ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF

CITIZENS FOR AMPHITHEATER AWARENESS, INC.

A NON-PROFIT CORPORATION

The undersigned person(s), desiring to form a Corporation not-for-profit under Chapter 617 of the Florida Statutes, certify as follows:

I

NAME

The name of the Corporation is Citizens for Amphitheater Awareness, Inc.

II

PURPOSE

The Corporation is organized for any lawful purpose or purposes authorized by the non-profit corporation laws of the State of Florida including without limitation educating the general public as to public or private developments proposed to be located within Jacksonville, Florida, in proximity to the St. Johns River and in particular any development or use that would adversely affect the public enjoyment of Metropolitan Park, which is located in the Alltel Stadium complex adjacent to the St. Johns River.

In furtherance of such purposes, the Corporation shall have and may exercise any and all powers, rights and privileges which a corporation organized under the non-profit corporation laws of the State of Florida by law may now or hereafter have or exercise.

MEMBERSHIP

The Corporation shall have a membership distinct from its Board of Directors. The authorized number and qualification of the members, the manner of their admission, the different classes of membership, if any, the property, voting, and other rights and privileges of members, their liability for dues and assessments and the method of collection thereof shall be as set forth in the Bylaws.

EXISTENCE

The Corporation shall have perpetual existence.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The powers of the Corporation shall be exercised, its property controlled and its affairs managed by a Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall consist of no fewer than three (3) no more than (9) members. The number of directors may be changed by

NO FINANCIAL BENEFIT TO MEMBERS

No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall enure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, directors, officers or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherances of the purposes set forth in Article II.

VIII

DISSOLUTION

Upon the dissolution or winding up of the affairs of the Corporation, its assets remaining after payment, or provision for payment of all debts and liabilities of the Corporation, shall be distributed to a not-for-profit fund, foundation, trust, corporation or

other organization to be devoted to similar purposes.

IX

AMENDMENTS TO THE ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

Amendments to the Articles of Incorporation may be proposed by any member of the Corporation. The Articles may be amended at any annual meeting of the Corporation, or at any special meeting duly called and held for such purpose, on the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of each class of members existing at the time of and present at such meeting.

X

AMENDMENTS TO BYLAWS

The Bylaws of the Corporation may be made, altered, or rescinded at any annual meeting of the Corporation, or at any special meeting duly called for such purpose, on the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of each class of members existing at the time of and present at such meeting, except the initial Bylaws of the Association shall be made and adopted by the Board of Directors.

XI

INDEMNIFICATION

Every director and officer of the Corporation and every member of the Corporation serving the Corporation at its request shall be indemnified by the Corporation for all expenses and liabilities, including attorneys' fees and appellate attorneys' fees, reasonably

incurred by or imposed upon him or her in connection with any proceeding or any settlement of any proceeding to which he or she may be a party, or in which he or she may become involved by reason of his or her being or having been a director or officer of the Corporation, or by reason of his or her serving or having served the Corporation at its request, whether or not he or she is a director or officer or is serving at the time the expenses or liabilities were incurred; provided, that in the event of a settlement before entry of judgment, and also when the person concerned is adjudged guilty of gross negligence or willful misconduct, indemnification shall apply only when the Board of Directors approves the settlement and/or reimbursement as being in the interest of the Corporation. The foregoing right of indemnification shall be in addition to and not in lieu of any and all other rights to which that person may be entitled.
