ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
of
SUNRISE POLICE ATHLETIC LEAGUE, INC.
(A Not for Profit Corporation)

ARTICLE I

Name

The name of the corporation shall be:
Sunrise Police Athletic League, Inc.

ARTICLE II

Principal place of business and mailing address

The principal place of business and mailing address of this corporation shall be:

ARTICLE III

Purposes

The specific purposes for which the corporation is organized are:

The object and purpose of this organization is to provide a means and method for the exchange of ideas, experiences and information regarding youth problems, their causes and treatment, and to provide methods and procedures necessary to develop a constructive programs with a goal toward solving those problems.

- A. The organization shall provide and coordinate programs and activities which contribute to the development of character, integrity, physical and mental fitness, citizenship, sportsmanship and personal well-being.
- B. The organization shall encourage and support public participation regardless of race, creed, sex or national origin.
- C. The organization shall promote friendly and cooperative relationships between the youthful participants and law enforcement officers.

ARTICLE IV

Manner of election of directors

The manner in which the directors are elected or appointed are as follows:

- A. The Board of Directors of the organization shall be composed of all elected officers: president, first vice president, second vice president, secretary, treasurer, and up to 20 members-at-large.
- B. The Board of Directors shall be elected for a term of two years and shall serve until their successor is elected.

ARTICLE V

Limitation of corporate powers

The corporate powers of this corporation are as provided in section 617.0302, Florida Statutes, unless limited are as follows:

- A. In order to promote the purposes of this corporation, it may acquire property by grant, gift, purchase, devise of bequest, and hold and dispose of such property as the corporation shall require for the benefit of the members and not for pecuniary profit.
- B. This corporation shall have the authority to seek all appropriate tax exemptions consistent with not for profit corporations under the Internal Revenue Code, all regulations of the Federal Government and any statutes, codes or regulations of the State of Florida or any other state in which this corporation may operate.
- C. That this corporation shall have the power and authority to seek any type of license that may be necessary for the efficient operation of this corporation in connection and fund raising, promotional or other activities designed to generate revenues to be used for the purposes of said corporation.

ARTICLE VII.2

Internal Affairs

Provisions not inconsistent with law regarding the regulation of internal affairs of the corporation, including, without limitation, any provision with respect to the relative rights or interests of the members as among themselves or in the property of the corporation are:

A. ELIGIBILITY

Any person who is concerned for the reduction, prevention and treatment of delinquency in the community by providing youth programs and activities through the Sunrise P.A.L. can apply for membership.

B. DUES

Dues and other assessments shall be determined by the Board of Directors and subject to the approval of a majority vote of the members present at an annual meeting or special meeting called specifically for that purpose.

C. RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES

Members in good standing shall be entitled to the following rights and privileges:

A. The right to participate in all activities and meetings conducted by the organization, subject to the regulations of those activities.

B. No member's rights and privileges in the organization shall be abridged except as follows:

1. Arrest and conviction of a crime while a member of the organization.
2. Evidence of misconduct, mis-use or misrepresentation of the organization.
3. Any action the executive board rules is contrary to the best interest of the organization.

Any charge of the above must be written and sworn to by the accuser. The charge must be supported by physical evidence and/or sworn witness testimony. The charges should be submitted to the board president who will then notify the accused member of the charge. The Board of Directors will meet within ten days to review the charges and make a decision. If a majority of the board agrees to continue the investigation beyond the ten days to the charges further review, they shall have that right. In order for the charges to be upheld it will require a 2/3 vote of the board. The board of directors shall have the right to determine punishment up to and including dismissal.

C. Any member charged under Article VII.2C-B shall have the right to appeal the board's decision to the membership at the annual meeting. It will require a vote of 50% plus one (1) of the members present to overrule the board.

ARTICLE VII.3

Dissolution

Should the organization be dissolved for any reason, all remaining funds shall be distributed to one or more tax exempt organizations.

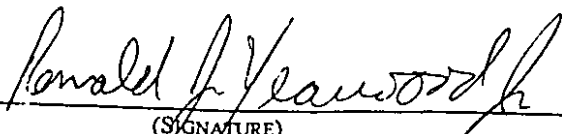

influence legislation, and the organization shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of this document, the organization shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by an organization exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Under the dissolution of the organization, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the county in which the principal office of the organization is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
