding section of any future United States Internal Revenue Law, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding section of any future United States Internal Revenue Law.

ARTICLE VI. INITIAL BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The powers of this corporation shall be exercised, its properties controlled, and its affairs conducted by a board of directors. The powers of the board of directors, the qualifications for serving as a director, and the manner of selection of directors shall be specified in the corporation's bylaws. The corporation shall have seventeen (17) directors. The names and addresses of the initial directors are as follows:

The power to adopt, alter, amend, or repeal bylaws shall be vested in the board of directors. Upon notice properly given, corporate bylaws may be adopted, altered, amended, or repealed by majority vote of the directors present at any regular or special meeting called for that purpose.

ARTICLE XI. DISSOLUTION

In the event of dissolution, the residual assets of the corporation will be turned over to one or more organizations that themselves are exempt from federal income taxation as organizations described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law (an "Exempt Organization"), as the board of directors shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the court of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and generated exclusively for such purposes.
