# Articles of Incorporation of Foundation for Native State, Inc.

EFFECTIVE DATE
12-21-98

Under Section 617.0202 of the Florida Not-for-Profit Corporation Act

# ARTICLE I

The name of this corporation is Foundation for Native State, Inc.

# ARTICLE II

The principal place of business and mailing address of the corporation is as follows:

2020 Dawn Drive Clearwater, FL 33763

#### ARTICLE III

The purpose for which the corporation is formed is to bring Native Americans back to a self-determined state, through, *inter alia*, the introduction and implementation of workable technologies in the following areas:

- (A) Education and literacy;
- (B) Drug and alcohol reform; and
- (C) Economic development.

#### ARTICLE IV

The directors shall be appointed by the chairman, who shall be elected as provided in the corporation's bylaws.

# ARTICLE V

The name of the corporation's initial registered agent and the street address of the corporation's initial registered office is as follows:

#### ARTICLE VI

### ARTICLE VIII

- (A) Notwithstanding any other provision of theses Articles, the corporation is organized exclusively for one or more of the purposes as specified in §501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended from time to time, and shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under IRC §501(c)(3) or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.
- (B) No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of any member, trustee, director, officer of the corporation, or any private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the corporation). And no member, trustee, officer or the corporation or any private individual shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets on dissolution of the corporation.
- (C) No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation or participating in, or intervening in (including the publication or distribution of statements), any political campaign on behalf of any candidates for public office.

- (D) In the event of dissolution, all of the remaining assets and property of the corporation shall, after necessary expenses thereof, be distributed to another organization exempt under IRC §501(c)(3) or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws, or to the federal government, or state or local government for a public purpose, subject to the approval of an appropriate court in the State of Florida.
- (E) In any taxable year in which the corporation is a private foundation as described in IRC §509(a), the corporation shall distribute its income for said period at such time and manner as not to subject it to tax under IRC §4942, and the corporation shall not (a) engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in IRC §4941(d), (b) retain any excess business holdings as defined in IRC §4943(c), (c) make any investments in such manner as to subject the corporation to tax under IRC §4944, or (d) make any taxable expenditures as defined in IRC §4945(d) or corresponding provisions of any subsequent Federal tax laws.

#### ARTICLE IX

These Articles of Incorporation shall be effective as of the 21st day of December, 1998.
