#### ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

The undersigned, acting as incorporator of this corporation pursuant to Chapter 617 of the Florida Statutes, hereby forms a corporation not for profit under the laws of the State of Florida and adopts the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation:

#### ARTICLE I - NAME OF CORPORATION

The name of this corporation shall be Cardiovascular Research Institute, Inc.

# ARTICLE II - ADDRESS OF PRINCIPAL OFFICE AND MAILING ADDRESS OF CORPORATION

The address of the principal office of the corporation is 217 Hillcrest Street, Orlando, Florida 32801, which is also the mailing address of the corporation.

#### ARTICLE III - PURPOSES AND POWERS OF CORPORATION

A. The corporation is organized exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, literary and educational purposes, including, for all such purposes, making distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or such corresponding section of any future federal tax code (hereinafter referred to as the "Code"). To the extent consistent with the preceding sentence and permissible under Florida law, the purposes

of this corporation shall include, but shall not be limited to conducting scientific research.

- B. This corporation shall be authorized to carry out any and all acts and to exercise any and all corporate powers which may now or hereafter be lawful under the laws of the State of Florida to the extent applicable to corporations not for profit and that are not inconsistent with these Articles of Incorporation.
- C. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Articles of Incorporation to the contrary, the following provisions shall apply:
- 1. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of or be distributable to its members, directors, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered to the corporation and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in this Article III.
- 2. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in or intervene in any political campaign (including publishing or distributing statements) on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.
- 3. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles of Incorporation, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a

corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Code.

- 4. If the corporation is, or shall ever be, classified as a "private foundation", as defined in Section 509(a) of the Code, the following provisions shall apply for so long as it remains a private foundation:
  - (i) The corporation will not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in Section 4941(d) of the Code.
  - (ii) The corporation will distribute its income for each tax year at such time and in such manner as not to become subject to the tax on undistributed income imposed by Section 4942 of the Code.
  - (iii) The corporation will not retain any excess business holdings as defined in Section 4943(c) of the Code.
  - (iv) The corporation will not make any investments in such manner as to subject it to tax under Section 4944 of the Code.
  - (v) The corporation will not make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945(d) of the Code.

#### ARTICLE IV - DIRECTORS

The board of directors of the corporation shall be elected as provided in the Bylaws; provided that the initial directors shall be elected by the incorporator promptly following the filing of these Articles of Incorporation and such initial directors shall complete the organization of the corporation. The

board of directors shall at all times consist of at least three (3) persons.

#### ARTICLE V - MEMBERS

Persons shall be approved for membership by the Board of Directors in such manner as may be prescribed by the Bylaws of the corporation. The corporation expressly reserves the right to accept or reject any application for membership for any reason whatsoever, except for discrimination on the basis of race, religion, sex or national origin.

### ARTICLE VI - INITIAL REGISTERED OFFICE

#### AND REGISTERED AGENT

The street address of the initial registered office of the corporation is 800 North Magnolia Avenue, Suite 1500, Orlando, Florida 32803, and the name of the initial registered agent of this corporation at that address is Alan H. Daniels. The Board of Directors may from time to time designate a new registered office and registered agent.

#### ARTICLE VII - INCORPORATOR

#### ARTICLE VIII - TERM OF EXISTENCE

This corporation shall have perpetual existence, commencing with the execution of these Articles of Incorporation with the Secretary of State.

#### ARTICLE IX - DISSOLUTION OF CORPORATION

Upon the dissolution of this corporation, after the payment or provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of this corporation, all of the assets of this corporation shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Circuit Court of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organication or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes. In no event, however, may the assets to be disposed of be distributed to or for the benefit of any member, director, trustee, officer or other private person, other than as reasonable payment for services rendered by such person.

#### ARTICLE X - INDEMNIFICATION

This Corporation shall indemnify any officer or director, or any former officer or director, to the full extent permitted by law.
