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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

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FLORIDA INTERNATIONAL TRADE AND TALL TO RECORDA

(A Not-For-Profit Corporation)

ARTICLE I

NAME

The name of this corporation shall be FLORIDA INTERNATIONAL TRADE AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION.

ARTICLE II

ADDRESS

The street address of the place of business of the Corporation is 200 South Orange Avenue, Suite 1200, Orlando, Florida 32801.

ARTICLE III

TERM

The duration of this Corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE IV

PURPOSE

The specific and primary purposes for which this Corporation is formed are:

- (a) The Corporation is organized exclusively for the benefit of the State of Florida.
- (b) This corporation will advise and assist in promoting and developing international trade and reverse investment, marketing the state for potential new investment, and creating, expanding and retaining Florida businesses.

- (c) The Corporation shall, working jointly with Florida's Governor, Legislature, Enterprise Florida, Inc., and Office of Tourism, Trade and Economic Development, private and public educational institutions, other state and federal agencies and with corporations and individuals representing the private sector, assist in developing and implementing policies, programs, and activities reasonably required to accomplish the Corporation's purposes.
- (d) To engage in any lawful act or activity for which not-for-profit corporations may be organized, so far as it or may be permitted by the Laws of the State of Florida and Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

ARTICLE V

MEMBERSHIP

Clauses and qualifications of membership shall be as stated in the Bylaws of the Corporation.

ARTICLE VI

MANAGEMENT

The affairs of this Corporation shall be managed and governed by a nonprofit public-private Board of Directors, made up of the following persons:

- (a) The Lieutenant Governor or the Lieutenant Governor's designee.
- (b) The president of the Florida Chamber of Commerce of the president's designee.

- (c) The Secretary of State or the secretary's designee.
- (d) The chairperson of the Florida State Rural Development Council or the chairperson's designee.
- (e) A member of the Senate, who shall be appointed by the president of the Senate as an ex officio member of the board and serve at the pleasure of the president.
- (f) A member of the House of Representatives, who shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives as an ex officio member of the board and serve at the pleasure of the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- (g) Members to be appointed by the Governor, subject to confirmation by the Senate, consisting of the following:
 - The chairperson of the World Trade Association of Florida, or the chairperson's designee.
 - 2. Two (2) representatives from the state's deepwater ports, chosen from a list of three (3) names submitted to the Governor by the Florida Ports Council. One (1) representative shall be from the Gulf of Mexico coast ports and one (1) representative shall be from the Atlantic coast port.
 - The chairperson of the Florida Airport Managers
 Association or the chairperson's designee.
 - 4. The chairperson of the Florida Custom Brokers and Forwarders Association or the chairperson's designee.

- A person having extensive experience in foreign language instruction or international education.
- 6. The chairperson of the International Law Section of the Florida Bar of the chairperson's designee.
- 7. The chairperson of the Florida International Banking Association or the chairperson's designee.
- 8. A representative of a company in this state that is actively engaged in the manufacture of products in this state for sale in foreign markets.
- 9. A member of the Florida Citrus Commission experienced in the exportation of citrus products who owns, operates, or is employed by a major company in this state that is actively engaged in the exportation of citrus products from this state to international markets.
- 10. A representative of a major multinational company with offices in this state.
- 11. The chairperson of the Latin Chamber of Commerce of the United States or the chairperson's designee.
- (h) Nine (9) to eleven (11) members from the public and private sector, consisting of one (1) member representing a municipal economic development organization, one (1) member representing a county economic development organization, one (1) member representing a regional economic development organization, and one (1) member representing an international economic development

organization, and one (1) member, who, at the time of appointment, is a board member of a community development corporation that meets the requirements of s. 290.035, with the remaining members representing, and being actively involved in Florida business, who shall be appointed by the Governor, subject to Senate confirmation.

Members appointer by the Governor shall be appointed for terms of four (4) years, except that, in making the initial appointments, the Governor shall appoint three (3) to five (5) members for terms of four (4) years, three (3) members for terms of three (3) years, and three (3) members for terms of two (2) years. ARTICLE IX

BYLAWS

The Board of Directors shall adopt Bylaws consistent with these Articles. The Board of Directors, by a two-thirds (2/3s) majority vote, shall also have the power to make, alter or rescind any Bylaws on behalf of the Corporation, subject to the limitations of Chapter 92-277, Laws of Florida.

ARTICLE X

AMENDMENT

These Articles may be altered, amended or repealed by resolution of the Board of Directors, subject to the limitations of Chapter 92-277, Laws of Florida.

ARTICLE XI

INITIAL REGISTERED OFFICE AND AGENT

The street address of the initial registered office of this Corporation is 200 South Orange Avenue, Suite 1200, Orlando, Florida 32801. The name of the Corporation's initial registered agent to receive service of process is Thomas P. Page, Esquire.

ARTICLE XII

DISSOLUTION

In the event of the voluntary of involuntary liquidation or dissolution of the Corporation, no member shall be entitled as such to any distribution or division of its remaining property or its proceeds, and the balance of all money and other property received by the Corporation from any source after payment of all debts and obligations of the Corporation, shall be distributed to the State of Florida for a public purpose through its State Board of Administration.
