

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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF DATSUN TO KERIOUS, INC.



ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation shall be: DATSUN TO KERIOUS, INC., a Florida corporation not for profit. Its address is 1371 NW 198 Street Miami, Florida 33169.

ARTICLE II

The specific and primary purposes for which this corporation is formed are:

- A. For the advancement of religion, charity, education and any other related for corresponding charitable purposes by the distribution of its funds for such purposes.
- B. To sustain divine worship; to conduct for religious instruction and worship churches, schools, and other institutions of a religious, educational, charitable and benevolent character; to advance spiritual growth and enlightenment, moral and personal purity among its own membership and the people of the community in which it is located; to provide for the preaching of the gospel of Jesus Christ; to circulate the Bible and religious literature; to own and operate printing presses for publication of religious literature; to support religious education; and for the purpose of promoting the foregoing objects, this corporation shall have the rights to acquire either by gift or purchase, and to hold or sell, mortgage or encumber in any manner, lease and improve real estate and personal property for itself and others, either by trustees or otherwise.
- C. To operate exclusively in any other manner for such religious, charitable and educational purposes as will qualify it as an exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, or under any corresponding provisions

of any subsequent federal tax laws, covering the distribution to organizations qualified as tax exempt organizations under the Internal Revenue Code, as amended, including private foundations and private operating foundations.

ARTICLE III

The qualifications for member and the manner of their admission are to be provided for in the bylaws of the corporation.

The manner in which Directors and Trustees are elected shall be provided in the bylaws.

ARTICLE IV

The affairs of this corporation shall be conducted and managed and its properties controlled by a Board of Trustees which shall bring all recommendations to the pastor for evaluation and discussion prior to final approval. The number of Trustees of the corporation shall be not less than three and no more than as prescribed by the bylaws duly adopted by the members.

This organization is organized under a nonstock basis.

ARTICLE V

- A. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, trustees officers or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article II hereof.
- B. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.
- C. The corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Code law; or (b) b a corporation contributions to which re deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue law).
- D. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, this corporation shall not, except to an unsubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the purposes of this corporation.

ARTICLE VI

Upon dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Trustees shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purpose of the corporation in such

manner, or to such organization or organizations under Section 50l(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any flature United States Internal Revenue law), as the Board of Trustees shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction in the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations as such court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE VII

The property of this corporation is irrevocately dedicated to religious, educational, charitable purposes, and no part of the net income or assets of this corporation shall ever inure to the benefit of any trustee, officer or member thereof, or to the benefit f any private individual.

ARTICLE VIII

The period of the duration of this corporation is perpetual unless dissolved according to law. Corporate existence of this corporation shall commence at the time of the filing of these Articles of Incorporation with the Secretary of State.
