ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

STUDENTS FOR COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE REGARDING the ELDERLY, INC.

A Nonprofit Corporation

The undersigned incorporator, with other persons being desirous of forming a nenprofit corporation under the provisions of Chapter 617 of the Florida Statutes, do form a nonprofit corporation and agree to the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I

The name of this corporation is: STUDENTS FOR COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE REGARDING the ELDERLY, INC.

ARTICLE II

The general nature of the business or businesses to be transacted by this corporation, together with and in addition to the authority and powers conferred by the laws of the State of Florida, is to be organized and shall operate for charitable, scientific and educational purposes to promote scientific research, programs and education in the physiological and psychological care and nurturing of elderly persons within the general public for the improvement of their quality of life and the quality of life of their families and to provide services to persons who are elderly, including but not limited to, counseling in both individual and group sessions, liaison to local, state and federal agencies, clearing house i r information useful to elderly persons, such as care alternatives, benefits,

housing, home health providers, federal and state programs, meals on wheels, and assistance to family members and other care givers and ιo support further research, education, educational programs and dissemination of information to the elderly members of the general public. In the event the corporation seeks an exemption from taxation under Section 501 of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code"), the corporation shall be prohibited (upon obtaining such exemption) from engaging in any activity prohibited by the respective sub-section of the Code and the regulations and authority promulgated under such subsection under which the exemption is sought. Upon the liquidation or dissolution of this corporation, the property of this corporation then remaining after provision for liabilities shall be distributed to its members (at the time of the vote to dissolve) on a pro rata basis unless such distribution is prohibited by the applicable exemption from taxation that may subsequently be obtained; if such distribution to members is prohibited by a tax exemption, distribution shall be as required by the Internal Revenue Section or the Code.

This corporation shall have all of the general authority and powers conferred by the laws of the State of Florida subject to these Articles of Incorporation and By-laws to be adopted to do all things necessary, suitable and proper for the accomplishment of the above purposes and any one or more of them.
