ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF NEW LIFE CHURCH OF CHRIST, INC.

CIVISIE FRANCE STATE STA

The undersigned hereby acts to form a not-for-profit corporation under the laws of the State of Florida, pursuant to Chapter 617, Florida Statutes, providing for the formation, liability, rights, privileges, and immunities of a corporation not-for-profit.

ARTICLE I:

The name of this Corporation shall be New Life Church of Christ, Inc.

ARTICLE II: PURPOSE OF CORPORATION

This Corporation is organized specifically for religious, educational and charitable purposes, within the meaning of §501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue law. The primary activities of this Corporation may include, to-wit:

- a. to maintain a place of worship;
- b. to propagate the Gospel of Jesus Christ;
- c. to initiate outreach programs to service the needy and the community;
- d. to visit hospitals, nursing homes, shelters, prisons and other institutions;
 - e. to promote the Word of God through the teaching of the Bible;
- f. to ordain Ministers, Deacons, Evangelists, Missionaries, and other officers within the ordinances of the church;
 - g. to teach, counsel, instruct youths and encourage youth activities;

- h. to become involved in Radio, TV, seminars, workshops, conferences to win souls for Christ and to establish churches, nationwide, international and abroad:
- i. to perform christenings, marriages, communion, baptisms and funerals;
- j. to initiate day care, elderly, youth, adult centers, provide food, clothing and other outreach activities to the community:
- k. to rent, lease or purchase such buildings or edifices which might be needed by the congregation;
- to buy, vacant land or buildings, alter, develop or repair same for use of the corporation, and to dispose of same when no longer needed;
- m. to purchase, accept, acquire wholly or in part, and for any lawful use or purpose, and for and upon lawful consideration mortgages and other similar instruments, and any and all rights thereunder and property therein, also and likewise and in like manner, bonds, obligations, debentures, notes, certificates, of interest, stocks and receipts created by any corporation or corporations, syndicates, individuals, governments, states, municipalities or political or governmental division or agencies and all rights under the same;
- n. to borrow money and to contract debt when necessary for the exercise of its corporate rights, privileges, or for any other lawful purposes of its obligations for any amount so borrowed; to mortgage its property and or to make such deed of trust as may be necessary to secure the payment of such obligations or of any debts contracted for such purpose; and.

o. to enter, into, make, perform, and carry out contracts with any persons, firms, corporations, municipal or political bodies so far and to the extent that the same may be done and performed under the provisions of the laws of the state of Florida.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, this Corporation shall not (a) except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the purpose of this Corporation; (b) carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from Federal Income Tax under §501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue laws, or by a corporation the contributions to which are deductible under §170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue laws; or, (e) carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on by any other provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue laws, which affect the exempt status of this Corporation or the deductibility of contributions made to the Corporation.

ARTICLE III: NO PRIVATE INUREMENT

All corporate property is irrevocably dedicated to the purposes set forth in Article II herein. No part of the net earnings of this Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to, its members, directors, trustees, officers, private shareholders or other private individuals, except that the Corporation shall be authorized to and be empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes of the Corporation set forth in Article II herein.

ARTICLE IV: DISSOLUTION

Upon dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all the liabilities of the Corporation, dispose of all the assets of the Corporation exclusively for the purposes of the Corporation in such manner or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for religious, charitable, educational, or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under §501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Circuit Court of the county in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE V: CORPORATE EXISTENCE

This Corporation shall exist perpetually unless dissolved according to law.

ARTICLE VI: DIRECTORS

The manner in which Directors are elected or appointed shall be regulated in the Bylaws.

ARTICLE VII: INCORPORATOR
