Articles of Amendment to Articles of Incorporation of THE AVATAR BRASS QUINTET, INC. (A non profit Corporation)



Pursuant to the provisions of section 617.1006, the undersigned Florida nonprofit corporation among the following articles of amendment to its articles of incorporation.

FIRST: Amendments adopted:

- 1. Article 3. Purpose, subsection A is amended to read, in its entirety, as follows.
 - A Specific Purpose of the Corporation and Internal Revenue Service Limitatios

This corporation is a not-for-profit corporation organized under Chapter 617, Florida Stautes. It is not organized for the private gain of any person.

Specific Purpose of the Corporation

This corporation is organized exclusively for educational and cultural purposes, including, for such purposes, but not limited to, the following.

- a. To provide south Florida with a professional quality brass quintet.
- b. To promote brass quintet performance and enhance the music departments in public and private schools, universities, and conservatories in the south Florida area.
- To present educational clinics and master classes in public and private schools in the area.
- d. To do musical/cultural outreach and enhance the cultural atmosphere at all schools in the south Florida area.
- e. To do musical/cultural outreach and enhance the cultural atmosphere throughout south Florida and the United States.
- f. To bring professional guest soloists and clinicians to south Florida to perform with The Avatar Brass Quintet and to do cultural and educational outreach to the schools in the area.
- g. To present concerts in any venue.
- h. To make educational and promotional recordings
- j. To work with and through community arts organizations to promote music and arts.
- k. To perform and promote the literature of the brass quintet. Page 1 of 3

2. Internal Revenue Service Limitations

- a. Net Earnings, Influence of Legislation, and Restricted Activities
 - (1) No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall insure to the benefit of, or be distributed to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article 3, sub-section A (1) thereof.
 - (2) No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.
 - (3) Notwithstanding any other provisions of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other acitivities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from federal tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or, by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Distribution of Assets

Upon dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such asset not disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the country in which the principal office of the corporation is the located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

- c. Undistributed Income Tax, Self-Dealing, Retention of Excess Business Holdings, Investments, and Taxable Expenditures
 - (1) The corporation will distribute its income for each tax year at such time and in such manner as not to become subject to the tax on undistributed income imposed by section 4942 of the Inernal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.
 - (2) The corporation will not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in section 4941(d) of Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.
 - (3) The coroporation will not retain any excess business holding as definded in section 4943(c) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.
 - (4) The corporation will not make any investments in such manner as to subject it to tax under

- 2. c.(4) section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.
 - (5) The corporation will not make any taxable expenditures as defined in section 4945(d) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.
- 11. Article 3. Purpose, subsection C is deleted, in its entirety.

SECOND:

The date of the adoption of the amendments was March 5, 1998.

THIRD:

Adoption of the Amendments

The amendments were adopted by the members/directors and the number of votes cast for the amendments was sufficient for approval.
